FLORIDA STATE vs. LOUISVILLE September 5, 1981, 7:05 P.M. Doak Campbell Stadium, Tallahassee, Fla.

THE GAME: Florida State (0-0) and Louisville (0-0) open their 1981 seasons.

THE COACHES: Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) begins his sixth season as head coach for Florida State. The Seminole program has undergone a complete turn-around since Bowden's arrival. In the three years before Bowden's takeover, the Tribe had a 4-29 record. Bowden coached the Seminoles to a 5-6 mark in 1976 and since has gone 10-2, 8-3, 11-1 and 10-2 for an overall mark of 44-14. In that span, the Tribe has made post-season appearances at the Tangerine (1977) and Orange Bowls (1980 and 1981). Previously Bowden coached at Samford (31-6) and West Virginia (42-26) which gives him an overall career coaching record of 117-46.

Bob Weber (Colorado '58) tonight starts his second season as Louisville's head coach. His first season, the Cards finished with a 5-6 mark after opening the campaign with three consecutive losses. This is Weber's second head coaching stint at the major college level. He was previously the head coach at Arizona where the Wildcats compiled a 16-26 report card between 1969-72.

THE CAPTAINS: Florida State players have elected four who will serve the entire season. The group includes quarterback Rick Stockstill (11), Fullback Mike Whiting (27), noseguard James Gilbert (51) and cornerback James Harris (33). Each Seminole captain is a senior and hails from Florida.

Louisville captains will be tailback Donald Craft (29) and cornerback Leon Williams (22). Both are Florida natives.

- THE RANKINGS: Wire service pre-season rankings were released last weekend. FSU is among the Top 20 in both polls. The coaches poll (United Press) rates the Seminoles 13th while Associated Press (broadcasters and writers) pegs the Tribe 19th.
- THE SERIES: The Seminoles and Cardinals will be meeting for the seventh time since 1952. Louisville won that first game, 41-14, but the Tribe has won the next five, including last year's 52-0 whitewash. In each of the last two seasons the Seminoles have won via the shutout route, taking a 27-0 verdict at Louisville in 1979.
- LAST TIME: Florida State's defense scored its second consecutive shutout as the Tribe rolled the Cardinals, 52-0, in the Seminoles' home opener before 52,623. The defense allowed Louisville only 56 yards total offense in 49 plays. The Cards were held to minus five (-5) yards along the ground in 33 attempts and picked up 61 through the air with six pass completions in 16 attempts. FSU, by comparison, had 442 yards total offense--232 along the ground and 210 in the air. Seminole QB Rick Stockstill completed nine of 12 passes for 115 yards and four touchdowns, one shy of the school record.
- FSU & OPENERS: Florida State enjoys a comfortable 22-12 advantage in opening games since the Tribe began playing football in 1947. When the Seminoles lost the opening game in 1976, it was the third consecutive opening day loss. Since then, the Tribe has beaten Southern Mississippi, 35-6 in 1977; Syracuse, 28-0 in 1978; Southern Mississippi, 17-14 in 1979; and LSU, 16-0 in 1980.
- HOME WIN STREAK: A 16-game home winning streak goes on the line for the Seminoles tonight. The Tribe has not lost in Doak Campbell Stadium since September 30, 1978, when it was turned back 27-21 by Houston.
- BOWL SCOUTS: The Tangerine Bowl will have Don Disrey and Jim English in the press box tonight.
- NEXT WEEK: FSU will play its last home game for 49 days when it hosts Memphis State Saturday starting at 7:00 p.m. Louisville will begin its home campaign against Toledo with a 7:00 p.m., kickoff.
