IT'S TIME FOR IT--Florida State (2-0) begins its much publicized 1981 road schedule when it travels to Nebraska (0-1) Saturday.

SITE--Memorial Stadium (76,400), Lincoln, Neb.

KICKOFF--1:30 p.m. CDT (2:30 p.m. in Tallahassee and most of Florida)

ATTENDANCE--It's sold out.

TV--FSU fans living in Tallahassee will have the opportunity to watch the game live on WECA-TV, Channel 27. Bob Murphy will handle play-by-play chores with ex-Seminole quarterback Vic Prinzi doing color. Murphy is the chief voice of the New York Mets and is the FSU television announcer this fall for Southern Video, which is showing the games on a delay basis throughout Florida on Sunday mornings.

ESPN is also slated to carry the game next week. The primary announce team for the network of Jim Simpson (play-by-play) and Bud Wilkinson (analyst) will be the talent. The network will replay the game Sunday, September 20, at 8 p.m., Tuesday, September 22, at 12:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. and Wednesday, September 23, at 3:30 a.m.

RADIO--Florida State has its largest radio network ever, 68 stations. Gene Deckerhoff is in his third season as the play-by-play announcer with former FSU head coach Bill Peterson doing the analytical commentary. Peterson coached the Tribe between 1960-70 and had a 62-42-11. The victory total is the most ever for any FSU coach.

Nebraska has several radio networks including KFAB and WOW of Omaha and KLIN and KFOR of Lincoln.

LAST WEEK--Florida State received another good effort from its defense and squeezed past Memphis State, 10-5. FSU fell behind 2-0 in the opening quarter, but took the lead 55 seconds into the second quarter when Mike Whiting scored on a three-yard dive and Mike Rendina added the PAT. Rendina hiked the Seminole lead to 10-2 with a 46-yard field goal in the final quarter. Memphis State narrowed its deficit with a field goal later in the quarter, but came up short. The FSU defense didn't allow a TD for the second straight week. The win extended the Seminoles' home winning streak to 18 games dating back to Sept. 30, 1978.

Nebraska was the victim of one of the day's major upsets when it lost a 10-7 verdict at Iowa. The Cornhuskers, who trailed 10-0 after three quarters, scored a TD early in the fourth quarter but then missed a field goal try which would have tied the game. Iowa avenged at 57-0 loss to the Cornhuskers last year with the victory, one of three major upsets last weekend.

THE SERIES--This is only the second meeting between the inter-sectional rivals. FSU has a 1-0 advantage after collecting an 18-14 victory in Lincoln last fall. Two more games are scheduled in the series and both will be played in Lincoln according to present contracts. The Tribe returns to Memorial Stadium in 1985 and 1986.

LAST YEAR--FSU authored what most Seminole observers believe is the biggest victory in the school's history when it overcame a 14-3 deficit to down the Cornhuskers 18-14. Cornhusker turnovers helped push the Tribe over the top. Trailing 14-3 in the third quarter the Seminoles got a break when the Nebraska punter fell at his own 17 while fielding a snap. FSU was unable to pick up a first down, but Bill Capece booted his second field goal of the afternoon. Another Cornhusker turnover preceded the Seminoles' first touchdown. Keith Jones intercepted a pass and returned the ball eight yards to the Nebraska 47. Seven plays later Sam Platt scored from six yards away. A two-point conversion pass failed, but the Tribe was trailing by just 14-12 with 5:17 remaining. The Seminole defense also caused a turnover on the next Nebraska series. This time freshman defensive tackle Alphonso Carreker recovered a Jarvis Redwine fumble. Capece booted a 40-yard field goal to give the Seminoles the lead for the first time, 15-14. The final three points came with 2:34 remaining in the game. This time Capece booted a 41-yard field goal. Final statistics would make most observers think the Cornhuskers had won easily. The hosts ran 79 plays compared to 66 for the Tribe. In total yardage, Nebraska had a 368-166 advantage, but in the turnover category, Nebraska had four miscues compared to just one for the Tribe.

THE COACHES--Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) is in his sixth season as head coach at Florida State. The Seminole program has taken a dramatic upward turn since Bowden's arrival in '76. In five seasons plus two games, he has taken the Tribe to a 46-14 record that includes a 23-3 mark in the last 26 games. Bowden has been named National Coach of the Year by two different organizations. ABC-TV and Chevrolet gave him the honor following the 1979 season and he was the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year after last season. He has twice been named the Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year during those five years. This is the third head coaching stop for the 51-year-old Birmingham, Ala., native. He had a 31-6 mark at Samford (1959-62) and went 42-26 while at West Virginia (1970-75). His overall record is now 119-46 (72.1 winning percentage). Prior to the start of the current campaign, Bowden ranked sixth among active coaches with a minimum 10 years as a Division I-A head coach for winning percentage. The total victories was ninth among active coaches in Division I-A.

Tom Osborne (Hastings College '59) last Saturday began his ninth season as Nebraska head coach. He started the season with a 75-20-2 record, a winning percentage of 78.4, the fifth best winning percentage for coaches with a minimum of five years coaching at the I-A level. Osborne was no stranger to Nebraska football when he was named as Dob Devaney's successor in 1973. He was a member of Devaney's staff for 11 years.

BOBBY VS. TOM--Only one previous matchup--last year at Lincoln where the Tribe won 18-14.

BOBBY VS. BIG 8--If you could throw out games against Oklahoma, FSU mentor Bobby Bowden would be 5-0 against the Big Eight Conference since becoming head of the Seminole reservation. But the Bowden record is 5-3 since he has lost to Oklahoma in 1976 (24-9), 1980 Orange Bowl (24-7) and 1981 Orange Bowl (18-17). Bowden has twice coached his clubs to wins over Kansas State (1976--20-10 and 1977--18-10) and Oklahoma State (1977--25-17 and 1978--38-20) in addition to the win last year at Nebraska.

BOBBY'S ROAD RECORD--Since Bowden came to FSU, the Tribe has won 18 of 26 road games and four of the eight losses took place in the first season (1976) when the Tribe played away from Tallahassee six times. That record doesn't include bowl game appearances at the 1977 Tangerine Bowl or 1980 and 1981 Orange Bowls.

MORE ROAD STATISTICS--During the 1979 and '80 seasons, the Seminoles won eight of nine games played on the road. The only loss was administered last season by Miami, 10-9, the week prior to the Nebraska visit. Taking the road statistics further, FSU has won 11 of its last 14 road games and 16 of the last 20.

HUSKERS HOME OPENER—After opening its season on the road last Saturday, Nebraska will be playing its first home game of '81 before the rabid Memorial Stadium faithful in Lincoln. And, the Cornhuskers have an impressive record in home openers. Dating back to 1960, Nebraska has lost its home opener just three times—1960 to Minnesota, 26-14, 1969 to USC, 31-21, and 1977 to Washington State, 13-10.

HUSKERS VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES—Dating back to 1969, Nebraska has an absolutely amazing record in games vs. non-conference foes. Including last week's loss to Iowa, the Huskers carry a 41-7-2 record.

CAPTAINS—FSU has five for the season. In charge of the offense are quarterback Rick Stockstill (11) and fullback Mike Whiting (27). Defensive captains are nose-guard James Gilbert (51) and cornerback James Harris (33) while punter Rohn Stark (3) has the honor for the specialists. Nebraska captains are defensive end Jimmy Williams (96) and quarterback Mark Mauer (17).

STREAK ENDS—Florida State's string of not allowing a point in the fourth quarter ended last Saturday when Memphis State picked up a field goal with 8:09 remaining in the game. The Seminoles had not given up a fourth quarter point in 12 consecutive REGULAR SEASON games.

IT REFERS TO "IT"—In the next six weeks Florida State plays what most regard as the toughest road schedule in the history of major college football. Through the first two weeks most associated with the Seminole football program have just called that portion of the schedule "it" but now that "it" is here, a small refresher. Starting with Nebraska on Saturday, the Tribe will play in succession on the road Ohio State (Oct. 3), Notre Dame (Oct. 10), Pittsburgh (Oct. 17) and LSU (Oct. 24). Between Nebraska and Ohio State the Seminoles do enjoy an open date. Even though "It" begins in September, head coach Bobby Bowden calls the men the Florida State "Octoberfest."

NOT A GOOD STAT—While leading the Tribe to a 10-1 regular season record last year quarterback Rick Stockstill threw just eight interceptions in 209 attempts. He hasn't been as fortunate this season. In 40 passing attempts, four have been picked off by the enemy.

MORE ABOUT "IT"—During the road trip, FSU will be the Homecoming opponent for one school, LSU. The Tribe will not play a home game at Doak Campbell Stadium for 49 days and when the Seminoles do return it will be for three straight home games starting with Western Carolina, Oct. 31, which will be the Seminole Homecoming opponent.

FROSH GETTING WORK—FSU's coaching staff continues to filter freshmen into key slots in the lineup. Billy Allen, who will be 23-years-old later this month, started at tailback vs. Memphis State. He was the only first year player to draw a starting assignment. But, kicking chores belong to Mike Rendina, who leads the team in scoring with nine points. Freshman Greg Allen is the deep man on kickoff returns and punt returns are the assignment of Cedric Jones. Several other freshmen are working with the second unit and will be on the Nebraska travel squad.

DEFENSIVE EFFORT—Through the first two games, FSU's defense did not yield a touchdown. The only points scored against the Tribe came on a safety when Rick Stockstill was tackled in the endzone and a Memphis State field goal. Thus the effort of the first two games almost matches the first two of 1980 when FSU recorded shutouts over LSU (16-0) and Louisville (52-0).

ABOUT 10 AND WIN—One needs to go back to 1970 to find the last time FSU scored 10 or less points and won the game. The Tribe needed just nine to take a 9-7 verdict over Louisville at the start of the 1970 season.

TEAM TRAVEL—Florida State's team and official party will depart Tallahassee Friday via Air Florida charter at 1 p.m. The flight is scheduled to arrive in Lincoln at 2:35 p.m. CDT. Official headquarters will be the Holiday Inn, Cornhusker Highway, Lincoln (402/464-3171). FSU will return to Tallahassee immediately after the game with an estimated arrival time of 9:30 p.m.

SID ADVANCE—Seminole sports information director Mark Carlson leaves Tuesday and will spend that day and part of Wednesday in Omaha. He arrives in Lincoln mid-day Wednesday and will headquarter at the Holiday Inn (402/464-3171). He may also be reached through the office of Nebraska SID Don Bryant (402/472-2263).

WHAT THE PLAYERS SAY...

PUNTER ROHN STARK--"In the first two games, the kicking game has been very important. The offense still hasn't put it together, but I can see improvement. Against Louisville I had to punt eight times and against Memphis State it was just four.

"I expect the Nebraska game to be the same type of game as last year. The kicking game will be important and every yard will be hard earned. Field position will play a major role in the outcome.

"Nebraska is going to be fired up after the loss to Iowa, but we expected them to be that way anyway since they lost to us last year. This game is important because it sets the tempo for the remainder of the road schedule. If we can beat Nebraska it will give us confidence. If we get beat, we might think we're not good enough."

QUARTERBACK RICK STOCKSTILL--"I thought the offense showed improvement against Memphis State. We played well, but made some mistakes with the penalties, fumbles and interceptions that stopped the scoring drives. It was never really a case of Memphis State shutting us down, our mistakes thwarted the drives.

"I still think we have the ability to be a good offensive football team. These next five games we can't make the mistakes we made last night and expect to win.

"I hope the Nebraska game is the same type of game as last year. If they use the same type of defense, I expect we'll go with our sprint out offense. We won't be able to get two or three touchdowns behind and still expect to win.

"I want it to be a hard fought game--we seem to do better in games like that."

NOSEGUARD JAMES GILBERT--"At Nebraska we can't rely on just the defense. They're going to score some points--we can't expect to shut them out. The offense must produce for us.

"We're going to have to win all three aspects of the game--offense, defense and kicking to win up there. We can't rely on just one part of the team to win there.

"I look at Nebraska as the opening of the season. These first two games were important, but if we start to lose now it could become a very long year. We don't come back home for a long time."

OFFENSIVE TACKLE BARRY VOLTAPETTI--"The offensive line made great strides against Memphis State. The penalties killed us. We improved in one aspect of the game but went down in another. I couldn't believe we could get the ball to the one foot line and then not score.

"The offense has got to get it together and be ready to play. I don't think we can depend on the defense any more. At Nebraska we're going to either win or lose as a team.

"How do I feel about going to Lincoln? I'm scared. They lost to Iowa and we beat them last year. They will be sky high. Heck when was the last time they lost two games in a row?"

WHAT BOBBY SAYS...

ABOUT UPCOMING SCHEDULE--"It is here and I'm just dumb enough to be excited. But, remember 'ole Bobby doesn't have to play either. I've known this was coming for six years and now I say 'let's get on with it and find out what sort of program we've got."

"You know I've had several job offers over the last few years and could have just as easily ducked out of this, but that would have been the way of a coward. Our Octoberfest in Tallahassee is starting early this year."

"I believe there are two things very unfair about this schedule: (1) we need to play all those folks back-to-back; and, (2) that every one of the games has to be played on the road."

ABOUT DEFENSIVE COACHING STAFF--"I don't question them much. Their record speaks for itself. I pretty much stay out of Jack Stanton's way. He handles the defense and with Gene McDowell, Bill Shaw and Jim Gladden does a great job."

ABOUT UPSETS--"You know since I came to Florida State the one thing we've been able to do with success is win the games we're suppose to win. Three clubs--Alabama, Michigan and Nebraska can't say that after last Saturday. Now we're going to play games where we'll definitely be the underdog. We'll see how well we can do in those."

ABOUT NEBRASKA--"I suspect Coach (Tom) Osborne had some trouble getting his team in the right mental frame to play Iowa. It's a tough thing to do when you've beaten the team by 57-0 the previous year. I suspect those 'ole Cornhuskers may have been lookin' ahead just a little bit to Florida State. But, I would expect Tom will get their attention quite easily this week. He should have no problems."

ABOUT NEBRASKA FANS--"I've gotten more mail from Nebraska people since last October than anywhere else in the country. You know those folks are something special. They want to beat you, but they're very courteous and appreciative of good football. I wrote the people of Nebraska a letter after the game last year and it appeared in the paper. I meant every word of it.

"Heck we've had Nebraska people just driving through Tallahassee and they'll stop and call me on the phone. I think I'm going to be meeting about three families out there who have just written me and said they would like to introduce themselves. I know though who they will be rooting for at kickoff.

"I would guess that except for our own fans, who are also great, the Nebraska fans were more disappointed than anyone else when we lost to Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl last year."

ABOUT ROHN STARK--"Isn't he something? Right now he's a very vital member of this football team. When we've been in trouble the first two games we can count on Rohn to get us out. I really believe he does better under pressure when the other team has a couple of people bearing down on him. He just gets the ball off so quickly. If he had all day, I don't know that he would be as affective."

ABOUT MIKE RENDINA--"Right now he has been hot and cold, but I'm hoping his hot time is coming."

PLAYERS TO WATCH...

FLORIDA STATE

PUNTER ROHN STARK--(No. 3, 6-3, 195, Sr., Fifty Lakes, Mn.)--has kicked 12 times this season for a 44.3 average with the longest being 60 yards against Louisville...made several pre-season All-American teams and many feel he could become just the second punter in the history of the National Football League to be drafted in the first round...last year at Nebraska he kicked seven times for a 48.4 average...also an All-American in track and field where he participates in the decathlon...he and his wife Ann were featured in SPORTS ILLUSTRATED last week.

WIDE RECEIVER DENNIS MCKINNON--(No. 6, 6-1, 175, Jr., Miami, Fla.)--leads Seminoles in catches with nine for 107 yards in first two games...that means he needs just three more to equal his 1980 total (12) and six more to match his career total (15) at the start of the current season...has not yet pulled down his first TD catch of the campaign...returned punts in the opening game, but now has given that duty to freshman Cedric Jones...

NEBRASKA

I-BACK ROGER CRAIG--(No. 21, 6-1, 211, Jr., Davenport, Iowa)--played third team for Cornhuskers last year but still gained 769 yards (7.1 average per carry) and was the nation's sixth leading scorer with 15 touchdowns...vs. Iowa last week he had 18 carries for 77 yards and one TD...that was half of the team's total offense output (153 total yards)...last year vs. FSU he moved the ball to the two-yard line with time running out before the Huskers fumbled on the next play.

DEFENSIVE END JIMMY WILLIAMS--(No. 96, 6-3, 215, Sr., Washington, D.C.)--one of several pre-season All-American selections for the Cornhuskers...extremely quick he has done a 4.4 in the 40...vs. Iowa he was credited with five tackles and two assists...was the Most Valuable Lineman in last year's Sun Bowl...brother Toby could possibly line up right next to Jimmy at left tackle if he has recovered from a hepatitis attack.
