RUN FOR ONE--Florida State (0-0) and LSU (0-0) inaugurate the 1980 college football season Saturday.

SITE--Tiger Stadium (76,092), Baton Rouge, La.

KICKOFF TIME--7:30 p.m. CDT (8:30 in Tallahassee and most of Florida).

EXPECTED ATTENDANCE--It has already been announced as a sellout and LSU officials have predicted a possible record crowd, exceeding the mark of 78,534 that watched Indiana on September 16, 1978.

THE SEASON--This is the opener for both schools. It is one of four road games this season for the Seminoles. LSU will be playing six in Tiger Stadium, including the first three.

LAST YEAR--Florida State enjoyed its finest year ever, finishing 11-0 in the regular season and placing fourth in both the Associated Press and United Press International polls. The Tribe was invited to participate in its first New Year's Day post-season game, appearing at the Orange Bowl where it dropped a 24-7 verdict to Big Eight champ Oklahoma. Still FSU finished sixth in the Associated Press poll and eighth in the final UPI ballot.

LSU had a 6-5 regular season record last season that included a 24-19 loss to Florida State. That defeat spoiled the Fighting Tigers' Homecoming. Still LSU was invited to the Tangerine Bowl where it posted a 34-10 victory over Wake Forest.

THE COACHES--FSU mentor Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) begins his fifth season at the Seminole helm. In that time he has guided the Tribe to a neat 34-12 record. Even more impressive is the fact that in the last three seasons, FSU has gone 29-6 after starting out 5-6 under Bowden in 1976. Twice in the last three years Bowden has taken the Seminoles to bowl games. Last year it was the Orange Bowl where FSU lost a 24-7 verdict to Oklahoma, but in 1977 the Tribe won the Tangerine Bowl championship, 40-17 over Texas Tech. Last season Bowden was rewarded for his team's record when ABC-TV and Chevrolet named him its Division I-A Coach of the Year. Twice in the last three seasons he has been picked as the Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year. This is the third head coaching stop for Bowden. He was previously at Samford (31-6) and West Virginia (42-26). Overall his head coaching record is 107-44. The victory total ranks 10th among active head coaches this season in Division I-A. And, the percentage (.709) is 11th among Division I-A and I-AA coaches.

Jerry Stovall (Missouri Baptist '73) begins a new era of football at LSU when the Tigers meet the Seminoles. Stovall took the head coaching position on January 12, 1980, following the airplane crash that took the life of Bo Rein, who left North Carolina State at the end of the 1979 season, but never was able to coach the Bengal Tigers. Stovall, who will be in his first head coaching position was an All-American halfback for the Tigers in the early 1960s, and had served as Varsity Club Coordinator in 1979 after returning to Tigertown in 1974 as offensive backfield coach under former Coach Charles McClendon.

FRIENDS MEET--When Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden looks across the sideline at Tiger Stadium he will see a familiar face. It will belong to Tiger defensive coordinator Greg Williams, who was the defensive coordinator for Bowden at West Virginia in 1975.

THE SERIES--Dead even at 1-1 after the Seminoles won a 24-19 verdict last season. The teams first met in 1968 at the Peach Bowl (Atlanta, Ga.) where the Tigers won 31-27. The current contract calls for FSU to visit Baton Rouge for three more years.

THE LAST TIME--Florida State ruined the LSU Homecoming with a 24-19 victory in a game that head coach Bobby Bowden had early in the week billed as "the biggest football game in FSU history." The game drew plenty of national attention with ABC-TV sending the contest to 84 percent of the country. Also watching the game in person were representatives of nine different post-season bowls. FSU jumped ahead 7-0 only to see LSU take a 13-7 lead in the second quarter. But the Seminoles bounced back before the half ended on a 53-yard scoring pass from Jimmy Jordan to freshman Hardis Johnson. It was the first TD catch of Johnson's career. Overall Jordan completed 14 of 31 passes for 312 yards and three scores. His favorite target was Jackie Flowers, who caught six for 174 yards. The start went to Jordan for the first time in 10 games and his performance won him the ABC-TV/Chevrolet Most Valuable Player Award for FSU.

WIN STREAKS--Florida State doesn't have one since it was beaten 24-7 by Oklahoma in last year's Orange Bowl. Until that game the Tribe had put together 15 consecutive wins dating back to the 1978 season. LSU does have a win streak--one game with a 34-10 win over Wake Forest.

REACHING FOR STREAK--If you really want to reach to find a streak for FSU it's possible. The Seminoles have won their last 15 straight regular season games dating back to the eighth game of the 1978 season.

SEMINOLES IN 35--Over the last three years, the FSU football program has been one of the country's most successful. In that time, the Tribe has compiled a record of 29-6.

BOWDEN VS. SEC--Since coming to Florida State, head coach Bobby Bowden shows a 6-3 record vs. competition from the Southeastern Conference. He's 3-1 vs. Florida, 1-1 vs. Auburn, 1-1 vs. Mississippi State and 1-0 vs. LSU. The Seminoles were 3-0 vs. foes from the Southeastern Conference last season.

TRIBE IN OPENERS--Florida State has a 21-12 record in opening games since the Seminoles began playing football in 1947. FSU is currently on a three-game win streak in opening games, the last loss coming at Memphis State, 21-12, in 1976. Since then the Seminoles have beaten Southern Mississippi, 35-6 (1977), Syracuse, 28-0 (1978) and Southern Mississippi, 17-14 (1979).

FSU ON ROAD--With its perfect season last year the Seminoles enjoyed a perfect (5-0) road record. That included wins at Virginia Tech (17-10), Louisville (27-0), LSU (24-19), Cincinnati (26-21) and Florida (27-16).

BB, FSU AWAY FROM DOAK CAMPBELL--The journey to LSU will be the 24th regular season road game for Florida State since Bobby Bowden took over the program in 1976. In that time, the Tribe has a 15-7 record. But in the last three years FSU has compiled a road mark of 13-3.

FIRST TIME STARTER--When Florida State takes its first offensive snap against LSU it will mark the first time in three years that either Jimmy Jordan or Wally Woodham has not been the starting quarterback. Those two have now graduated after leading FSU to a 29-6 mark in three seasons and the job now falls to junior Rick Stockstill of Fernandina Beach, Fla.

MORE ABOUT STOCKSTILL--His playing time has been limited. As a freshman (1977) he called just one play--in the Tangerine Bowl vs. Texas Tech. The next year he was red-shirted and last season he saw limited action. His most impressive performance of '79 came in a 66-17 rout of Memphis State where Rick called signals in the fourth quarter and completed seven of eight passes for 101 yards.

STILL MORE ABOUT RICK--No, he was not highly sought coming out of high school. In fact, the Seminoles were the only school to offer him a scholarship. Defensive coordinator Jack Stanton was the one who recruited Rick and Stanton will admit he figured Rick would be in the Seminole secondary. His father is the head football coach at Fernandina Beach (Fla.) High School and his brother, Jeff, is a wide receiver at Clemson.

WHERE ARE WALLY AND JIMMY--QB Jimmy Jordan was still with the New England Patriots last week and it appeared he had an excellent chance of making the team's 45-man regular season roster. Wally Woodham is still on the practice field with the Seminoles, but now it's as a part-time coach, tutoring the quarterbacks.

OTHER FIRST YEAR STARTERS--Although the lineup could change during the week, Stockstill will probably not be the only Seminole who will be starting at FSU for the first time. Offensively, wide receiver Dennis McKinnon could get the call and defensively the nod will probably go to end Scott McLean and cornerback James Harris for the first time in their careers.

ALMOST FIRST TIME--Senior placekicker Bill Capece will get his first opportunity as the full-time specialist for field goals and PATs at LSU. Capece has handled the kickoff chores for the last three years while Davey Cappelen handled the other place-kicking duties. Capece has four points in his varsity career, all of them coming last year in the final regular season game at Florida where he hit a PAT and 18-yard field goal.

WHAT BOBBY SAYS...

ABOUT LSU--"I don't think any team I've coached has ever faced a tougher opener. First of all we're playing a team with a new head coach, one who has never been a head coach before. We don't have the foggiest idea what his coaching philosophy is. Next we are playing a team that didn't even have a spring game. So we don't have much of an idea about their personnel or what sort of game plan they may employ. We're going into this one blind."

STILL ABOUT LSU--"This one is going to be a dog fight. Remember we went in there last year with the best team Florida State has ever had and just escaped by our bare teeth. LSU has everything going in its favor this time. They are playing at home at night with a new coaching staff. The momentum will all be in their favor."

ABOUT FINAL OUTCOME--"This one could quite possibly be a defensive struggle. By looking at both rosters one could anticipate that each of us is going to be strong defensively and our question mark comes on offense, especially at quarterback. Both teams will have inexperienced folks on offense, but we both also have some pretty good speed with players who could break the game open quickly."

ABOUT QB RICK STOCKSTILL--"He's our man. Rick's come a long way. He's doing fine. He does not have the arm of Jordan nor does he have the savvy and instinct of Woodham. At least not yet. He has some of both and he can run better than both. He's mobile. He gives us a new dimension. We have confidence in him."

SEMINOLE TRAVEL PLANS--Tribe team and official party will depart Tallahassee via Piedmont charter Friday, September 5, at 4:00 p.m. EDT, arriving Baton Rouge at 4:15 p.m. CDT. The team will probably visit Tiger Stadium but not workout. Team headquarters--Bellemont Motor Hotel, 7370 Airline Highway, Baton Rouge. Phone: 504/357-8612. Return Saturday, September 6, via Texas International charter with tentative arrival in Tallahassee slated for 1:15 a.m. EDT

SID TRAVEL PLANS--FSU sports information director Mark Carlson will advance the game. He arrives in New Orleans at mid-afternoon Wednesday and will headquarter at the Marriott Hotel that evening. He will arrive in Baton Rouge Thursday morning and can be reached at either the Bellemont Motor Hotel (504/357-8612) or the office of LSU sports information director Paul Manasseh (504/388-8226).

RADIO--Florida State, with its largest network in history--57 stations, will send the game to the entire state of Florida and most of the southeast. Gene Deckerhoff will call the play-by-play for the second consecutive year and former Tribe head coach Bill Peterson will provide analytical commentary.

TELEVISION--The game will be seen live in Tallahassee via WECA-TV (27). Tom Mees, former sports director at the station and now an announcer for ESPN, will call the play-by-play with Jim Crosby, sports director at the station will be the color announcer.

Also picking up the game for delay broadcast later in the weekend will be the ESPN network. Jim Thacker will be assigned play-by-play duties with Jim Hill the second announcer in the booth.

PLAYERS TO WATCH...

FLORIDA STATE

NG RON SIMMONS (No. 50, 6-1, 245, Sr., Warner Robins, Ga.)--never before in the history of FSU football has an athlete drawn so much attention. Last year as a junior Simmons was a Consensus All-American. He received first team recognition on teams selected by Associated Press, United Press International, Walter Camp, Football News and the American Coaches Association (Kodak) squads. More startling than those facts are that Simmons, a junior lineman, finished a stunning ninth in the Heisman voting. He was also a semifinalist in voting for the prestigious Lombardi Award which can go to only a lineman.

DB MONK BONASORTE (No. 42, 6-0, 175, Sr., Pittsburgh, Pa.)--was a third team Associated Press All-American last year after completing the campaign with eight interceptions. Those thefts ranked fourth in the country for the season. One of the real success stories for Seminoles since he came to FSU as a walk-on tight end candidate. His brother Chuck played for the Pitt Panthers.

OT KEN LANIER (No. 72, 6-3, 270, Sr., Columbus, Ohio)--the only starter in the offensive line who will be in threat capacity for a fourth straight season. He is one of the most talented offensive linemen to ever play for the Tribe. He has been a starter since the second game of his frosh season. He is also a member of the FSU track and field team that has won the Metro Conference team championship the last four years. Ken is a participant in both the shot put and discus. He has won the league shot championship the last two years.

TB SAM PLATT (No. 29, 6-0, 190, Sr., Jacksonville, Fla.)--after three years as a wide receiver for the Seminoles he switches to the backfield as the starting tailback. He made the move during the spring and impressed the coaches enough to earn the starting assignment before fall practice even began. Thus far in career he has rushed 12 times (all reverses) for 52 yards. His pass catching total has amounted to 32 grabs for 628 yards and nine touchdowns. Best single game performance came against Navy in '78 where he caught three second half touchdown passes.
