

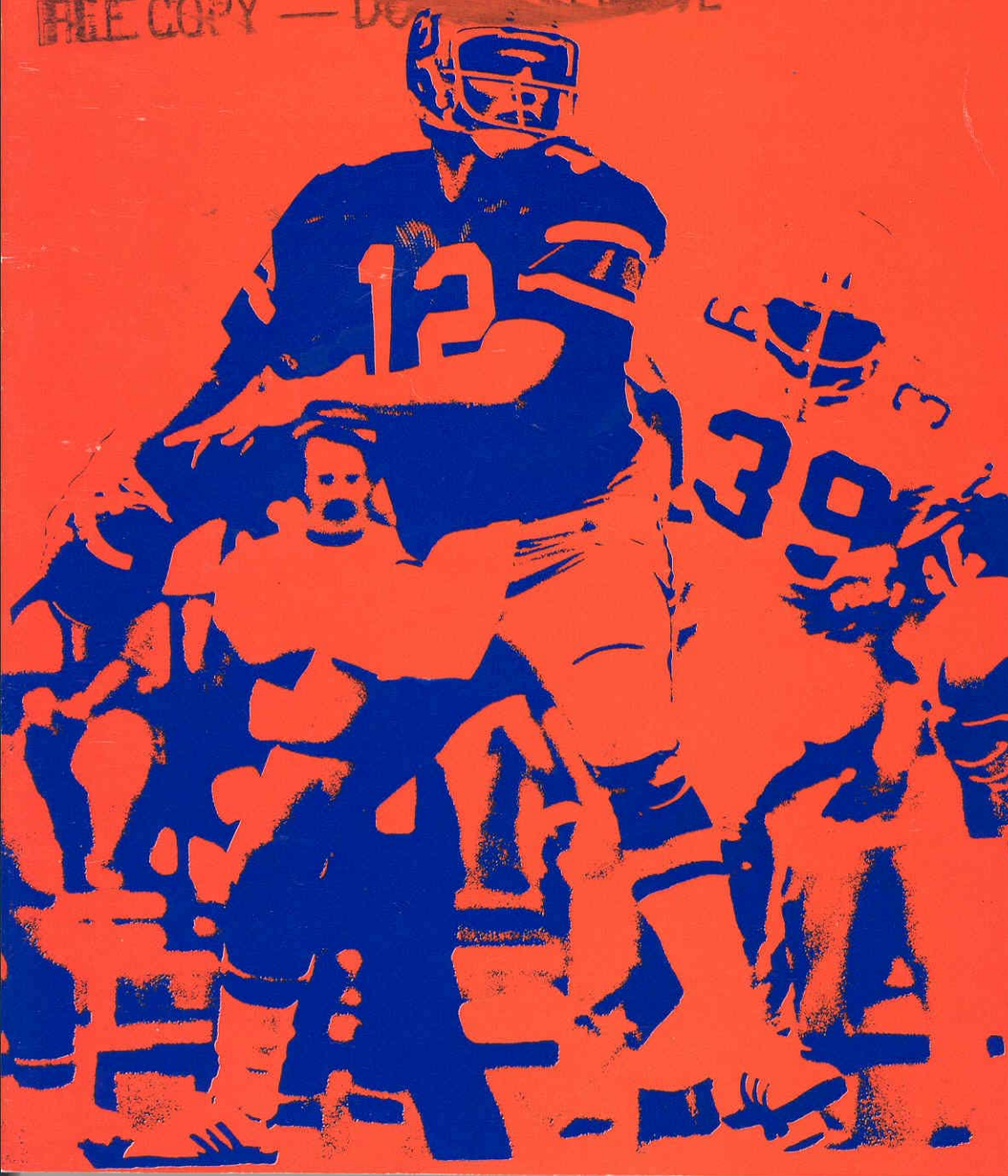

'BUZZIN FOR A DOZEN--Florida State, unbeaten (11-0) and nationally ranked (fourth by Associated Press and United Press International), makes its debut in a New Year's Day bowl game when it faces Oklahoma (10-1), champion of the Big Eight Conference and ranked fifth in both polls, at the Orange Bowl.

WHEN--January 1, 1980

WHERE--Orange Bowl Stadium (75,414), Miami, Fla.

KICKOFF TIME--8 P.M. EST or when Rose Bowl is completed.

ATTENDANCE--The game was a sellout more than a month before it was to be played. FSU received 12,500 tickets from the Orange Bowl Committee and another 2,800 from the Oklahoma ticket allotment. All those tickets were sold and the Seminole ticket office still returned more than 5,000 orders.

TV & RADIO--A national broadcast via both mediums. NBC-TV has the Orange Bowl contract and will have Don Criqui (play-by-play), John Brodie (expert analyst) and Bob Trumpy (sideline) as its announce team. Mutual Radio will send the game to more than 300 stations across the nation with Tony Roberts (play-by-play), Pat Sheridan (color commentary) and Gene Deckerhoff (sideline) as the announcers.

THE SEASON--FSU just completed its first unbeaten/untied season as a major college football school. It's the first time in state history a major (Division I) school has ever finished its season in that manner. Oklahoma, after losing 16-7 to Texas in the fifth game of the season went on to win the Big Eight championship. The title came on the final day when the Sooners bested previously unbeaten and second ranked Nebraska, 17-14.

THE COACHES--Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) has completed his fourth regular season with the Seminoles. In that time, FSU has compiled a nifty record of 34-11, a winning percentage of .755. Included in that ledger is a 40-17 victory over Texas Tech in the 1977 Tangerine Bowl. He came to FSU after a six-year stint at West Virginia where his teams compiled a 42-26 record and appeared in two Peach Bowls. West Virginia was his second stop at the four-year college coaching level. His first stop was at Samford where in four seasons his teams compiled a log of 31-6 before Bowden left to become an FSU assistant. Thus his cumulative coaching record is a nifty 107-43 for a winning percentage of .713 which ranks among the top 10 in the country. Bowden's FSU record has drawn plenty of accolades since prior to his arrival in the three previous seasons the Seminoles had combined for a 4-29 log.

Oklahoma's Barry Switzer (Arkansas '59) has a 72-7-2 record in seven seasons as head coach of the Sooners. His teams have never finished out of the top ten in the polls. He has directed two national championship squads, has won three of four bowl games, and has won or shared the Big Eight title every year since he took over as head man February 1, 1973. Under Switzer's direction, the Sooners won 28 straight games and went 37 games without a loss from 1973 to 1975. When they won their second consecutive national title following the 1975 season, it marked the first time in history a team had won back-to-back championships more than once.

BOWDEN VS. SWITZER--Only one other meeting between the two. That came on September 25, 1976, when in Bowden's first year at the Seminole helm he took FSU to Norman where the Sooners won a 24-9 verdict. At the time, it gave the Tribe an 0-3 record.

BB BOWL GAMES--This will be the fourth time a team head coached by Bobby Bowden has participated in a bowl game. In 1977, he took FSU to the Tangerine Bowl where it beat Texas Tech, 40-17. At West Virginia, his 1972 team was beaten at the Peach Bowl by North Carolina State, 49-13. His '75 Mountaineer squad also advanced to the Peach Bowl where it took North Carolina State, 13-10. Bowden went to the 1969 Peach Bowl as an assistant coach for Jim Carlen where West Virginia toppled South Carolina, 14-3.

BB PERFECT ON TV--Since coming to Florida State, head coach Bobby Bowden has sent his team on the field seven times when television cameras were there for either a regional or national TV appearance. Two of those games--'77 Tangerine Bowl and '79 regular season game vs. Florida--were beamed to a national audience. Regional appearances came in '77 at Florida, '78 at Miami and home vs. Navy and '79 at Virginia Tech and LSU. With the exception of the Tangerine Bowl game which was produced by Mizlou, all the appearances have been on ABC-TV.

THE CAPTAINS--Florida State will have four. Offensively guard Mike Good (No. 69) and quarterback Wally Woodham (12) will make the decisions. Defensively those chores fall to end Scott Warren (80) and cornerback Ivory Joe Hunter (46), the only player in Seminole history to have the honor for two seasons.

Oklahoma captains include halfback Billy Sims (No. 20), free safety Darrol Ray (3), strong linebacker George Cumby (28), strong safety Sherwood Taylor (31) and center Paul Tabor (73). This is the first time in the history of Oklahoma the Sooners have had five captains for the season.

THE SERIES--This will be the third meeting between the schools in football. Each team has a win apiece with FSU capturing a 36-19 win in the 1964 Gator Bowl at Jacksonville, Fla., and the Sooners winning a 24-9 verdict during the 1976 regular season at Norman.

THE LAST TIME--The Seminoles and Sooners met in Norman, Okla., on September 25, 1976, with the hosts picking up a 24-9 victory. The Seminoles, who were 0-2 entering the game and had been beaten by Miami, 47-0, a week earlier led 6-3 at the quarter. The Sooners had opened the scoring with a field goal but FSU came back on a five-yard TD run by Larry Key. The Tribe lost another scoring opportunity in the second quarter when Key fumbled into the Sooner end zone. The hosts were leading 10-6 at the time. After that second quarter FSU fumble, the Sooners dominated the rest of the game. Oklahoma had 513 total yards compared to 270 for the Seminoles, who were out-first downed, 25-14.

THEIR FIRST START--Six players on the FSU Orange Bowl roster made their first collegiate starts at Norman in 1976. That group includes offensive guard Mike Good, wide receiver Jackie Flowers, fullback Mark Lyles, wide receiver Kurt Unglaub, defensive end Scott Warren and defensive tackle Walter Carter. Placekicker Davey Cappelen was also in the lineup that afternoon and scored a 31-yard field goal. Unglaub, who sustained a broken foot early in fall practice this year and is taking a medical red shirt, will be the only player not in the lineup when FSU goes against the Sooners on January 1.

SEMINOLES IN BOWL GAMES--This will be the 10th bowl appearance for Florida State since it began playing football in 1947. The most recent appearance for the Tribe came in 1977 when it met Texas Tech in the Tangerine Bowl and captured a 40-17 victory. That win raised Florida State's record in bowl games to 3-5-1.

OKLAHOMA AND BOWL GAMES--Oklahoma has played in more Orange Bowl games (10) than any other school, and has won more Orange Bowl games (seven) than anyone else. Additionally, the Sooners have won four of five Sugar Bowl appearances. OU has also played in the Gator Bowl, Fiesta Bowl and Bluebonnet Bowl. Their overall record in bowl games is 13-6-1, best of any Big Eight team.

ABOUT FSU SEASON--Florida State finished the year 11-0-0. That is the best record in Florida history for any school playing Division I football. FSU during 1950 went undefeated, but the schedule was not considered of the major college variety.

SEMINOLES STREAKING--The 11 consecutive wins for the Tribe this year has raised the FSU win streak to 15 games over two seasons. That currently ranks as the second longest in the country. Alabama has put together the nation's longest streak at this time--20 games.

TRIBE'S LONGEST--The current Seminole win streak is the longest in school history. It erased the old record of 13 that was set over three seasons--1949, '50 and '51. That win streak came with Don Veller as the head coach. Veller is now in charge of the FSU golf program.

JUST A NOTE--When Florida State had its 13-game streak snapped, the loss was administered by Miami (Fla.), 35-13. Yes, the streak was broken in the Orange Bowl.

FSU IN ORANGE BOWL STADIUM--Although the Seminoles will be playing for the first time ever in the Orange Bowl Classic, the Tribe has frequently played in the Orange Bowl Stadium. Prior to a loss (47-0) to Miami in 1976, FSU had won eight straight games over the Hurricanes in Miami. And, during the 1978 regular season FSU took a 31-21 verdict in a regional television game vs. the Hurricanes. Overall, FSU has a 10-7 record for games played in the Orange Bowl.

MORE ABOUT TRIBE WINS--Consider this fact when writing about Florida State victories. In the last three years, FSU has won 32 of 37 games. That includes a 3-0 record at the close of the 1976 season, a 10-2 mark during the 1977 campaign, an 8-3 log in last year's non bowl campaign and this year's 11-0 journey.

ANOTHER TRIBE WINNING FACT--Taking the 32 of 37 just a step further, now consider this. If you could take away the three losses Bowden had at the start of the 1976 season, his first in Florida's capital city, the FSU record over those four seasons would be 34-8, a winning percentage of .809.

AMAZING TURN-AROUND--How amazing is that FSU record over the last four seasons? Well, consider this fact. In the three years prior to Bowden's arrival from West Virginia, FSU had combined for a 4-29 record that included final regular season ledgers of 0-11 (1973), 1-10 (1974) and 3-8 (1975).

MAKING THE COMPARISONS--What has been the difference between this year's 11-0 Seminole squad and the one that went 8-3 last season or the 1977 Tangerine Bowl group that finished 9-2 in the regular 11-game schedule? Maybe, the statistics will provide an answer. One thing is certain--this team has better defensive statistics.

NEW SCHOOL RECORDS--Seminoles '79 established several new school offensive records. The 319 points washed away the old mark of 312 set in the 1978 season. The 15 field goals wiped the old mark of 14 off the books set in 1970 and the 855 plays was 10 more than the 1978 team.

SECOND RATED, TOO--This FSU unit also finished second in a number of categories where the school record was at stake. The touchdowns scored (39), extra points run/pass attempted (eight), field goals attempted (24), rushing plays (515) and punts (66) were all second best.

NATIONAL RANKING--Florida State's 29.0 points per game was also worthy of national ranking this season. That average was 17th best in the nation, but was far behind the 40.6 averaged by Brigham Young.

DEFENSIVELY SPEAKING--Seminoles also made themselves know defensively in the national statistical categories kept by the NCAA. The 242.6 yards allowed per game was the 10th best in the nation (Yale was the leader at 175.4). The rushing defense of 118.5 yards was 13th best (Yale was again the leader at 75.0).

ABOUT INDIVIDUAL RECORDS--Despite the all-winning season, no FSU player set any new season records. The closest anyone came was fullback Mark Lyles, who rushed for 1,011 yards in 225 carries. Both those marks are the second best in any single season. The rushing record of 1,117 yards is held by Larry Key (1977), who also carried the ball 239 times in the same year.

RETURNING BOWL STARTERS--Of the 22 players who started in the '77 Tangerine Bowl, eight will probably be in the starting lineup for the Orange Bowl. Starters in the T-Bowl, who will start in Miami, are tackle Ken Lanier, tight end Grady King and fullback Mark Lyles on the offense. Jimmy Jordan also started in the T-Bowl at quarterback, but head coach Bobby Bowden has not announced if Jimmy Jordan or Wally Woodham will be his starter vs. Oklahoma. Defensively the T-Bowl starters who will get the call in Miami are Ron Simmons (noseguard), Scott Warren (end) and Ivory Joe Hunter (cornerback). Walter Carter also started in that T-Bowl game, but the Tribe coaching staff had not decided whether Carter or Jeremy Mindlin would be the Miami starter. Two of the specialists who participated in the Texas Tech game are also still around. That group includes PAT and field goal expert Davey Cappelen and kick-off specialist Bill Capece.

FSU VS. BIG EIGHT--Since it began playing football in 1947, FSU has enjoyed moderate success vs. teams from the Big Eight Conference. Overall, the Tribe has an 8-5-0 record that includes marks of 0-1 vs. Iowa State, 2-2 vs. Kansas, 3-0 vs. Kansas State, 1-1 vs. Oklahoma and 2-1 vs. Oklahoma State.

BOWDEN & BIG EIGHT SINCE '76--When Bobby Bowden arrived at FSU the Tribe, in its first outing vs. a Big Eight opponent, lost a 24-9 verdict to Oklahoma. Since that time, FSU has picked up four straight wins--two over Kansas State and two more against Oklahoma State. The Seminole did not have an opponent from the conference this season.

WHAT THE PLAYERS SAY...

WR JACKIE FLOWERS--"The Orange Bowl--it's like a beautiful dream come true."

DT JEREMY MINDLIN (a native of Miami)--"I can't wait to get to Miami. At first I wanted to go to the Sugar Bowl, because I've never been to New Orleans. But as soon as I saw the way the bowl picture was shaping up, I just couldn't wait to get the Orange Bowl bid."

NG RON SIMMONS--"I'm all charged up. We proved we're a major college football team, and hey, we deserve a major bowl. But I guess there's a slim chance of being the No. 1 team. Other schools have all that tradition, and they wouldn't give it to us even if we were undefeated. But if we win all of our games, I'll consider us the national champions."

QB JIMMY JORDAN--"There's nothing I can say about the Orange Bowl and how happy I am. It's such a BIG bowl. I don't think it has hit us yet. I mean, 11-0 and going to the Orange Bowl...gee, that's something. I just hope we play respectably against Oklahoma."

DE SCOTT WARREN--"I hadn't really thought about the sentimentality of playing Oklahoma again, but you know, I kinda like the ring to it. I play my first and my last college game against Oklahoma. That sounds pretty good. They're a great team. We have to play our best. It is a thrill to play against a Heisman Trophy winner like Billy Sims. It's a challenge to stop a runner like him. We were excited in 1976 and I'll guarantee you we'll be excited this time. We were a scared excited team then. We'll be a mature excited team this time."

WHAT THE COACHES SAY...

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR JACK STANTON--"I'm going crazy. We're going to be on national television in the Orange Bowl and we're going to be playing a great Oklahoma football team. That team is capable of blowing anybody off the field. We sure don't want to get blown out."

"I don't know if we can stop them. I'd be happy if we can just slow them down."

"There's no better running back than Billy Sims and if Oklahoma ran an "I-formation" offense, we would just key on him. But if we just key on Billy Sims they'll run us all over the field. The other backs run just as fast. They're scary. They really are."

"I don't even think Oklahoma's defense can stop Oklahoma's offense. The last time I worked so hard on a game plan was three years ago. That opponent was Oklahoma, too."

HEAD COACH BOBBY BOWDEN...

ABOUT WINNING--"It won't be easy, but when you play the big boys it never is."

ABOUT OKLAHOMA--"Oh, my goodness are they good. I haven't seen a team this good in a long, long time. We certainly haven't faced one this good since we've been at Florida State."

ABOUT BILLY SIMS--"I know this sounds awful simple to say, but he's so darn good I don't know what I can say that hasn't already been said by someone else around the country. He's the best and our defense will have to play the best it has all season for us to stay in the game."

ABOUT 11-0-0--"No matter what happens that record can never be taken away from this football team. The best that anyone can ever do is tie that mark. This has been a truly great season. A lot of teams begin in September with the idea of getting to the point we are today, but few, make that very few, ever make it."

ABOUT STARTING QB--"We probably will not decide that until we get to Miami. It might be as late as a couple of days before the game. Much depends on which is better able to execute our game plan in practice."

ABOUT DETERMINING FINAL OUTCOME OF ORANGE BOWL GAME--"What I'm thinking is it may come down to their fumbles vs. our interceptions."

BASKETBALL TOO--Florida State is going to be playing a basketball game in Miami during the Orange Bowl celebration. University officials announced recently that the cage game originally scheduled with Tulane for January 2 in Tallahassee will be played at Miami Dade South Junior College on December 31 at 2 p.m. The game will be the Tribe's first Metro Conference contest of the season. Tickets for the game that have the original Tallahassee date will be honored at the gate and tickets will also be sold at the door. Ticket prices have been established at \$5 (adults) and \$2.50 (children). The Seminole basketball team will arrive in Miami on December 30 and headquarter at the Miami Airport Inn. Head coach Joe Williams and his players will be available at that site or arrangements for interviews can be made through sports information director Mark Carlson.
