# Today's Game

Notre Dame football coach Gerry Faust never did expect to have much trouble preparing his Irish to play a Florida State team that has participated in two straight Orange Bowls and won at least 10 games three of the last four seasons.

But even if he had, the Seminoles' 36-27 upset of previously unbeaten and seventh-ranked Ohio State Saturday in Columbus most certainly clinched the issue.

"The minute our players heard that final score from Columbus, they gained a new measure of respect for Florida State," says Faust.

"I'm sure they already were well aware of the fact that Bobby Bowden has had great teams the last several years. But too many people had been trying to tell us Florida State had lost too many good players from a year ago and that they wouldn't be as good this season. The Ohio State game proved otherwise as far as we're concerned."

For the record, the Seminoles' triumph over the Buckeyes marked only the fifth time in 10 seasons a visiting team — other than Big Ten foe Michigan — had emerged from Ohio Stadium victorious.

"Any football team that plays at Ohio State and gains almost 500 yards in total offense is doing a lot of things well, especially considering they only gave up 38 yards on the ground defensively," Faust adds.

It all adds up to a first-time meeting today between topflight independents who have been consistent top 20 qualifiers in recent seasons.

For Florida State, the clash with the Irish will mark the midpoint of a death-defying five-game road schedule that sends the Seminoles to play at Nebraska (a 34-14 loss), Ohio State (a 36-27 victory), Notre Dame, Pittsburgh and LSU before returning to Tallahassee again. Florida State opened its '81 campaign with home wins over Louisville (17-0) and Memphis State (10-5) to account for its current 3-1 slate.

Notre Dame, meanwhile, righted its ship with a 20-7 triumph against Michigan State to even its record at 2-2 for 1981.

"I felt like the Michigan State game turned things around for us and got us going in the right direction again," says Faust. "We've still got a long way to go, but we did eliminate some of the little mistakes and we did play with more of the intensity that we hadn't seen enough of for two weeks. We've simply got to keep improving now that we've got our feet under us again."

The Irish tailback trio of Phil Carter, Greg Bell and freshman Chris Smith — which helped Notre Dame chalk up an even 300 yards on the ground versus Michigan State with 208 among them — probably will have to be better yet against Florida State. The Seminoles surrendered but 38 ground yards on 31 Ohio State rushing attempts — while completely halting one drive after the Buckeyes had a first down on the Florida State two-yard line.

Tackle Garry Futch, end Jarvis Coursey (defensive MVP in the '81 Orange Bowl) and cornerback James Harris are the only defensive regulars remaining from the unit that opened against Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl — but the tradition that enabled FSU to rank tops in the nation in scoring a year ago hasn't changed that much.

Notre Dame's defense — revitalized by a much-improved front four effort that produced four quarterback sacks, three pass deflections and a pair of fumble recoveries by Kevin Griffith — will have to contend with another highly-rated quarterback this week. Florida State senior Rick Stockstill enjoyed his best outing of his career by completing 25 of 41 throws for 299 yards against Ohio State.

"Stockstill picked Ohio State apart with the short passes," says Faust. "He really makes the linebackers work because he tries to throw underneath the coverage lots of times. Their fullback, Mike Whiting, caught nine passes Saturday, so you can see he knows how to utilize his backs in the passing game."

The Florida State rushing attack is led by freshman running back Billy Allen (38 carries, 202 yards), along with Whiting (49 carries, 174 yards) at fullback and junior Rick Williams (35 attempts, 117 yards) helping at tailback.

FOUR WOULD BE SCORE--Florida State (3-1) will try to score its second consecutive major upset when it travels to Notre Dame (2-2) Saturday.

SITE--Notre Dame Stadium (59,075), South Bend, Ind.

KICKOFF--1:30 p.m. EST (2:30 p.m. in Tallahassee and most of Florida).

ATTENDANCE--Sold out.

TV--FSU fans living in Tallahassee will have the opportunity to watch the game live on WECA-TV (channel 27). Bob Murphy handles the play-by-play chores while Vic Prinzi is the color analyst. They are also the announcers for the rebroadcast of the game Sunday on a state wide cable network that is produced and packaged by Southern Video.

Metrosports, a cable-TV company, will show the game across the country on a delayed basis as part of a contract with Notre Dame. Harry Kalas handles the play-by-play with former Irish All-American George Connor doing the color commentary.

RADIO--Florida State's largest radio network ever, 68 stations, will carry the game across the state of Florida and throughout most of south Georgia and Alabama. Gene Deckerhoff is the Seminole play-by-play announcer and former FSU head coach Bill Peterson provides the analysis. Peterson guided the Tribe between 1960 and 1970 and compiled a 62-42-11 record.

Notre Dame has a 218 station nationwide radio network that is produced by the Mutual Broadcasting System. Tony Roberts calls the play-by-play with Al Wester offering color commentary.

LAST WEEK--Florida State, with a two-week layoff to prepare, surprised seventh ranked Ohio State, 36-27, in Columbus. The Seminoles, trailing 7-3, got momentum on their side when linebacker Ron Hester blocked a punt in the first quarter and ran the ball into the endzone for a TD. The lead changed with 8:25 remaining in the second quarter on a 13-yard pass from Rick Stockstill to Tony Johnson to make it 23-21. Stockstill was the catalyst of a revitalized Seminole offense that totaled 496 yards--197 rushing and 299 passing. Stockstill had the best day of his career completing 25 of 42 for 299 yards. Fullback Mike Whiting and tailback Ricky Williams keyed the running attack with 90 and 81 yards, respectively.

Notre Dame, playing before its home fans, ended a two-game losing streak with a 20-7 victory against Michigan State.

THE SERIES--This is the first football meeting ever between the two major independents. No additional games are scheduled.

THE CAPTAINS--Florida State elected five for the season. Offensively, the duties fall to quarterback Rick Stockstill (11) and fullback Michael Whiting (27) while defensively it's James Gilbert (51) and cornerback James Harris (33). Punter Rohn

Notre Dame has three captains for the 1981 season. They are linebacker Bob Crable (43), tailback Phil Carter (22) and defensive end Tony Belden (36).

THE COACHES--This is the sixth season for Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) as Florida State's head coach. Bowden arrived on the FSU scene in 1976 and promptly went 5-6, scoring more victories in one season than were registered in the previous three years. Since then the Tribe has gone 10-2, 8-3, 11-1 and 10-2. Following the completion of the 1979 and '80 seasons, the Tribe was invited to participate in the Orange Bowl, FSU's first appearances in a major New Year's Day post-season attraction. During the campaign, the Tribe advanced to second in both wire service polls and after a narrow 18-17 loss to Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl, finished fifth. In five seasons plus four games, Bowden has guided the Tribe to a 47-15 record, including a 24-4 mark in the last 28 games. He has twice been cited as a National Coach of the Year--1979 by ABC-TV and Chevrolet and 1980 Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year. He has twice been named the Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year. This is the third head coaching stop for the 51-year-old Birmingham, Ala., native. He had a 31-6 mark at Samford (1959-62) and went 42-26 while at West Virginia (1970-75). His overall record is now 120-47 (72.1 winning percentage). Prior to the start of the current campaign, Bowden ranked sixth among active coaches with a minimum 10 years as a Division I-A coach for winning percentage. The total victories was ninth among active coaches in Division I-A.

Gerry Faust (Dayton '58) is in his first season as head coach at Notre Dame. The Notre Dame administration took Faust away from Cincinnati's Moeller High School where he had compiled a 174-17-2 record in 18 years. Because of his unique background, Faust has been the subject of numerous magazine and television features in his first season at the helm of the Fighting Irish.

BOBBY VS. NOTRE DAME--Never before has he coached against the Fighting Irish.

BOBBY'S ROAD RECORD--Bowden and the Seminoles have had more than their share of success on the road since his arrival in '76. FSU has won 19 of 28 road contests in that span and four of the nine losses came in the first season when the Tribe played away from home six times. The road record doesn't include bowl game appearances at the 1977 Tangerine or two Orange Bowls.

MORE ROAD DATA--FSU is 1-1 in games away from Tallahassee this season. The Seminoles won eight of nine road games during the 1979 and '80 seasons, losing only at Miami, 10-9, during the '80 campaign. Taking the road statistics just a step further, FSU has won 12 of its last 16 road games and 17 of the last 22.

OKTOBERFEST CONTINUES--When it travels to Notre Dame, FSU will be playing the third game of what head coach Bobby Bowden jokingly calls "Oktoberfest". At the start of the season, the Tribe gridders faced the toughest schedule of any Division I-A team in the country according to a computer analysis done by the NCAA statistical service. The roughest part of the slate started September 19 at Nebraska. After that assignment, the Tribe had a road date last weekend at Ohio State followed by this week's trek to Notre Dame and trips the following two weekends to Pittsburgh and LSU.

STOCKSTILL BESTS--Seminole quarterback Rick Stockstill had the best passing day of his career in the victory at Ohio State. Rick completed 25 of 41 passes for 299 yards and two touchdowns. His previous best was a 19 of 30 effort for 182 yards in a 10-9 loss last year to Miami.

RANKS, BUT NOT NEAR TOP--Rick Stockstill's passing efforts vs. Ohio State were personal bests for him but weren't close to the school record category. His pass attempts (41) ties him for 11th with Gary Huff for a single game and the completions (25) ties him with Huff and Cappleman for the eighth best single game effort.

OCTOBER RECORD--Since Bowden's arrival at FSU, the Seminoles have enjoyed good success during the month of October. Including the Ohio State victory, the Tribe is 16-5 during the month. The five losses came in two seasons with three being administered in the first year. The other two came during the 1978 campaign. FSU has not lost a game in October since Pitt captured a 7-3 verdict on October 21, 1978. Since that time the Seminoles have reeled off nine consecutive October victories.

197 AND COUNTING--Florida State needs three more victories to reach the 200 plateau since it began playing football in 1947. The Tribe is now 197-145-12 since it began playing the sport.

SCHLICHTER NOW BEST--Ohio State quarterback Art Schlichter completed 31 of 52 passes against FSU for 458 yards and two touchdowns. The passing yards and completions are the most ever against the Seminoles. The previous passing yardage mark was 324 by Tommy Suggs of South Carolina in 1968. The most passes previously completed against



the Tribe was 25 by Doug Hendrick of Clemson in 1970. Schlichter totaled 412 yards offense against the Tribe to erase the old opponent record of 370 by Suggs.

NEW TEAM MARKS--Ohio State also established new opponent standards in team categories vs. FSU. The pass completions (32) erased the old mark of 26 by San Diego State in 1973 and the yardage (458) eliminated the 378 by Mississippi State in 1978.

ABOUT LOWREY--Clearing up some confusion on Seminole Kelly Lowrey...he's now the Tribe's third team quarterback, returning to the position he had last season after being tried in the spring at defensive end. Several rosters list him at the defensive position. He's the holder on PAT and field goal attempts for Mike Rendina and scored a TD vs. Ohio State on a fake field goal attempt.

BIG CROWDS & SEMINOLES--The 87,158 who watched FSU and Ohio State last Saturday was the largest crowd to ever watch a Seminole football team. The previous best was 77,535 at LSU last year. The Seminoles are getting used to playing before big crowds. In the previous road game at Nebraska on Sept. 19, the crowd was 76,289 which means thus far in two road games, FSU has played before 168,447. Capacity crowds are expected at Notre Dame, Pittsburgh and LSU later in the month. The closing game of the season against Florida is already a sellout.

#### WHAT THE PLAYERS SAY...

QUARTERBACK RICK STOCKSTILL--"This win probably meant more to me personally. I was happy last year beating Nebraska, Pittsburgh and Florida but this meant more being from Ohio and having my dad and whole family at the game. I was glad I was able to do well in front of them. This win showed us we can play this caliber of schedule. If we had lost we'd be 2-2 and wouldn't have much confidence.

"We concentrated more this week than against Nebraska. We knew what we had to do. We had a few penalties, no turnovers and made few mistakes -- just the opposite of what we did against Nebraska.

"We still have a long way to go to be as good as last year's team. If we continue to cut down on the mistakes and play together we might reach that level. I know Notre Dame has a good club and I'm sure they'll be fired up. They know we have a good team after we defeated Ohio State University and they'll be ready for us. I look at this game as a chance to move up in the polls and a chance to beat another established powerhouse."

OFFENSIVE TACKLE ERIC RYAN--"The Ohio State University game was the best the offensive line has played since I've been here. We always knew we could play like we did Saturday, but I'm not sure what caused us to reach that potential.

"You have to give credit to the scout team, they really got us ready for Ohio State. You have to give the coaches credit too, they called a great game. The win is like a new start for us. If we had lost we would have been in deep trouble. We knew we had to win the game.

"We just got finished playing Nebraska and Ohio State, so the Notre Dame name won't bother us. We weren't in awe of Ohio State and we won't be of Notre Dame. Coach Bowden put the point across that Ohio State was no different than us just because they wore the red jerseys."

WIDE RECEIVER DENNIS MCKINNON--"The win, well, that's the talk of the town. Everybody's happy now. The offense finally found a way to score points both by the run and pass. Against Nebraska we were inconsistent. Saturday, we turned that all around. The offensive line had a great game, the backs did what they had to and the receivers caught the ball when it was thrown to them.

"Last year we had a couple of great wins, but after getting beat by Nebraska then playing in front of 87,000 people and scoring 36 points, I'd have to say this was my favorite win.

"I've always been crazy about Notre Dame but I never dreamed I'd be playing against them. The game is pivotal, it could show the path of our season. It will show how much togetherness we have and how much we've matured."

KICKING SPECIALIST MIKE RENDINA--"That 52-yard field goal was the biggest kick of my life, no doubt about it. When Kelly (Lowrey) rolled out on the fake field goal and I saw he had no one to throw to, I just threw a block -- I didn't know what else to do.

"I used to watch Ohio State when I was young. I never dreamed I'd kick a 52-yard field goal against them.

"I can't wait to play Notre Dame. Defeating them is the only thing that could top the Ohio State win. South Bend is right near where I originally come from (Gary, Ind.) and if we could beat them, it would be unreal."



## FLORIDA STATE vs. NOTRE DAME

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### WHAT BOBBY SAYS...

— ABOUT OHIO STATE WIN--"That was a game we needed to have. I hate to use the term but we were almost in a 'must' win situation. A loss to Ohio State could have really crippled us with what we've got ahead.

"Yes we did have a change in offensive philosophy. We found out in the loss at Nebraska that we were asking our players to do some things that they aren't capable of handling yet. So we needed to make a change."

ABOUT NOTRE DAME--"It's going to be another big football game for our young football team. We were very beat up in the Ohio State game and that concerns me as we prepare for Notre Dame. There are probably going to be more than one or two players who won't be able to practice a whole lot this week.

"Playing Notre Dame is a tremendous benefit for our football program. Our program has now reached the level where it's recognized on a national scale, but a win against Notre Dame would really put us on the map.

"I didn't start thinking about the Notre Dame game until Sunday. There is no way we can pinpoint an opponent and gear everything to that one game, not with a schedule like we have."

ABOUT OKTOBERFEST--"You know that is a term used to describe a celebration. We're just helping our opponents celebrate with the sort of schedule that we've got lined up.

"There are two things that are unfair about the current five game stretch we're in. One unfair thing is that we're playing these five games in a row and the other is that they're on the road. I just wish one or two of them could be in Tallahassee so we could show the folks what southern hospitality is really like."

ABOUT ROHN STARK--"In the Nebraska game, we found that he was out-punting his coverage and it caused problems. Leading up to the Ohio State game, we worked on Rohn getting less distance from his kicks but better hang time. He's a tremendous athlete and very valuable to our football team."

ABOUT FSU OFFENSE--"We're going to take what the other team will give us. Ohio State was willing to give us the short pass so that's what we went with. It opened up our running game and made our attack very effective. I've always said that we will take what the other team gives.

"We are lucky to have a quarterback like Rick Stockstill. He is very intelligent and has the ability to audible at the line of scrimmage to go at the weakness of the defense. Rick is the type of quarterback who very rarely makes a mistake and hardly ever makes one that will get you beat.

ABOUT DEFENSE--"FSU gave up a lot of yards and a lot of points Saturday but we were still able to win and that's what counts. Remember, too, that we were facing one of the premier quarterbacks in the country. He had a lot to do with how our defense played. Art Schlichter kept our defense off balance the entire day."

### PLAYERS TO WATCH...

#### FLORIDA STATE

PUNTER ROHN STARK--(No. 3, 6-3, 195, Sr., Fifty Lakes, Mn.)--pro scouts consider him the best punting prospect to come out of college since Ray Guy played at Southern Mississippi...thus far in '81 he has kicked 28 times for a 44.8 average...at Nebraska he established a new single game record for FSU with a 51.1 yard average on eight boots...has the distinction of earning All-American honors in two sports, football and track and field where he participates in the decathlon...finished eighth in the NCAA decathlon competition last season...made most of this fall's pre-season All-American teams and recently was featured in SPORTS ILLUSTRATED.

QUARTERBACK RICK STOCKSTILL--(No. 11, 6-1, 185, Sr., Fernandina Beach, Fla.)--one of five Seminole co-captains this season...had the best statistical game of his career in upset victory at Ohio State last Saturday where he compiled 25 of 41 passes for 299 yards and two touchdowns...that raised his season figures to 64 completions in 107 attempts for 726 yards and four touchdowns...five of his tosses have been intercepted...Rick became a starter last fall after three seasons of bench duty, but when he got the opportunity he took full advantage, starting all 11 games plus the Orange Bowl...he has now started 16 consecutive games for the Tribe and FSU has a 13-3 mark in that span.



PLAYERS TO WATCH...

FULLBACK MIKE WHITING--(No. 27, 6-2, 210, Sr., Largo, Fla.)--rushed for 90 yards last Saturday in 15 carries against Ohio State after gaining just 84 in 34 carries during the three previous games...he was also FSU's leading receiver against the Buckeyes, catching nine for 74 yards which gives him 12 catches for 77 yards in four games...last season he was Florida State's leading pass receiver with 25 catches...he's considered an outstanding blocking back...he already ranks seventh on the all-time FSU career rushing listing with 1,198 yards.

DEFENSIVE END JARVIS COURSEY--(No. 64, 6-5, 220, Sr., Gray, Ga.)--has fully recovered from a back injury that prevented him from participating in spring practice...was the Defensive Most Valuable Player in last year's Orange Bowl despite FSU's 18-17 loss to Oklahoma...went into the Ohio State game ranked third on the Seminole tackle chart and added to his total with one solo tackle and four assists against the Buckeyes...will be one of the few Seminole football players to letter four years...his first two seasons, Jarvis was a member of the speciality units...

NOTRE DAME

TAILBACK GREG BELL--(No. 28, 6-0, 205, So. Columbus, Ohio)--was not even listed on the Notre Dame two-deep for the Michigan State game last week...has taken advantage of senior tailback Phil Carter's slow start in 1981 and is the leading rusher for the Irish with 285 yards on 41 carries, a 7.7 average...saw limited playing time in each of Notre Dame's first three games until he exploded for 165 yards on 20 carries vs. Michigan State last week...may be a starter when the Irish offense lines up next week...

MIDDLE LINEBACKER BOB CRABLE--(No. 43, 6-3, 225, Sr., Cincinnati, Ohio)--probably Notre Dame's most celebrated player...after four games, Crable has 61 tackles to lead all Irish defenders...six of those were tackles for losses for a total of 30 yards...named ABC-Chevrolet MVP for his 20 tackle performance vs. Michigan earlier this year, the second time in his career Crable has received that award...consensus All-American a year ago and was voted MVP by his teammates...already ranks second on the Irish all-time tackle list (415)...played for Notre Dame head coach Gerry Faust at Cincinnati's Moeller High School when that team won three consecutive state titles.

FSU TRAVEL--Seminoles will travel to the Notre Dame game Friday via Piedmont charter leaving Tallahassee at 2 p.m. with arrival in South Bend slated for 2:55 p.m. EST. Team and official party will headquarter at Holiday Inn, Elkhart, Ind. (219/264-7502). FSU will not work at Notre Dame Stadium Friday, but will walk the field. FSU will return to Tallahassee immediately following the game and is expected to arrive in Tallahassee at 9 p.m.

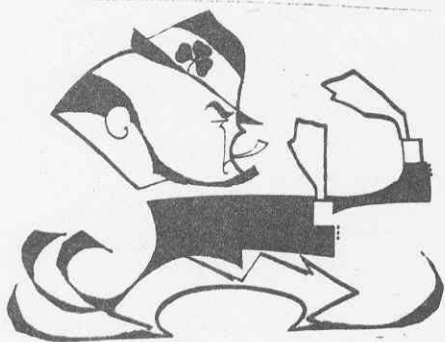

### GAME NOTES

Florida State's 19-13 victory in the first-ever meeting between the two schools puts Notre Dame below the .500 mark this late in the season for the first time since 1963. In that season, the Irish were 2-2 after four games, and lost their last five to finish 2-7.

The Seminoles became only the ~~xx~~ third team since 1943 to win their first game in Notre Dame Stadium, joining Missouri (1972) and Clemson (1979). Five other teams were first-time winners in Notre Dame Stadium between 1931 and 1943.

Today's loss snaps a seven-game Notre Dame Stadium winning streak for Notre Dame. The last opponent to defeat the Irish at home was Clemson. The Tigers defeated Notre Dame 16-10 in the final home game of the 1979 season. Notre Dame, which returned to traditional blue home jerseys after wearing green jerseys for the past 4 ~~xxx~~ seasons, had won its past seven games while wearing the blue jerseys, dating back to a 31-10 loss to Pitt in the 1976 season-opener.

Including today's game the Notre Dame defense is unscored upon during the first quarter through five games in 1981.

The Irish were just 1-14 in third down conversions today, and didn't notch their only successful conversion until the 1:45 mark of the third quarter. Florida State made good on five of 17 third down attempts.

Chris Brown's second-quarter interception for Notre Dame was the first of his career for the sophomore from Owensboro, Kentucky.

Notre Dame's 38 yards of passing ~~xxxxxxx~~ represent the lowest total of the 1981 ~~xxx~~ season for the Irish.

Florida State punter Rohn Stark's successful fake punt in the first half was the first ~~xx~~ attempt of his four-year career. Stark entered today's game ranked ninth in the nation with a 44.8 yard average. He averaged 48.8 yards on eight kicks today.

I felt we were very fortunate to win. We had chances early to put the game away but Notre Dame wouldn't let us.

I am very pleased with our team's effort. If our defense keeps improving, that will tell us what kind of team we will have by the end of the year. I definitely think our potential is ahead of us, not behind us.

(About his game plan) I didn't think that we could sustain drives on the ground against Notre Dame. They would bleed us to death. We started out throwing early and then, as their front four started to lose discipline because of pass rushing, we went to our running game. We put a couple of new things into our play book for Notre Dame -- and we got a touchdown on one of them.

We came out dry on the goalline far too many times. I felt like a baseball coach whose team left 15 runners on base.

To me, personally, it was the biggest win I'll ever have. I have tremendous respect for Notre Dame. Having wanted to coach all my life, you can imagine what respect I have for a place that produced the likes of Knute Rockne -- and a tailback named Ronald Reagan.

(What the win does for the program) It puts us up there with the best of them.
