FIVE STILL ALIVE--Florida State (4-2) will try for the second time to gain its fifth win of the season when it visits LSU (3-4) Saturday.

SITE--Tiger Stadium (76,092), Baton Rouge, La.

KICKOFF--7:30 p.m. CDT (8:30 p.m. in Tallahassee and most of Florida)

ATTENDANCE--The game is a sellout.

TV--FSU fans livining in Tallahassee will have the opportunity to watch the game live on WECA-TV (channel 27). Bob Murphy handles the play-by-play assignment while Vic Prinzi, former FSU quarterback, is the color analyst. They are also the announcers for the rebroadcast of the game Sunday on a cable network produced and packaged by Southern Video.

ESPN, The 24-hour sports cable network, will also do the game and has assigned the announce team of Jim Simpson (play-by-play) and Bud Wilkinson (analyst) for the broadcast. The network will show the game Sunday at midnight, October 26 at 1:30 p.m., October 27 at 4 a.m. and 9 p.m.

RADIO--WGLF-FM, Tallahassee, is the flagship for the 68-station FSU network. Gene Deckerhoff is assigned play-by-play chores and former FSU head coach Bill Peterson provides expert commentary. Peterson coached FSU between 1960 and 1970, compiling a record of 62-42-11.

WJBL of Baton Rouge is the flagship for the LSU network. John Ferguson calls the play with the aid of Walter Hill and Doug Moreau. Hill is in the booth with Ferguson while Moreau describes the field action.

LAST WEEK--Pitt smothered Florida State, 42-14, in a battle of Top 10 residents at Pitt Stadium. With the victory, the Panthers gained revenge for last year's 36-22 defeat to FSU which many national observers feel cost Pitt the national championship. Pitt jumped ahead of FSU 21-0 and then coasted to its fifth victory of the campaign. Quarterback Dan Marino come off the injured list to complete 15 of 27 passes for 251 yards against the Tribe. Tailback Bryan Thomas meanwhile was rushing 23 times for 217 yards. The Panthers totaled 503 yards offense compared to FSU's 311, 76 rushing and 235 passing.

LSU, meanwhile, bounced back from back-to-back Southeastern Conference losses to trip Kentucky, 24-10. The win pushed the Tigers to 3-4 overall and 1-3 in league play. Highlight of the Tigers' victory was a 100-yard kickoff return for touchdown by freshman Eric Martin, who also set up another TD with a 45-yard kickoff return. He also rushed for 73 yards on 20 carries in a revamped LSU offense.

THE SERIES—FSU has won two of the three previous games played between the schools. The first meeting came at the 1968 Peach Bowl where the Tigers captured a 31-27 verdict. FSU then evened the count with a 24-19 victory at Baton Rouge in 1979 and took the lead with a 16-0 win last season. This game is the third of a five-year contract that features all games in Tiger Stadium. The teams play again in 1982 and 1983.

LAST YEAR-Bill Capece kicked three field goals and Sam Platt ran for a touchdown as Florida State blanked LSU, 16-0, in Death Valley before 77,535-the third largest crowd in Tiger history. Turnovers, caused by a rugged Florida State defense, proved to be much of the difference. The Tigers fumbled three times and had a pass intercepted during the game. FSU, hoping to avoid any major mistakes, relied on a running attack for its offense. Tribe QB Rick Stockstill put the ball in the air 11 times and had six completions. Otherwise, FSU stayed on the ground, picking up 197 yards in 57 attempts.

THE COACHES--Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) has reached the midway point of his sixth season at the FSU helm. In that time, he has guided the Seminoles to a 48-16 record, hiking his overall ledger to 121-48 in 15 seasons of coaching at the major college level. His previous head coaching stops were at Samford (1959-62) where he was 31-6 and West Virginia (1970-75) where the Mountaineers went 42-26. Bowden has guided the Seminoles to three bowl appearances in his first five seasons. The Tangerine Bowl came first in 1977 followed by the Orange Bowls of 1980 and '81. Last season the Seminoles advanced to second in both wire service polls at the conclusion of the regular season and finished fifth after the bowls. FSU is 25-5 in its last 30 games with Bowden. He has twice been cited as a National Coach of the Year and twice been named Southern Independent Coach of the Year by Associated Press. Prior to the start of the current season, Bowden ranked sixth among active coaches with a minimum 10 years as a Division I-A coach for winning percentage. The total victories was ninth among active coaches in Division I-A.

Jerry Stovall (Missouri Baptist '73) is in his second season as head coach at LSU. He took the Tigers to a 7-4 mark last season after many had predicted a rebuilding and sub .500 season. The 40-year-old Stovall, a native of West Monroe, La., was an All-American halfback for the Tigers in the early 1960s, and had served as Varsity Club Coordinator in 1979 after returning to Tigertown in 1974 as offensive backfield coach under Coach Charles McClendon. Following the completion of his eligibility at LSU, Jerry was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals where he played strong safety. He was selected to the All-Pro squads in 1967 and 1968, and participated in the Pro Bowls in 1967, 1968 and 1969.

BOWDEN VS. LSU-Bobby Bowden has a 2-0 coaching record vs. LSU. The Seminole wins came in a 1979 ABC-TV Regional game, 24-19, and last year in the season opener 16-0.

TIGER HOMECOMING--LSU officials have picked the Florida State game as the Tiger Homecoming contest. It will be the 57th Homecoming Game played by the Tigers. The first was in 1922 when the Tigers beat Tulane, 25-14. In its previous 56 Homecoming games, the Tigers have compiled a record of 35-18-3. Last year LSU won a 21-17 verdict against Auburn to snap a string of three consecutive Homecoming losses.

SECONDS FOR TRIBE—This is the second time in three years FSU has served as the Homecoming opponent for LSU. The Seminoles spoiled the festive atmosphere surrounding Homecoming when they won a 24-19 verdict in 1979. That game was sent to 84 percent of the country in an ABC-TV regional game.

SEMINOLE HOMECOMING--Florida State will have an opportunity to celebrate its own Homecoming October 31 when it hosts Western Carolina. It will be a Homecoming not only for the graduates, but also the football team which will be playing its first game at Doak Campbell Stadium in 49 days.

OKTOBERFEST CONTINUES (ENDS)—The trip to LSU marks the fifth consecutive road game for the Seminoles. The trip, which most observers consider the roughest in the history of college football, has included dates at Nebraska, Ohio State, Notre Dame and Pitt in addition to this week's stop. Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden has called this portion of the schedule OKTOBERFEST even though it started on September 19.

BOWDEN ROAD RECORD-Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden has had better than average success on the road since coming to FSU in '76. The Seminoles have won 20 of 30 road games in that span and four of the 10 losses came in the first season when the Tribe played away from home six times. Two more losses came in 1978 and two this season.

'81 ROAD MARK--The Tribe has a .500 road record this fall. Wins came at Ohio State  $\overline{(36-27)}$  and Notre Dame (19-13) while the losses were administered at Nebraska (34-14) and Pitt (42-14). After the LSU trip, there will only be one more visit, Florida on November 28.

MORE ROAD FACTS—During the 1979 and 1980 seasons, FSU lost just one of nine road games, at Miami (10-9) in 1980. The Tribe has been the victor in 13 of its last 18 road games and 18 of the last 24.

PITT ENDS THEM--Pitt's lopsided victory over FSU last Saturday ended a two-game winning streak for the Tribe this fall, but it also wiped out a 10-game victory string in the month of October for the Seminoles. The last time FSU had been beaten in October was October 21, 1978, when the Tribe bowed 7-3 at Pittsburgh.

THIRD HIGHEST YIELD--Pitt's 42 points last Saturday were the third most scored against FSU since the Bowden takeover in '76. Mississippi State did the worst damage with its 55 in '78. Miami is the next to check in with 47 in a 47-0 whitewash of the Tribe during the 1976 campaign.

COMPARISONS--It's unfair to compare last year's FSU defense with the current group, but several statistics are of interest:

(1) Already this season the Seminoles have yielded 121 points, 20.2 per game. Last year in the 11 regular season games the Tribe gave up just 85, an average of 7.7.

(2) This season the opponents have gained 2,290 yards total offense. Last

year in the regular season the 11 foes gained just 2,155.

(3) The first six 1981 foes have rushed for 1,178 yards and passed for 977. Those totals in 11 games during '80 were 984 and 1,306.

OFFENSIVE PROBLEMS, TOO--FSU's turnover rate for the current campaign is also much higher than last year. Thus far in '81 Tribe quarterbacks have thrown 12 interceptions and there have been five lost fumbles. During the entire 1980 season, FSU threw just 11 interceptions and had six fumbles lost.

WORST SINCE--The 42-14 loss at Pitt last Saturday was the worst defeat administered the Seminoles since 1978 when Mississippi State took a 55-27 verdict at Starkville. The Tribe also lost the next week, 7-3, at Pitt.

MORE ABOUT LOSSES--Since those back-to-back losses in 1978 at Mississippi State and Pitt, the Seminoles have lost just three regular season games and two of those came this year at Nebraska and Pitt. The other was authored last season by Miami, 10-9. The losses at Mississippi State and Pitt were the last time the Seminoles lost back-to-back.

POSITIVE STUFF--All the negative statistics concerning recent losses can be made to look positive when one realizes that since those back-to-back defeats in 1978 FSU has won 29 of its 34 games. Taking that even further, if the post-season bowl games are eliminated, the Seminoles have been winners in 29 of their last 34 regular season outings.

SEC WIN STREAK--Against LSU, the Seminoles will have an opportunity to extend their winning streak against schools from the Southeastern Conference. The Seminoles are currently on a six-game streak against schools from the league and have not lost to an SEC team since Mississippi State turned its 55-27 trick in 1978. Since then the Tribe is 3-0 vs. Florida, 2-0 vs. LSU and 1-0 vs. Mississippi State.

SEMINOLE TRAVEL -- The FSU team and official party will depart Tallahassee Friday at 2:30 p.m. via Piedmont charter. Arrival in Baton Rouge is slated for one hour and 20 minutes later. Headquarters for the Tribe will be the Bellemont Motor Hotel, 7370 Airline Highway, Baton Rouge. Telephone: 504/357-8612. FSU will return to Tallahassee immediately after the game with arrival tenatively slated for Sunday at 1:30 a.m.

SID TRAVEL--Seminole sports information director Mark Carlson will arrive in Baton Rouge early Friday morning. He will headquarter at the Bellemont Motor Hotel (504/357-8612). #### FLORIDA STATE

PUNTER ROHN STARK--(No. 3, 6-3, 195, Sr., Fifty Lakes, Mn.)-his statistics don't lead the country, but Rohn is considered by most to be the most outstanding punter in the nation this fall...most pro scouts say he's the best to come out of college since Ray Guy toiled at Southern Mississippi and most believe he could be a first round draft selection...at Nebraska this season he established a new single game record for FSU with a 51.1 yard average on eight kicks...the longest of the season also came at Nebraska where he hit a 63-yarder...enters the LSU game with a 45.9 yard average on 42 kicks...last season his average was 45.1 on 57 kicks...has the distinction of earning All-American honors in two sports, football and track and field where he participates in the decathlon...finished eighth in the NCAA decathlon competition last season...made most of this fall's pre-season All-American teams and recently was featured in SPORTS ILLUSTRATED.

FULLBACK MICHAEL WHITING—(No. 27, 6-2, 210, Sr., Largo, Fla.)—despite the fact that he's the fullback, Mike is the Tribe's top receiver with 20 catches for 135 yards and two touchdowns...that falls into pattern with last season when he finished the campaign as the leading receiver with 25 catches for 203 yards...he's being pushed for the top spot in the receiving department by Dennis McKinnon, who's just one catch behind...Mike has also carried the ball 75 times for 284 yards...career—wise Mike has now rushed for 1,308 yards, seventh best all—time...he needs 148 yards to move into the fifth spot now occupied by Bobby Renn (1956—58, 1,455)...in pass receiving Mike has caught 65 passes for 499 yards and two scores...the first major start of his career came in the '79 game at LSU where the coaching staff employed him as a tail—back...not only recognized for his running ability, but also for work as a blocker.

DEFENSIVE END JARVIS COURSEY--(No. 64, 6-5, 220, Sr., Gary, Ga.)--a leader in the Seminole defensive line he's playing at 100 percent after sustaining a back injury prior to last year's Orange Bowl...still he won Defensive Most Valuable Player honors in the 18-17 loss to Oklahoma...entered the Pitt game as the fourth leading tackler following a 14-tackle effort against Notre Dame...is a legitimate candidate for all-star honors.

QUARTERBACK ALAN RISHER--(No. 7, 6-2, 188, Jr., Slidell, La.)--has one of the nation's best passing percentages, completing 91 of 143 for a .636 rate...his completions have gone for 976 yards and include three touchdowns...three of the passes have been stolen by the enemy...already this season he has nine more completions than he had last year...his 189 passing yards vs. Auburn on October 10 was the 11th best single game effort ever at LSU.

LINEBACKER ALBERT RICHARDSON--(No. 51, 6-0, 223, Jr., Baton Rouge, La.)--leads the Tigers in tackles this season with 85, three more than fellow linebacker Lawrence Williams...included among the tackles are a quarterback sack for five yards and four tackles for loss amounting to six yards...last season he was the team's leading tackler with 129...had a game high 18 tackles vs. Mississippi State.

#### WHAT THE PLAYERS SAY...

WR TONY JOHNSON--"We weren't as motivated as we were against Ohio State and Notre Dame. It's hard to get up every week when you're on the road. When we play we have the tendency to get the big break--this week they went the other way.

"I know we can get up for LSU. We have to establish ourselves as winners again. We also know it's the last game of the trip and the next week we'll be home. Everyone is looking forward to that.

"The offense needs to execute better. People know that we're capable of winning after Ohio State and Notre Dame. We need to demonstrate that spirit again."

DT ALPHONSO CARREKER--"Our main problem was that we couldn't get to Marino. I think he's a better quarterback than Art Schlichter. It was very disappointing allowing 42 points. Our goal this year was to allow the least amount of points and break the record Pitt had set.

"We've got to stop missing tackles. There were always people running into our secondary. The game reminded me of Nebraska. We missed tackles, made more mistakes and then the breaks went Pitt's way.

"Now our objective will be to rebound. We need to have a good week of practice, forget about Pitt and begin to think positively about ourselves. LSU will be fired up to play us. They will try to exploit our weaknesses from what they see on film."

WR PHIL WILLIAMS—"We need to bounce back against LSU. The hurt of this defeat is going to last for a while, but we need to forget it, put it behind us.

"Even though we've lost two, we're still in the national spotlight. If we can win the rest of our games, I think we'll still be inconsideration for a good bowl and national ranking.

"Pitt was hurting us with the blitz. We couldn't figure out what they were doing and really had a rough time picking it up. Still we were able to move the ball, but every time something good would get started, we would have a major breakdown."

NG JAMES GILBERT--"We didn't play well and Pitt was ready. That was more than enough to make the difference. This team is tired of playing on the road. I just hope we can get up one more time.

"I thought we had it rolling after Ohio State and Notre Dame, but I was wrong. We need to get our heads up and be ready to play at LSU or it could be a disaster

just like Pitt.

"The season can go either way from this point. If we take the loss hard and give up, it could be a long year. If we learn something from the loss, it may be beneficial. We still have tough teams to play and if we can win those games it will be a successful year.

"LSU will be ready for us. For them, it will be a revenge game--just like last

week was for Pitt."

#### WHAT BOBBY SAYS ...

ABOUT PITT LOSS—"Pitt was the better football team. They beat us in all three phases of the game and when a team does that they sure aren't going to lose. I wasn't unhappy with the hustle of our team. The kids gave the effort, but the execution was poor."

ABOUT LSU--"They've changed their offense from split backs to the I and that concerns me. Defensively we will need to prepare for two different sets of offense. That takes away from the defensive preparation when the attention is divided two ways."

ABOUT HIS TEAM—"I'm just as concerned about how we will accept the loss as I was after the defeat at Nebraska. What really bothers me is that we're going to be traveling again. I never realized how tiring it could be to spend so much time on the road. Still I don't want to use that as an excuse or alibi. We knew going into the season this was going to be tough. The game is scheduled and we'll play it, but I sure wish we were playing at home this week."

ABOUT RICK STOCKSTILL--"Rick will be our starter against LSU. We needed to pull him against Pitt because of the situation. The game wasn't suited to Stock's style of play. He's still our No. 1 quarterback, but I don't have any regrets about pulling him last Saturday."

ABOUT FSU FUTURE—"I would think now we're out of the big bowl picture. I can't imagine a team with two losses going to a big bowl. Surely there are going to be a couple of teams left at the end of this season with just one loss. Our team still has something to play for, though. We are still in the bowl picture and can finish the season in the Top 20. FSU has never been in the final Top 20 three straight years. A finish there this year would show how far our program has come."
