# 2000 NOKIA SUGAR BOWL GAME FIRST-HALF NOTES

Tonight's game is the latest the Sugar Bowl has been played. On eight occasions, the Sugar Bowl was played on January 2, the last time being three years ago when Florida State lost to Florida, 52-20. The 2001 Sugar Bowl game will be played on January 2.

For the 11<sup>th</sup> time in the last 12 Sugar Bowl games, a team from either Virginia or Florida was a participant. Virginia played Tennessee in 1991 and Virginia Tech played Texas on New Year's Eve 1995. Florida State played Auburn in 1989, Florida on New Year's Day 1995 and 1997 and Ohio State in 1998. Miami played Alabama in 1990 and 1993. Besides its two games against Florida State, Florida played Notre Dame in 1992 and West Virginia in 1994. Last year's game between Ohio State and Texas A&M was the first Sugar Bowl game which did not involve a school from Virginia or Florida since Auburn played Syracuse in 1988.

Tonight's game is the fourth Sugar Bowl matching the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked teams in the country. In the three previous such matchups, the second-ranked team won each time. Alabama defeated Penn State, 14-7, in 1979. Penn State defeated Georgia, 27-23, in 1983. Alabama defeated Miami (Fla.), 34-13, in 1993.

Florida State's Chris Weinke's 64-yard touchdown pass to Peter Warrick in the first quarter was the first touchdown pass of more than 50 yards in a Sugar Bowl game since Florida's Danny Wuerffel combined with Ike Hilliard for an 82-yard scoring pass against Florida State in 1995.

Florida State's Jeff Chaney's return of a blocked punt for a touchdown in the first quarter was the first touchdown following a blocked punt in a Sugar Bowl game since Syracuse's Brad Clarke returned a blocked punt 28 yards for a touchdown against LSU in 1965.

Florida State's Peter Warrick's 59-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter was the first punt return for a touchdown in a Sugar Bowl game since Virginia Tech's Bryan Still returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown against Texas on New Year's Eve 1995.

The last time a team scored at least 28 points in a half of a Sugar Bowl game was 1997 when Florida scored 28 points in the second half against Florida State. The Sugar Bowl game record for points in a half is 32 by Notre Dame in the second half against Florida in 1992. The Sugar Bowl game record for points in the first half is 31 by Oklahoma against Auburn in 1972.

Peter Warrick's 64-yard TD is the longest of the season for the senior wide receiver. His regular-season long was 59 yards vs. Georgia Tech. His career long is an 80-yarder in the 1997 season at Clemson.

## THE LAST TIME IT HAPPENED

Tommy Polley's blocked punt in the first quarter marked FSU's fifth blocked punt of the season. The last time FSU blocked a punt was by Tommy Polley vs. Florida this season. The last time FSU recovered a blocked punt for a TD was in 1997 by Derrick Gibson vs. Duke.

# GETTIN' IN THE GAME

Florida State played a total of 54 players in the first quarter.

## **NOTHING NEW**

Peter Warrick's 59-yard punt return for a TD in the second quarter was his second of the season. His first was a 75-yarder in the North Carolina game. It's also the third of his career. He returned a punt 90 yards vs. Clemson in 1997 -- the second longest in FSU history.

## FIRST HALF SCORING

FSU's 28 first-half points marks the fifth time this season that the Tribe has scored 28 or more points in the first half. Against Duke, FSU scored 44 of its 51 total points in the first half.

The 28-points also ties the most points FSU has scored in the first half of a bowl game. The last time FSU scored 28 in the first half of a bowl game was in the 1971 Fiesta Bowl when the Seminoles defeated Arizona State 45-38.

# Joe Theismann

Joe Theismann knows football. He was the winning quarterback in Super Bowl XVII, a two-time Pro Bowl player and the most productive quarterback in the history of the Washington Redskins. Since his retirement as a player, he has built a national reputation as an expert analyst on the game for ESPN. He joined ESPN in 1988 as a color analyst of all Sunday night nationally televised NFL games, and he is a co-host of ESPN's popular "NFL Countdown," and "Primetime."

As a player, Mr. Theismann played in 163 consecutive games for the Redskins and heads the team's list of quarterbacks with a total of 25, 206 yards passing 2,044 completions and 3,331 attempts. He left the Redskins due to a badly broken leg sustained midway through the 1985 NFL season.

His 12-year NFL career was highlighted by many outstanding performances, especially his leadership of the Redskins to a 27-17 victory over the Miami Dolphins in Super Bowl XVII. In 1982, he was honored as NFL's Man of the Year for his work in community service. In 1983, he was voted as Most Valuable Player of the NFL as well as Most Valuable Player of the Pro Bowl.

Mr. Theismann was drafted by the Miami Dolphins and Major League Baseball's Minnesota Twins in 1971, but elected to play for the Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League. The Redskins acquired him in 1974 and he spent his first two years with the Redskins as a punt returner. He became the Redskins starting quarterback in 1978.

The native of South River, New Jersey is a 1971 graduate of the University of Notre Dame where he won All-American honors on the field as well as in the classroom (sociology major). He led the Fighting Irish to back to back Cotton Bowls and was runner-up to Jim Plunkett in the Heisman Trophy balloting in his senior year.

In May 1990, he was inducted into the GTE Academic All-American Hall of Fame and joins such luminaries as Representative Tom McMillen and General Pete Dawkins. Mr. Theismann lends a great amount of time to a long list of charitable causes, many of which are concerned with the health and welfare of children. His depth of understanding stress management and his understanding of teamwork and dedication to the job have made him one of the nation's foremost motivational lecturers. Mr. Theismann's book *The Idiots Guide to Understanding Football like a Pro* is a layman's guide to understanding the intricacies of the game and was published in July 1997. In 1998, he won the Bert Bell Memorial Award, which honors individuals who have contributed significantly to the success of the National Football League.

# Robert W. Moderhak, II

Robert W. Mcderhak, II will have an opportunity to begin the new millennium as a millionaire when he take the field with Joe Theismann, legendary football star, at the Nokia Sugar Bowl 2000 National Championship Game in New Orleans on January 4, 2000.

Moderhak, 54 recently retired after a 30-year career in education, and moved from Longmont, Colorado to Holmes Beach, Florida in August 1999. For five years prior to his retirement, Moderhak ser red as the assistant superintendent for the St. Vrain Valley, Colorado School System. He came to the St. Vrain Valley schools in 1979 as an administrator, and during his 20-year tenure served as a junior high principal, middle school principal and high school principal before becoming assistant superintendent in 1994.

Moderhak's a reer was highlighted by several prestigious awards, and was most recently named "1999 St. Vrain Valley Administrator of the Year Award" before his retirement. Some of his other recognitions ir clude the "Colorado Outstanding Administrator of the Year Award" from the Colorado Education Media Association and the "St. Vrain Valley School District Administrator of the Year Award" in 1989. From 1992-1995, Moderhak served on the U.S. Department of Education Review Committee on Teacher Training and Middle Level Education.

Moderhak enjt ys traveling and playing tennis. He and his wife Sue, a retired math teacher, have four children and two grandchildren, all of whom live in Colorado.
