ONGOING OKTOBERFEST--Florida State (4-1) will bid for its third consecutive upset victory when it meets Pittsburgh (4-0) Saturday.

SITE--Pitt Stadium (56,500), Pittsburgh, Pa.

KICKOFF--1:30 p.m. EDT.

ATTENDANCE--Game is not sold out and Pitt officials are expecting 50,000.

TV--FSU fans living in Tallahassee will have the opportunity to watch the game live on WECA-TV (channel 27). Bob Murphy handles the play-by-play chores while Vic Prinzi is the color analyst. They are also the announcers for the rebroadcast of the game Sunday on a state wide cable network that is produced and packaged by Southern Video.

RADIO--Florida State's largest radio network ever, 68 stations, will carry the game across the state of Florida and throughout most of south Georgia and Alabama. Gene Deckerhoff is the Seminole play-by-play announcer and former FSU head coach Bill Peterson provides the analysis. Peterson guided the Tribe between 1960 and 1970, compiling a 62-42-11.

WTAE serves as the flagship station on a 30-station tri-state network. Bill Hillgrove calls the play-by-play while Johnny Sauer, voice of the Minnesota Vikings,

adds color commentary for all Pitt broadcasts.

LAST WEEK--Florida State scored its second consecutive road upset with a 19-13 victory over Notre Dame at South Bend, Ind. FSU broke a 3-3 halftime deadlock with a 10-3 scoring advantage in the third quarter. But, before breaking ahead, the Seminoles saw Notre Dame go on top, 6-3, with a 23-yard Harry Oliver field goal. But FSU picked up its first touchdown of the day when QB Rick Stockstill threw 17 yards to FB Mike Whiting and Mike Rendina added the placement. A 23-yard field goal by Rendina with 5:23 remaining in the quarter made it 13-6. Notre Dame tied the game with only three seconds gone in the fourth quarter, but FSU went back on top with 7:41 remaining when Stockstill found Whiting on a five-yard scoring toss. Rendina, however, missed the PAT. Seminole tailback Ricky Williams gained a career high 135 yards rushing in 15 attempts and caught one pass for sight. Whiting added 71 rushing yards in 15 attempts and caught five more passes for 44 yards and two TDS.

Pitt toppled West Virginia, 17-0, in a battle of unbeatens at Morgantown, W. Va. The Panthers, who were rated fourth in both wire service polls prior to the game, led 7-0 at intermission and added another 10 points in the third quarter. Pitt picked up the win without using its top-notch quarterback Dan Marino, who was sidelined by a shoulder injury. Marino entered the weekend ranked as the nation's No. 1 quarterback

in passing efficiency.

FLORIDA STATE vs. PITT Page Two (2)

THE SERIES--This will be the sixth meeting between the two major independents. Florida State won a 36-22 verdict last year to break a two-game losing string to the Panthers and take a 3-2 series advantage. The teams will play again next season in Tallahassee.

LAST YEAR-FSU, playing the third ranked team in the nation for the second consecutive week, upset the Panthers, 36-22, before 52,894, the second largest crowd to ever watch a game in Tallahassee. Trailing 7-3, Florida State broke on top with a 20-point second quarter. In that second 15 minutes, the Tribe had a pair of field goals and two touchdowns. Pittsburgh came up with 386 yards total offense compared to 290 for the Seminoles. But the major difference came in the turnover department. The visiting Panthers had seven miscues during the game compared to zero for the Tribe. Florida State's defensive backfield came up with three interceptions and the Seminole defenders also covered four Pittsburgh fumbles.

THE COACHES-This is the sixth season Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) has guided the FSU football program. His current record at the school is 48-15 and he has a career ledger of 121-47 in 15 seasons. His previous head coaching stops were at Samford (1959-62) where he was 31-6 and West Virginia (1970-75) where the Mountaineers went 42-26. Bowden has guided the Seminoles to three bowl appearances in his first five seasons. The Tangerine Bowl came first in 1977 followed by the Orange Bowls of 1980 and '81. Last season the Seminoles went to second in both wire service polls at the conclusion of the season. FSU is 25-4 in its last 29 games with Bowden at the coaching helm. He has twice been cited as a National Coach of the Year--1979 by ABC-TV and Chevrolet and last year by the American Sportsmanship Council which presents the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award. He has twice been named the Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year. Prior to the start of the current season, Bowden ranked sixth among active coaches with a minimum 10 years as a Division I-A coach for winning The total victories was ninth among active coaches in Division I-A. percentage. The total victories was ninth among active coaches in Division 1-A.

Jackie Sherrill (Alabama '66) has a rather remarkable 43-8-1 record in four plus

seasons of coaching at Pitt. Last season the 11-1 Panthers were unanimously selected as the number two team in the nation and 1977 and 1979 squads were ranked sixth. Under Sherrill's guidance, Pitt has won the Eastern championship twice in a row, capped by Fiesta and Gator Bowl victories over Arizona and South Carolina. With his 38 wins prior to the current season, Sherrill established himself as Pitt's all-time winningest percentage coach among names that are legendary in college football history: Pop Warmer, Jock Sutherland, John Michelosen and Johnny Majors.

BOBBY VS. PITT-Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden is quite familiar with the Pitt football program. He has been a head coach with Pittsburgh as the opponent eight times and stands 4-4 after last year's 36-22 win. Bowden was 3-3 against the Panthers during his stay at West Virginia and is 1-1 since coming to Florida State. The loss as head coach at FSU came in 1978, 7-3. The Bowden victories while at West Virginia came in 1971 (20-9), 1972 (38-20) and 1975 (17-14). The losses were 1970 (36-35), 1973 (35-7) and 1974 (31-14).

BOBBY @ PITT-This will be the fifth time a team head-coached by Bobby Bowden has invaded Pitt Stadium. Bowden presently is 1-3 there with the only win coming in 1972 while at West Virginia, 38-20. While at West Virginia he lost in 1970 (36-35) and 1974 (31-14). As Seminole head coach he lost in 1978, 7-3.

BOWDEN VS. SHERRILL-The record is even at 1-1 with Bowden winning last season, 36-22, and Sherrill taking the 7-3 verdict in 1978.

OKTOBERFEST CONTINUES -- At Notre Dame, Florida State passed the midway mark of what most observers consider the roughest road trip in the history of college football. Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden "fondly" refers to this segment of the '81 schedule as Oktoberfest even though the road trip began Sept. 19 at Nebraska. Road games followed at Ohio State and Notre Dame with Pitt and LSU still remaining. Overall the Seminoles will go 49 days without playing a game at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee.

BOWDEN ROAD RECORD--Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden has been relatively successful in road games since coming to FSU in '76. FSU has won 20 of 29 road contests in that span and four of the nine losses came in the first season when the Tribe played away from home six times. The road record doesn't include bowl game appearances at the 1977 Tangerine or two Orange Bowls.

ADDITIONAL ROAD RECORDS—FSU is 2-1 in games away from Tallahassee this fall. The Seminoles won eight of nine road games during the 1979 and 1980 seasons, losing only at Miami 10-9 during the 1980 campaign. Taking the road statistics just a step further, FSU has won 13 of its last 17 road games and 18 of the last 23.

OCTOBER VICTORY STRING--FSU has now put together a streak of 10 consecutive October victories dating back to October 21, 1978. The last team to down the Tribe was (you guessed it), Pittsburgh, 7-3, at Pitt Stadium. Since Bowden's arrival at FSU, the Seminoles have enjoyed good success during the month of October. Including the Notre Dame victory, the Tribe is 17-5 during the month under Bowden. The five losses came in two seasons with three being administered in the first year. The other two came during the 1978 campaign.

PITT SEEING WEST VIRGINIA--The FSU vs. Pitt game this week marks the third straight time the Panthers have played a school with a West Virginia University connection. It started on October 3 at South Carolina when the Panthers met the Gamecocks coached by former WVU mentor Jim Carlen. Last week Pitt met West Virginia in Morgantown and this week the Seminoles invade Pitt Stadium coached by another former WVU mentor, Bobby Bowden.

VICTORY STRING TOPS--Pittsburgh now enjoys the longest winning streak in the country, 11 games. The last loss administered the Panthers was last October 11 in Tallahassee when FSU took a 36-22 verdict. The Panthers took over the distinction of leading the nation in consecutive wins when Brigham Young was beaten 45-41 by Nevada-Las Vegas last Saturday.

A THOUGHT--Last year when FSU toppled Pittsburgh, the Panthers had won 14 straight. FSU, at the time, had just a one-game winning streak, beating Nebraska the previous week 18-14 after losing a 10-9 verdict at Miami.

PITT HOME WIN STREAK--Pitt has a 17-game home winning streak dating back to the start of the 1978 season. The streak includes five home wins in 1978-79-80 and two this year. The last time the Panthers were beaten on their home turf was 1977 when Penn State took a 15-13 verdict in the final regular season game.

NUMBERS TO THINK ABOUT FOR COMPARISON—Here's a comparison of the FSU and Pitt football teams since the 1979 season. The Panthers have won 26 of 28 games in that time while the Seminoles have captured 25 of 29. North Carolina and FSU are the only teams to beat the Panthers while Oklahoma (twice in the Orange Bowl), Miami (1980) and Nebraska (1981) are the only teams to trip FSU. Pitt's loss to North Carolina came in the regular season at Chapel Hill, N.C.

RICKY'S BEST GROUND EFFORT—FSU junior tailback Ricky Williams set a personal best with his 135 yards rushing in 15 carries at Notre Dame. His best previous effort came last Oct. 18 against Boston College when he rushed for 109 in 12 carries. The effort at Notre Dame marked just the second time Ricky has ever crossed the 100-yard barrier.

TWO AWAY FOR BOWDEN, FSU-FSU and Bobby Bowden need just two more victories to achieve milestones. When and if the sixth win of the season comes, it will be Bowden's 50th since arriving at Florida State and the 200th in the history of the school since it began playing football in 1947. FSU now shows a 198-145-12 record since it began playing the sport.

LOOKING AHEAD TO HOME STAND—FSU officials announced last week that the Miami game set for November 7 is already a sellout. Except for a Florida game, it marks the earliest sellout in the history of FSU football. Last season the Pitt game sold out approximately 10 days prior to kickoff, but never has the sold out sign gone out a month before the kickoff.

MORE TICKET DATA--FSU ticket officials also said last week only 3,000 tickets remain for the Homecoming Game Oct. 31 against Western Carolina and less than 1,500 remain for the Southern Mississippi game October 14.

PLAYERS TO WATCH ...

FLORIDA STATE

PUNTER ROHN STARK--(No. 3, 6-3, 195, Sr., Fifty Lakes, Mn.)--although his average this season doesn't rank as the best in the country, most pro scouts believe Rohn is the best punter in college football since Ray Guy played for Southern Mississippi... after 34 kicks this season he's averaging 45.5 yards...at Nebraska he established a new single game record for FSU with a 51.1 yard average on eight boots...last week at Notre Dame it was six kicks for 48.8...the longest of the season is for 63 yards at Nebraska...has the distinction of earning All-American honors in two sports, football and track and field where he participates in the decathlon...finished eighth in the NCAA decathlon competition last season...made most of this fall's pre-season All-American teams and recently was featured in SPORTS ILLUSTRATED.

LINEBACKER TOMMY YOUNG--(No. 54, 6-1, 205, Jr., Lake City, Fla.)--has been converted this season from runningback to linebacker and two weeks ago made the first start of his college career against Ohio State...in that game he totaled 16 tacklesfour solo and 12 assists -- and was named the Associated Press Southeastern Lineman of the week with Alabama's Thomas Boyd...Young followed that effort with a 15 tackle effort in the upset win at Notre Dame where he had five solo and 10 assisted tackles ... one of those tackles was for an eight-yard loss...his move to linebacker was started in the spring, but he dislocated an elbow on the fifth day of practice... started fall practice at bottom of depth chart.

TAILPACK RICKY WILLIAMS--(No. 44, 5-10, 170, Jr., Griffin, Ga.)-his best rushing effort since coming to FSU came last Saturday at Notre Dame when he ran for 135 yards in 15 carries...that puts him at the top of the FSU rushing list for the season with 252 yards in 50 carries...he has also scored two TDs...was injured early in the campaign but has now drawn starting assignment in last two games...the Notre Dame rushing totals marked just the second time he has crossed the 100-yard barrier since coming to FSU...is now 131 yards short of matching his efforts from last season when he played mostly in a backup role. HOME WIN STREAM - Fitt has a 17-pane boxe wight

QUARTERBACK DAN MARINO-(No. 13, 6-4, 215, Jr., Pittsburgh, Pa.)-leads the nation in passing efficiency with 164.5 rating points...was picked as SPORTS ILLUSTRATED player of the week vs. South Carolina where he threw for 346 yards and six touchdowns (the second best passing performance in Pitt history)...'81 totals show 60 of 120 pass completions for 820 yards and 13 touchdowns...sat out the West Virginia game with a shoulder and neck injury...currently is Pitt's second leading all-time pass yardage leader but needs just 111 yards to take the top spot.

LINEBACKER SAL SUNSERI--(No. 66, 6-0, 220, Sr., Pittsburgh, Pa.)--leading tackler on the Pitt squad with 40 in four games...only one of two returnees to this year's Panther defense...this is Sal's third year as a starter...last fall he was Pitt's fourth leading tackler with 81--the three players ahead of him were all picked in the National Football League draft.

WHAT THE PLAYERS SAY...

TB RICKY WILLIAMS--"We had great blocking by the offensive line against Notre Dame. At first, I didn't think we could run against them, but late in the second quarter our ground game started moving.

"The Notre Dame win felt better than Ohio State. We needed the win to keep the momentum going. Defeating Notre Dame showed we could win away from home more than

"We need to play with the same intensity we've had the last two weeks against Pitt. This is a chance for us to beat another team in the Top 10. It reminds me of last year when they were ranked third and came to Tallahassee."

DB HARVEY CLAYTON -- "Notre Dame didn't test us against the pass like Ohio State. We worked on tackling all week and felt confident we could stop them on the ground. "I was excited, but not awed at Notre Dame. I was just ready to play. Defeating Notre Dame did a lot for our ego, but we have to put it all behind us now.

"There is now another game--Pitt--and I'm just going to concentrate on Marino

and those great Pittsburgh receivers."

LB TOMMY YOUNG-"I think we played well against Notre Dame, but I also think we

can play better.

"I'm starting to feel more confident at linebacker and in what I'm doing and I think now others have confidence in my ability. At times I feel the defense is falling apart and that is when the other team is moving the ball. When we play together, like on a goal line stand, it's tough for the other team to move the ball.
"Pittsburgh is the next step. It was great beating the Notre Dame tradition, but

we know another tough one is ahead.

"Pitt is going to be fired up to play us because of last season. We need to be ready because we know they will be."

DB PAT MILLIGAN--"At first, it was like a fantasy playing against Notre Dame, but that quickly wore off when you realize you can play right with them if you want.

"We had a total team effort Saturday. I think our entire defense did a fantastic

"I enjoyed the game because there were 22 people from my family in the stands. "Even though I've made it as a walk-on, I still must keep impressing the coaches. When I'm playing I try not to make any mistakes and make some big plays so the coaches will keep me there."

WHAT BOBBY SAYS ...

ABOUT NOTRE DAME WIN--"Ever since I came to Florida State I knew that the Notre Dame game was on the schedule and looked forward to going up there to play. I don't think it ever really struck me though that we could go up there and win-that seemed like such an awesome task. Now that we have won I'm sure the memories will stick with me for a long time. It will probably be the biggest win I'll have as a college head coach because of the respect I have for the program at Notre Dame and the tradition that goes with that program."

ABOUT FLORIDA STATE-"Right now we're on a hot streak and the question is whether or not it can continue. In the last two weeks, we've had two great victories that I'm sure has every college football fan in the country talking about what's going on Tallahassee, Fla.

"My concern is not whether we can get ready mentally to play another tough opponent, but how we are going to do physically. Our players have taken a tough physical beating

the last two weeks and more is in store at Pittsburgh.

"Can we do it again? I don't know but we'll sure find out Saturday at Pittsburgh.
Has our luck run out? That is something I'll answer Saturday afternoon about 4:15 p.m."

ABOUT PITTSBURGH--"We've played Nebraska, Ohio State and Notre Dame and now Pitt is the bad boy of the five-game road swing. After watching Pitt on film I can say they are the best of everyone we've seen thus far beyond a shadow of a doubt.

"If we are going to win, the Florida State football team will need to make improvement. So far we have improved each week, but the question is whether we can do

it again."

ABOUT DAN MARINO -- "Oh boy, here we go again. Remember what Art Schlichter did to us two weeks ago; Danny is capable of the same. And, he has better tools to do it because he's surrounded by a better supporting cast. By that I mean the Pitt defense and speciality teams are better than Ohio State which makes the Panthers all the tougher."

AGAIN ON PITT--"You know I'm 4-4 coaching against Pitt and we won last year. That means this is my year to lose and I'm not sure I even want to go along if tradition is going to hold true.

"What makes it worse about going there to play is that Pitt Stadium has not been a very nice place for me to visit. Shoot, I've been there four times and only won

"It might be good to just send the team and I'll stay at home and watch it on television."
