THE GAME--Florida State (6-4) travels to Florida (6-4) for the final game of the 1981 season Saturday, November 28.

SITE--Florida Field (62,800), Gainesville, Fla.

KICKOFF--1:30 P.M. EST.

ATTENDANCE--The game has been sold out for months.

TELEVISION--The only live television will be shown closed circuit in the Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center. Bob Murphy will describe the play-by-play while Vic Prinzi will provide expert commentary. Tickets for the closed circuit telecast can be purchased in Tallahassee at the Civic Center.

RADIO--Florida State's largest radio network in history will send the game throughout the state plus south Georgia and south Alabama. Gene Deckerhoff describes the action with former FSU head coach Bill Peterson providing the commentary. WGLF-FM, Tallahassee, is the flagship station for the network.

Florida also has a radio network that covers the state. Veteran Otis Boggs, who has been at the microphone for more than twenty years, describes the action with former Gator linebacker Fred Abbott handling the color commentary.

LAST WEEK--Florida State and Florida were both idle. Each last played on November 14, when the Seminoles dropped a 58-14 verdict to Southern Mississippi while Florida was dumping Kentucky, 33-12.

THE SERIES--This will be the 24th meeting between the schools in a series dating back to the 1958 season when Florida won a 21-7 verdict at Gainesville. Florida enjoys a comfortable 16-6-1 series advantage, but has not won since the 1976 season. FSU has won the last four meetings. The Seminoles didn't win a game until the 1964 season when Florida already enjoyed a 5-0-1 advantage. Florida State's first victory came in the 1964 game played at Tallahassee where the Seminoles took a 16-7 decision.

THE COACHES--Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) will complete his sixth regular season at the FSU helm with the Florida game. He has guided FSU to a 50-18 record in that time and helped the Tribe achieve more national recognition than ever before. In the six year span, the Seminoles have finished twice in the Top 20 polls of both wire service polls and appeared in three post-season bowl games--1977 Tangerine and 1980 and 1981 Orange. At the conclusion of the 1980 regular season the Seminoles ranked second in both wire service polls, but later dropped to fifth after an 18-17 Orange Bowl loss to Oklahoma. This is the third major college head coaching stop for Bowden, who worked previously at Samford and West Virginia where he had a cumulative 73-32 record. His overall chart including Florida State now reads 123-50. Bowden has twice won National Coach of the Year honors--1979 ABC-TV/Chevrolet and 1980 Bobby Dodd. In two of his five years, he was the Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year. Prior to the start of the current season, Bowden ranked sixth among active coaches with a minimum 10 years as a Division I-A coach for winning percentage. The total victories was ninth among active coaches in Division I-A.

Charley Pell (Alabama '64) is finishing his third year of rebuilding the Florida football program. He has coached the Gators to a 14-18-1 record in that time. Pell previously coached at Jacksonville (Ala.) State and Clemson and started the current season with a 59-31-3 record. At the conclusion of last season both the Associated Press and United Press International honored the 40-year-old Pell by naming him SEC Coach-of-the-Year, the third time in four years of Division I coaching Pell had been so honored.

BOWDEN VS. PELL--This is the third meeting and Bowden enjoys a 2-0 advantage with wins in 1979 (27-16) and 1980 (17-13).

BOWDEN VS. FLORIDA--The trip to Florida Field will mark the sixth time Seminole mentor Bobby Bowden has served as head coach opposite Florida. Bowden enjoys a four-game win streak after losing the first game, 33-26, in 1976.

BOWDEN AT GAINESVILLE--In two previous trips to the Florida campus, Bowden has left with a win each time. The first visit was in 1977 when the Seminoles ended a nine-game Florida winning streak with a 37-9 win. In 1979, the Tribe won a 27-16 decision at Gainesville.

SEMINOLES AT GAINESVILLE--In 14 games played at Gainesville, Florida has a 10-3-1 winning advantage. The Gators were hosts for the first six games of the series and built a 5-0-1 advantage on their home field. Florida State's first win at Gainesville came in 1967, 21-16. Later victories came in 1977 and 1979.

SEMINOLES ON ROAD--Florida State will be playing its sixth road game of the season. The Seminoles now show a 3-2 log in road appearances following a five-game road swing in mid-season. FSU victories came at Ohio State (36-27), Notre Dame (19-13) and LSU (38-14). Losses were administered at Nebraska (34-14) and Pittsburgh (42-14).

GATORS AT HOME--Florida has had a perfect (5-0) showing at home this season. The Gators have beaten Furman (35-7), Georgia Tech (27-6), Maryland (15-10), Ole Miss (49-3) and Kentucky (33-12). The last Florida home loss came in the final home game of 1980 when Miami took a 31-7 verdict.

TWO STRAIGHT LOSSES--When Southern Mississippi downed the Seminoles 58-14 on November 14, it marked the first time since the 1978 season the Tribe had lost two straight. Mississippi State (55-27) and Pittsburgh (7-3) did the trick during the '78 campaign.

ABOUT THREE STRAIGHT LOSSES--One needs to go back to the '76 season to find the last time FSU lost three straight games. It happened twice that season--the first three games--and later in games six, seven and eight. Naturally those are the longest losing streaks for an FSU-Bobby Bowden coached team.

BAD SIX QUARTERS--FSU has had its problems since the second half of the Miami game on November 7. In the two quarters of the Miami contest and four more vs. Southern Mississippi, the Tribe has been outscored by a 75-20 margin. How bad is that? Well, consider the fact that 11 regular season opponents in 1980 managed just 85 points.

WHITING ENDS CAREER--Seminole fullback Michael Whiting ends his career at Florida with his name already in the career record book. The Largo, Fla., native has now rushed 346 times for 1,435 yards and 12 TDs in his career. He also has caught 72 passes for 554 yards and two TDs. The rushing yards rank seventh on the all-time Seminole career listing and Mike needs just 20 more to tie Bobby Renn for sixth place. His rushing touchdowns ranks fourth and one more would tie him for third place with Larry Key (1974-77). One more pass reception would put him at 10th place with Kent Gaydos (1969-71).

GREG JUST STARTING--Seminole freshman tailback Greg Allen has already set a freshman rushing record for FSU. Greg, who hails from Milton, Fla., has carried 126 times for 827 yards, a 6.5 yard average per carry. The yardage total ranks fifth best for a single season at FSU. Greg would need to carry for 118 yards vs. Florida to take over fourth place which is now occupied by Hodges Mitchell, who carried for 944 during the 1972 season.

AN OUTSIDE CHANCE--With an outstanding rushing effort vs. Florida, Seminole tailback Greg Allen could become the third FSU player to ever rush for 1,000 or more yards in a season. Greg would need 173 yards vs. Florida, which seems like an impossible task. However, he did run for 322 vs. Western Carolina and 202 vs. LSU this fall. The last Seminole to run for 1,000 in a season was Mark Lyles, who finished the '79 campaign with 1,011, including 151 vs. Florida in the closing game of the season.

NEW AVERAGE ATTENDANCE RECORD--Its home season completed, FSU has established a new average attendance record for Doak Campbell Stadium. The Seminoles finished the five-game home schedule with an average attendance of 51,882, almost 800 better than capacity of 51,094. The old mark of 51,628 was established during the 1980 season.

BAD STATISTIC--Florida State's defense has currently given up 251 points for the season. If Florida scores seven vs. FSU, it will equal the most points scored against FSU in 11 regular season games since the 1976 team gave up 258. Since that season, the Tribe has not given up more than 208 in 11 regular season games.

PRODUCTION DOWN--Contributing to the FSU problem this season has been a lack of scoring (in comparison with previous seasons). It appears that this year for the first time since 1976 FSU will not score 300 or more points during the regular season. The Tribe goes to Florida with 237 points and in each of the last four seasons FSU has scored 312 or more. Bobby Bowden's first team tallied just 205 compared to a 258 total for the opposition.

BAD MEMORIES--The 58-14 loss administered FSU by Southern Mississippi on November 14, was the third worst defeat ever for the Seminoles. Only the 49-0 loss to Florida in 1973 and 47-0 defeat to Miami (Fla.) in 1976 were worse. The 58 points were the most ever scored against FSU, replacing the 57 by Auburn at the close of the 1960 season.



WHAT THE PLAYERS ARE SAYING...

DEFENSIVE TACKLE GARRY FUTCH--"The last three weeks we haven't had a good showing. It's time for the seniors to get the team ready. I don't want to lose my last game, and I especially don't want to lose it to Florida.

"Since this game is against Florida--it's important. The possible bowl bid should not concern us. We can't count on the bowl, but we can count on Florida being ready.

"Florida is a good football team and we'll have to play our best to beat them.

"Against Southern Mississippi the situation was right for a let-down. We had beaten them four straight years and they were looking for national recognition and we were down. This week we can't let any outside factors influence the way we play.

"The Florida game is like nothing else. Most of our players are from Florida or Georgia and the outcome of this game influences how we are treated in our hometowns for the next year."

FULLBACK MICHAEL WHITING--"We've got a lot to prove. Our record doesn't show what type of team we have. We just haven't been playing up to par. A win here means we have a successful year.

"I've never lost to Florida and I don't want to start. A win this time would be the fifth straight for FSU and I want to keep the tradition going.

"Playing Florida is enough--the bowl is certainly nice, but it's secondary. A bowl would give us the opportunity to show people who haven't seen us play that we're a lot better than we showed last week.

"I know Florida has a good defense. They are quick and strong and I know they're excited about playing FSU and the bowl possibility.

"This team has the ability to come back. There should be no problem for the coaches motivating us to play Florida."

WIDE RECEIVER DENNIS MCKINNON--"This team has the ability to bounce back, but the big question is will we do it? We are not used to losing and I don't believe any of us have enjoyed what has happened in the last two weeks.

"I played against a lot of the Florida players in high school. I know they are very capable of beating any team in the country, not just Florida State. Our tough work is ahead of us in the next week.

"Our offense must open up more and take advantage of the opportunities we are given.

"It would never seem right for us to lose and send Florida to a bowl game. Everybody must pitch in and get this team ready. It doesn't matter if you're a freshman, sophomore, junior or senior. Getting Florida State ready this week is the responsibility of everyone associated with this football team. Our excitement must come from within."

QUARTERBACK RICK STOCKSTILL--"This will be the fifth Florida game where I've dressed out and in the previous four I haven't lost. I want to keep the streak going. Beating Florida would make this a successful season.

"We won't need an incentive (Peach Bowl) to get ready for this game. The bowl opportunity will be the last thing I'll think about.

"I've been involved in games where we've beaten Nebraska, Pitt, Ohio State and Notre Dame, but it will be the last one that I played in I'll always remember the most. I don't want that last game to be a loss.

"We've come back before after a loss, but this will be harder. Most of the players on this team had never lost two straight before. The pressure is on the seniors to take charge. Last week we just weren't ready and everyone knows what happened. This game we need to have leadership from the seniors to guarantee nothing will go wrong."

PLAYERS TO WATCH...

FLORIDA STATE

P ROHN STARK--(No. 3, 6-3, 195, Sr., Fifty Lakes, Mn.)--this will be the final regular season game for Rohn, who has been the Tribe's punter for four seasons...during that time he has kicked 238 times for 10,089 yards, a 42.39 yard average...each of those figures are school records and he also has the individual single season (45.2 in 1980) and game (51.1 vs. Nebraska this season) marks...a candidate for All-American...made several A-A teams last season...two sport athlete for Seminoles, he also competes in track and field...has been nominated for Academic All-American...married since coming to FSU...an amateur pilot.

QB RICK STOCKSTILL--(No. 11, 6-1, 185, Sr., Fernandina Beach, Fla.)--since he became the starting quarterback in the first game of '80 campaign, FSU has gone 16-6...as a junior he took the Tribe to a 10-2 mark and second consecutive Orange Bowl...Tribe also finished the '80 campaign ranked fifth and was once as high as second in both wire service polls...enters final regular season game of career with 245 completions in 432 attempts for 2,779 yards and 26 TDs...19 of his passes have been intercepted...on Seminole career listings he ranks ninth in completions, sixth for yards and fifth for TD passes...his total offense of 2,558 is ninth best...set career marks this season for completions (25) and yards (299) vs. Ohio State.

CB JAMES HARRIS--(No. 33, 6-0, 185, Sr., Gainesville, Fla.)--completing his second regular season as starting cornerback for the Tribe...when FSU visits Gainesville he'll be playing in his hometown...the only veteran in the Tribe secondary this season, he has had to tutor on the field...FSU press corps has called him the Tribe's "resident philosopher"...enters the Florida game with 34 solo and 21 assisted tackles...that includes three tackles for loss and three quarterback sacks...one of five Seminole co-captains for '81.

FLORIDA

QB WAYNE PEACE--(No. 15, 6-2, 220, So., Lakeland, Fla.)--completing passes this season at a .579 percentage with 139 completions in 240 attempts...completions have gone for 1,528 yards and seven scores...11 of his tosses have been intercepted...was the Freshman All-American QB last season for Blue Chip magazine.

LB WILBER MARSHALL--(No. 88, 6-1, 233, So., Titusville, Fla.)--leads Gators in tackles this season with 117, including 75 solo and 42 assists...16 of those tackles have been for loss and he has 11 quarterback sacks while recovering four opposition fumbles...began his Florida career as a tight end but has found home at linebacker...hails from same high school that gave FSU Scott Warren, a four-year starter who graduated in 1979...has outstanding speed, 4.6 in 40.

WHAT BOBBY SAYS...

ABOUT TWO STRAIGHT LOSSES--"We've got a very tired football team, one that has been through more than any other team in the country this season. They've responded well, but I think the two consecutive defeats were the culmination of a lot of little things. This team wasn't able to rest from the day it arrived in August and in the last two games it caught up with us, especially against Southern Mississippi. I should have realized that we were working the boys too hard and slacked off some. Don't blame the boys for the losses, blame me. The boys gave everything they had."

ABOUT 6-4 RECORD--"When you consider everything that has happened to us this season, 6-4 right now isn't so bad. But it's amazing how it has happened. I wouldn't have thought we would lose two of the four at home and didn't expect us to have the success we've enjoyed this year on the road."

ABOUT FLORIDA--"We'll be meeting a football team that right now appears to be playing its best football of the season. They gave Georgia everything they had and nearly pulled out the victory. Now, look where Georgia is in the polls.

"Florida is peaking at a time that isn't good for us. Their defense is outstanding, one of the best in the country and offensively they do many things well. Our defense will have a very tough time preparing for Florida because those Gators do so many things well."

ABOUT WAYNE PEACE, GATOR QUARTERBACK--"He's another in a long line of outstanding quarterbacks we've had to go up against this year. Wayne ranks right up there with Art Schlichter, Dan Marino and Reggie Collier of Southern Mississippi. The others had a good national reputation when we played them. Wayne hasn't gotten the national reputation yet because he's just a sophomore, but we know he's good and so does everyone else in the southeast. Heck we tried to recruit him for Florida State so that should immediately tell you what we think of him."

ABOUT KICKING GAME--"Florida's kicking game is outstanding and we think that ours is not bad either, although we've had plenty of mistakes there lately. I would hope we can get everything corrected before we go to Florida. They will certainly test us there because they know from watching film we've had our problems. Brian Clark, the field goal kicker for Florida, is as good as they come. Every time they cross the 50-yard line it puts them in scoring range with his leg."

ABOUT IMPORTANCE OF FLORIDA GAME--"There is not another game like it on our schedule. There were a lot of important games on our schedule this season, but none of them match this one. We've had things nice for the last four years because we've been able to win, but that can all change if Florida beats us. Remember that this one is for braggin' rights for the next year. The impact of the Florida-Florida State game can't be measured. It has a lasting effect on the football programs at both schools for an entire year, until the next time we play. I've enjoyed our success of the last four years but it won't last if we can't beat the Gators."
