ELEVEN WOULD BE HEAVEN—Orange Bowl bound Florida State (10-0) bids for its first unbeaten season since 1950 when it visits Florida (0-8-1) in a nationally televised (ABC-TV) game Friday.

SITE--Florida Field (62,280), Gainesville, Fla.

KICKOFF TIME--12:07 P.M.

ATTENDANCE—The game was sold out months ago, but because of a refund policy adopted by the University of Florida after the game day was changed, a limited number of tickets may be on sale during the week.

THE SEASON--Florida State, which began the season with a four-game winning streak, has now extended that to 14 games with 10 victories this season. That represents the second longest win streak in the nation--top-ranked Alabama is first with 19. Florida has had its share of troubles this fall and not scored a victory in its first nine starts.

LAST WEEK--Florida State, after receiving a bid to the Orange Bowl, the first New Year's Day invitation in the school's history, mashed Memphis State, 66-17. It was the second highest point total in history for the Tribe, who had previously scored 74 vs. Whiting Field in the opening game of 1949. There were numerous "stars" in this game for FSU with nine different players scoring touchdowns. After being deadlocked 3-3 at the 15 minute mark, FSU rolled to a 21 point second quarter and put the game away with 28 more markers in the third frame. Quarterback Jimmy Jordan directed the first half attack, completing 18 of 29 passes for 189 yards. Wally Woodham guided the Tribe in the third quarter and completed three of six while Rick Stockstill finished up in the fourth quarter completing six of seven for 103 yards. Wide receiver Jackie Flowers took the pass catching honors with nine catches for 117 yards. In the rushing department, Mark Lyles gained 83 of the team's 178 ground yards. The defense also drew its share of praise after the game where it yielded Memphis State 124 ground yards and another 115 in the air.

Florida's winless streak extended to 11 games with a 31-3 loss to Kentucky in Gainesville. The Gators, who did not commit a turnover in the game, mustered just 28 yards in 27 rushing attempts. Florida did manage 133 passing yards with 13 completions in 24 attempts. Florida, which led 3-0 at the quarter, gave the Wildcats 17 points in the second quarter. Kentucky followed that with seven point showings in the third and fourth quarters.

THE COACHES—Florida State's Bobby Bowden, a strong candidate for coach-of-the-year honors, (Samford '52) has an impressive report card since arriving on the Tallahassee campus in January, 1976. His current Seminole report card shows a 33-11 ledger which has hiked his overall mark to a nifty 106-43, a winning percentage of .711. Previous Bowden head coaching stops were at Samford (31-6) and West Virginia (42-26). Bowden has produced one other 10-victory season since coming to FSU, but that 10th win did not come in the regular season like this year. Instead, the Seminoles needed to beat Texas Tech, 40-17. At the conclusion of that season he was picked as "Southern Independent Coach of the Year."

Charley Pell (Alabama '64) was selected to guide the Florida program last December after he had coached Clemson teams to records of 8-3-1 and 10-1. Previous to his Clemson stint he had been head coach at Jacksonville (Ala.) State where the Gamecocks fielded an undefeated (10-0) team in 1970. Pell begins Friday's battle with Florida showing an overall career record of 51-25-2. His success at Clemson earned him Atlanta Coast Conference coach-of-the-year honors each season.

BOWDEN VS. FLORIDA—Since coming to FSU, head coach Bobby Bowden has compiled a 2-1 record in meetings with Florida. Bowden saw his team drop a 33-26 in the opening season but bounced back to capture 37-9 and 38-21 victories in each of the last two seasons.

BB PERFECT ON TV--Since coming to FSU, Bobby Bowden has put his teams on the field five (5) times when the ABC-TV cameras have been there. All those telecasts were regional affairs and Bowden has an unblemished 5-0 record.

THE CAPTAINS--FSU has four this season--guard Mike Good, quarterback Wally Woodham, defensive end Scott Warren and cornerback Ivory Joe Hunter. Florida will announce game captains during the week.

THE SERIES—Despite wins by Florida State in each of the last two seasons, the Gators still have a 16-4-1 series advantage. The win (37-9) by FSU in 1977 snapped a nine-game losing streak for the Seminoles vs. Florida. When it won 38-21 last season it was the first time since the schools have been playing (first game in '58) that FSU captured back-to-back victories.

LAST TIME—FSU, playing before a record crowd (48,432) at Doak Campbell last season, sprang to a 21-0 lead in the opening quarter only to see Florida tie the knot at 21 prior to halftime. But FSU came back with a third quarter TD and 10-point fourth quarter to snare a 38-21 victory. The second-half shutout for FSU was its fifth straight. Florida State's defense took control in the second half and allowed Florida just seven first downs in the half and four of those came on the final series. The Gators netted just 127 yards total offense in the second 30 minutes and 45 of those came during the final series. QB Wally Woodham went much of the way for the Seminoles, completing 16 of 24 passes for 179 yards. The ground attack was built around Mark Lyles, who gained 100 of the team's 222 rushing yards.

UNBEATEN FSU VS. FLORIDA—Six times since the series was initiated the Seminoles have entered with an unblemished record only to lose. In the first three times (1960, 61 and 68), the Tribe was only 1-0 at the time. But in 1969 the Tribe had a 2-0 record while they were 5-0 in 1971 and 4-0 in 1972.

TRIBE, GATORS IN GAINESVILLE-Gainesville and Florida Field has not been a real friendly place for the Seminoles to play. FSU, in the 13 previous Gainesville meetings, has just a 2-10-1 register. The wins came in 1967 (21-16) and 1977 (37-9). The tie was a 3-3 deadlock in 1961.

STREAKS—With the victory over Memphis State, Florida State now has a new record for consecutive games won (14). The previous record of 13 was set during the seasons of 1949, 50 and 51 under coach Don Veller, who is now the golf coach at FSU. The current streak also is the second longest in the nation with Alabama's 19 consecutive wins the current best.

MANY, MANY POINTS—The 66 points scored by the Seminoles vs. Memphis State was the second highest point total ever for the Tribe. The top point production game for FSU came in the opening game of the 1949 season when Whiting Field fell by a 74-0 count. This was the first time since 1954 the Seminoles have scored more than 52 points in a game. The victim that season was Villanova which fell by a 52-13 verdict.

CAPPELEN STREAK ENDS--Placekicker Davey Cappelen had a personal streak stopped Saturday vs. Memphis State. He missed on his second PAT conversion try which was his first miss after 38 consecutive makes. Still, Cappelen scored 10 points in the game and upped his season production to 66, the same number he had in the 1977 season, which is the fifth best all-time single season mark.

LYLES STREAK ENDS, TOO--Fullback Mark Lyles, like Cappelen, had a personal streak snapped when the Seminoles toppled Memphis State. In the previous games against Cincinnati and South Carolina, he had rushed for better than 100 yards in each game. He gained 83 on 20 carries vs. Memphis State and did not play in the fourth quarter.

JJ OVER 1,000--For the third consecutive year quarterback Jimmy Jordan has passed for better than 1,000 yards. His 189 total yards vs. Memphis State hiked his season total to 1,102 yards. In 1977, the Tallahassee Leon native threw for 1,139 and last season he tossed for 1,427.

WW NEEDS 142-Wally Woodham, who has shared the QB duties the last three seasons with Jimmy Jordan, is still 142 yards shy of throwing for 1,000 this season. With three completions vs. Memphis State he picked up 55 yards on his season total that raised him to 858 for the year.

MARK IN THIRD--Lyles' 83-yard performance vs. Memphis State did move him into third place for single season rushing yards with 860, taking over the spot of Homes Johnson, who rushed for 817 last season. If he's to become the second best single season rusher, Mark needs to gain 85 yards vs. Florida.

JJ AND WW--These are the latest up-to-date facts and figures on the Seminole quarterback tandem of Jimmy Jordan and Wally Woodham for their career.

JJ AND 300 COMPLETIONS—QB Jimmy Jordan needs just nine completions to become just the third player in Seminole history to pass for more than 300 career completions. The only other players able to accomplish that feat were Gary Huff (1970-72), who completed 436 and Bill Cappleman (1967-69), who completed 328.

AVERAGING ABOVE CAPACITY--FSU finished its home campaign against Memphis State with an announced attendance of 48,021. That brought the season's total attendance to 239,338 in five games, averaging out to 47,868 per contest, or slightly better than 400 over capacity...(47,413). Now, consider this fact—in the 1976 season (Bobby Bowden's first) the Tribe averaged 29,135 for five home games. This year the Seminoles established a new single game record with the 49,490 who watched the Homecoming Game vs. South Carolina.

ABOUT UNBEATEN—If Florida State can beat Florida, it would be the first all-winning season for the Tribe since 1950. In fact, it would be just the second unbeaten season for the Garnet and Gold since it began playing football in 1947. The Tribe has failed by one game of going unbeaten in two different seasons—1948 (7-1) and 1949 (9-1). The 1964 team finished the regular season with an 8-1-1 record and then beat Oklahoma, 36-19, in the Gator Bowl.

WHAT BOBBY SAYS...

ABOUT WIN OVER MEMPHIS STATE—"There for a while I was worried...you know when it was 3-3 at the quarter. After that our defense just took over and got us going. That was really something. I would never have suspected that we could score 66 points. That was something. Everything just fell into place for us."

ABOUT FLORIDA—"For the Gators, this season has probably boiled down to one game. If they can beat us, they will be able to forget when happened in the rest of the season. This game is for the bragging rights in the state. It's a game we MUST win.

"Yes, I'm surprised by Florida's record (0-8-1). That team has Cris Collinsworth, one of the finest receivers in the country. If, and when, they get the ball to Cris he makes things happen.

ABOUT FLORIDA STATE—"Our players have come too far this season not to be ready for Florida. An all-winning regular season is within their grasp. I don't expect to have any trouble getting their attention this week. After all, this is Florida week.

"You know a lot of our players know Florida players. A rivalry like this brings out the pride in players. You can expect our players and the Florida players to play one of their best games of the season.

"Thank goodness last week is over with. We haven't had that many distractions in a long time. First it was the announcement that the Florida game was going to be on television and then all the bowl talk. I'm amazed our players were able to keep their minds on the football game. It was very, very difficult for me. The team did a good job of worrying about just Memphis State. We have a great group of seniors here this season and they've done a good job of reminding everybody about worrying just about the game at hand."

ABOUT NATIONAL TELEVISION--"Gosh, I think it's just great. You know me I would like to play on television every week. We seem to have pretty good luck on the tube. The fact that ABC-TV picked this game is a real credit to the Florida State - Florida series. It's one of the great rivalries in college football today. Once the fans see this game they will be able to judge for themselves that football in Florida is just as good as any other state in the country. This game matches Penn State vs. Pitt, Oklahoma vs. Texas, UCLA vs. USC and Army vs. Navy. The only difference is that our game has never received the national buildup. Now, it's going to receive the recognition I believe it deserved a long time ago.

Playing on national television will have to be a huge emotional lift for our players. Just think, when this season is over we will have appeared on national TV twice (Florida and the upcoming Orange Bowl) and covered most (84 percent) of the country for our game with LSU. That's really something for a team that had not appeared on national TV since the 1970 season."

ABOUT MOVING GAME A DAY EARLIER--"That doesn't bother me. Florida and us both have the same problem so what is a disadvantage for them is going to be the same for us."

TEAM TRAVEL—FSU has scheduled a morning workout for Thursday in Tallahassee. After a Thanksgiving Day dinner, the travel squad and coaches will board buses for the trip to Gainesville, arriving Florida Field at 4:45 p.m. Following a tour of the facility the team will go to the Holiday Inn, Silver Springs, its overnight headquarters. The team will return to Tallahassee immediately after the game with a 7 p.m. arrival time expected in Tallahassee.

SID TRAVEL--Seminole sports information director Mark Carlson arrives in Gainesville Wednesday. He will headquarter at the Hilton Inn--904/377-4000.

MORE ABOUT TELEVISION...

ABC-TV TEAM--Announcers Jim Lampley (play-by-play) and Lee Grosscup (expert commentator) have been picked for the telecast. Both are quite familiar with FSU and Florida. Lampley will be calling the action on a Seminole game for the fourth time in three seasons. He did the LSU regional telecast earlier this season. Grosscup will be seeing FSU for the second time this year. He was part of the announce team for the Virginia Tech telecast in September. Dick Buffinton will serve as the telecast producer with Larry Kamm as the director.

MORE ABOUT TELECAST—The game will be shown throughout the country as part of a national collegiate doubleheader Friday. The second game is slated for 3 p.m. and pits Houston vs. Texas Tech.

FSU AND ABC-TV IN '79-This will be the third ABC-TV telecast for the Seminoles this season. The first two games were sent to regional audiences, although the game at LSU on October 27 was beamed to 84 percent of the country. Thus far the Seminoles have beaten Virginia Tech (17-10) and LSU (24-19) before the ABC-TV cameras this fall.

ADDED FSU AND ABC DATA--Overall this will be the sixth ABC-TV appearance for the Seminoles in the last three seasons. It all began at Florida in 1977 when the Tribe beat the Gators, 37-9, before a regional audience. Last year FSU won at Miami (31-21) and followed that with a 38-6 Homecoming victory over Navy before the cameras in Tallahassee. The wins over Virginia Tech and LSU have followed this season.

MORE ABOUT FSU AND TV--Overall, Florida State will be making its 15th appearance on the ABC network since 1959. This, however, is only the third national telecast and one of the previous two came in the 1967 Gator Bowl where FSU and Penn State deadlocked, 17-17. The other national telecast for the Seminoles came at Tampa, Fla., on Thanksgiving night, 1970, when Houston won a 53-21 verdict. Overall, the Garnet and Gold is 8-5-1 in TV appearances.

SEMINOLE ABC-TV RESULTS—Since the NCAA college football package went to ABC this is how the Seminoles have fared in reaching the 8-5-1 record: 1959—at Blacksburg, Va., FSU 7-Virginia Tech 6; 1966—at Blacksburg, Va., Virginia Tech 23-FSU 21; 1967—Memphis, Tn., FSU 26-Memphis State 7; 1967—at Jacksonville, Fla. FLORIDA AND TV-The Gators will be making their second appearance of the season with ABC-TV. They appeared in a regional telecast with Georgia on Nov. 10 and were beaten, 33-10. Overall, the Gators have an 8-11-1 record in television appearances since 1963.


