GAME NOTES

- Miller-Digby Award winner Musa Smith is the second MOP in the last five Sugar Bowls to win the Miller-Digby Award without accounting for a single point. In 1999, Ohio State's David Boston caught 11 passes for 105 yards to earn MOP honors, but did not score in the Buckeyes' 24-14 victory over Texas A&M.
- Smith is the 18th running back to win the Miller-Digby Award, but the first since Florida State's Warrick Dunn in January of 1995. Breakdown by position: quarterback, 27 times; running backs, 18 times; receivers, seven times; guard, once; linebacker, once; tackle, once; kicker, once.
- Georgia K Billy Bennett became the third player to make four or more field goals in a game. Arden Czyzewski of Florida hit five in 1992 vs. Notre Dame, while Alabama's Tim Davis nailed four against Ole Miss in 1964.
- Both teams moved up the ladder in Sugar Bowl team appearances. Georgia made its seventh appearance, tying the Bulldogs with SEC East foes Florida and Tennessee for fourth all-time, while FSU moved into sole possession of seventh place with six trips. Alabama leads in all-time Sugar Bowl appearances with 12, followed by LSU (11) and Ole Miss (8).
- All six of Florida State's Sugar Bowl games have been played in the Superdome, breaking a tie with Alabama for most Sugar Bowl appearances in the Superdome. Ole Miss and LSU each played in eight Sugar Bowls at Tulane Stadium (1935-74) to share the record at the old facility.
- Georgia was the first team to enter the Sugar Bowl with 12 victories, and with its victory, thus becomes the first team to finish with 13 victories after playing in the Sugar Bowl.
- Florida State became the first team to play in the Sugar Bowl with four losses. The Seminoles' .692 winning percentage (9-4) entering the game is the third lowest in the 68-year history of the game. Two teams entered the Sugar Bowl with 6-3-1 records (.667 winning percentage): Texas in 1958 (lost to Ole Miss, 39-7) and LSU in 1968 (defeated Wyoming, 20-13).
- The 71-yard interception return by Georgia's Bruce Thornton was the first interception return for a touchdown since Florida's Lawrence Wright scored on a 52-yard return against West Virginia in 1994. It was also the first defensive touchdown in a Sugar Bowl since Virginia Tech's Jim Barron returned a Texas fumble 20 yards for a touchdown in December of 1995.
- For the 19th consecutive Sugar Bowl, both teams scored at least one touchdown. The last time a team failed to crack the end zone was in 1984, when Auburn used three field goals to upend Michigan, 9-7.
- For the eighth consecutive game, the margin of victory was 10 points or greater, and the last Sugar Bowl decided by single figures was in January of 1995, when Florida State beat Florida, 23-17.
- Tonight's crowd of 74,269 marks just the fifth time in the 28 years the Sugar Bowl has been played in the Superdome that attendance has failed to reach 75,000. The other games were in 1975, December of 1995, 1998 and 2001.

- Current ACC teams are now 11-6 in the Sugar Bowl, but only Florida State (1995, '96, '97, '98, 2000 and '02) and Virginia (1991) have played in the Big Easy under ACC auspices. FSU's first appearance in 1989 vs. Auburn came when the Seminoles were still an independent, all four of Georgia Tech's appearances (1944, '53, '54, '56) came when the Yellow Jackets were in the SEC, while North Carolina (1947) and Maryland (1952) both made appearances before the ACC was formed in 1953.
- Georgia's victory gives the SEC consecutive wins in the Sugar Bowl for the first time since 1993-94, when Alabama defeated Miami and Florida defeated West Virginia.
- For the third consecutive year, a coach making his first Sugar Bowl appearance guided his team to victory, as Georgia's Mark Richt joined Miami's Butch Davis (2001) and LSU's Nick Saban (2002).
- Georgia's victory improved **current** Southeastern Conference members to an even .500 in the Sugar Bowl at 28-28-1. It should be noted that Georgia Tech (4-0) and Tulane (1-1) were members of the SEC at the time of their Sugar Bowl appearances, while all five of Arkansas' (1-4) trips came when the Razorbacks were in the Southwest Conference.
- SEC teams are 2-1 in the Sugar Bowl under the Bowl Championship Series format, with Florida losing to Miami in 2001 and LSU defeating Illinois in 2002.
- For the second consecutive year, an SEC team broke a 20-year or more drought in the Sugar Bowl. Georgia's last Sugar Bowl victory came over Notre Dame in 1981, and last year, LSU broke a 34-year Sugar Bowl dry spell by beating Illinois.
- Each of Georgia's three Sugar Bowl victories has come under a different coach. Wally Butts led the Bulldogs past North Carolina in 1947, Vince Dooley captured the national championship by leading UGA past Notre Dame in 1981, and Mark Richt engineered tonight's victory over FSU.
- Georgia joined LSU and Tennessee as the only schools to have three coaches lead their schools to Sugar Bowl victories. LSU has won under Paul Dietzel, Charles McClendon (twice) and Nick Saban, while the Volunteers have been victorious under John Barnhill, Bill Battle and Johnny Majors (twice).

- At 13-1, Georgia set a school record with its 13th win this year, the old mark was 12 set by the 1980 national championship squad that went 12-0, capped by a 17-10 win over Notre Dame here in the Sugar Bowl.
- Georgia is now 4-6 in domed stadiums including 2-3 in the Louisiana Superdome.
- The Bulldogs are 3-4 in the Sugar Bowl.
- Georgia leads the series with FSU 6-4-1 with tonight's win the first in the series since 1959. Prior to tonight, FSU had won four of the last five with one tie (1984 Citrus Bowl).
- Georgia is now 20-15-3 in bowl games.
- Junior RB Musa Smith, named the Sugar Bowl's Most Outstanding Player, had 23 rushes for 145 yards. It was his 9th game of at least 100 yards rushing.
- He finished the season with 1,324 yards, which ranks 5th in school history.
- He played in 13 games, missing the Kentucky game due to a broken thumb. He went over a 100 yards in six of his last seven games played this year.
- AS MOP, Smith joins fellow Bulldogs honored in the Sugar Bowl including Herschel Walker (1981 MVP) and All-Sugar Bowl team Joe Tereshinski and Charley Trippi (1947).
- Junior CB Bruce Thornton had a 71-yard INT return for a TD. It was his 2nd TD this season. He also had a 12-yard return off a blocked punt vs. Northwestern State. It was Thornton's 2nd INT this year.
- A converted RB, Thornton moved to defense in 2001. He scored 3 TDs as a freshman in 2000.
- Georgia's defense has four INT returns for TDs this year.
- Thornton's 71-yard INT return for a TD was the 2nd longest in Georgia bowl history. Gary Moss had an 81-yarder for a TD in the 1986 Hall of Fame Bowl vs. Boston College.
- Senior SE Terrence Edwards added another record tonight, setting the mark for most receiving Yards with 1,004. He set the mark on the 37-yard TD catch in the second quarter.
- Edwards owns the SEC record for Career Receiving Yards (3,093) and five Georgia career marks including receptions (204), receiving yards (3,093), TD receptions (30) and 100-yard receiving games (10).
- Junior PK Billy Bennett set the school record for most points scored in a season, field goals attempted and made in a season. Bennett scored 130 points. He was 26-for-33 this year.
- The previous Georgia mark was 126 by Garrison Hearst (RB) in 1992.
- Bennett's 14 points kicking is a Georgia bowl record and the 4 field goals ties team bowl record (also Virginia in 1995 Peach Bowl).

- Georgia's scoring defense came into the game ranked 4th nationally, allowing just 15.3 points a game, and the Bulldogs held FSU to 13 points. Georgia's defense surrendered just 23 points over its final three games.
- Only once in 14 games this season did Georgia's defense surrender any points on an opponent's opening drive. Ole Miss scored a TD while the Bulldog defense forced 8 punts, two interceptions, blocked a field goal, had a team miss a field goal and tonight Fla. State turned it over on downs.
- Tonight, Georgia scored for the 7th time on its opening possession, getting a 23-yard field goal by Billy Bennett.
- Junior rover Kentrell Curry notched his team-leading fourth interception. It led to a missed field goal of 47 yards.
- Senior offensive linemen Kevin Breedlove made his school-record 47th career start out of a possible 50 games (bowls included) while Jon Stinchcomb made his 46th. The 47 starts is the most by a Bulldog not including kickers and second overall with kickers included (PK Kevin Butler started 48 from 1981-84).

LE-ON ME

Freshman tailback Leon Washington is having a major impact in the second half of the 2002 season. On top of returning punts and kicks, the Jacksonville native has seen his role in the running game increase dramatically due to injuries and he has taken advantage of his opportunities. In the first 10 games of the year Washington carried the ball seven times for 23 yards. In the last four games he has rushed 53 times 250 yards including 10 carries for 28 yards tonight.

DOING IT ALL

Junior Anquan Boldin had an amazing 2003 Sugar Bowl. The wide receiver/quarterback threw for a touchdown, caught a touchdown and amassed 151 of FSU's 267 total yards, which is 57% of FSU's total offense. He is the first Seminole to throw a TD pass and catch a TD pass in the same game since Peter Warrick did it versus Duke in 1999. He led the team in both passing and receiving and barring a late sack he would have led the team in rushing also.

DATING BACK TO 1999

Anquan Boldin is also the only Florida State player who caught a pass in every game this year and he is the first Seminole to ever catch a pass in 14 straight games in one season. He now has a reception in 27 consecutive games and will have a chance to eclipse E.G. Green's record of 38 straight games with a catch next season.

PASS DEFENSE ONCE AGAIN SHINES

The Florida State secondary has been making great strides throughout the 2002 season and their effort in the 2003 Sugar Bowl was the groups best of the year. The 125 passing yards they allowed to Georgia were the fewest they allowed to any opponent this season. The previous record was 146 yards allowed versus Wake Forest. It was also UGA's second lowest passing output of the year (the Bulldogs worst day through the air came in their season opener when they passed for 115 yards versus Clemson). With FSU's entire secondary slated to return in 2003, there is reason to be excited in the Seminole Nation.

TIME IS ON OUR SIDE

Despite holding on to the ball for almost 10 more minutes than Georgia, FSU lost the 2003-Nokia Sugar Bowl. The last time the Seminoles had an edge in time of possession but still lost the game was against No. 1 Miami when the Tribe held an eight minute edge in TOP.

BOLD MOVE

It didn't take wide receiver Anquan Boldin long to become just the ninth receiver in Florida State history to surpass 1,000 receiving yards in a single season. Boldin hauled in a 20-yard pass on the Seminoles' opening drive and then a nine-yarder to start the second quarter giving him 1,006 on the year. The junior split end finished the year with 1,011 yards. Current Kansas City Chief Snoop Minnis was the last Seminole to go over 1,000 yards before tonight's Sugar Bowl. He hauled in 63 passes for 1,340 yards in 2000, which stands as the second-most receiving yards by an FSU receiver in Seminole history.

IT HAS HAPPENED MORE THAN YOU THINK

Fabian Walker is the second Florida State QB to make the first start of their career this season (the other was Adrian McPherson versus Wake Forest). This is the fifth time since 1985 that FSU has had two QB's make their first career start in the same season. In 1985 Danny McManus and Chip Ferguson both made their first collegiate starts. Brad Johnson and Casey Weldon did it in 1990, Thad Busby and Dan Kendra in 1996 and Chris Weinke and Marcus Outzen did it in 1998.

An Interview With:

GEORGIA BULLDOGS

MUSA SMITH: I thought it was a real good game, and everybody played hard, and hats off to **Florida State**. It was just a real good game, that's all I have to say.

COACH RICHT: Just, again, real thankful for everybody who made this thing happen. We've got a great coaching staff, great players. We just came together.

When a defense like ours is playing as good as they are and the kicking game is so solid, it can get kind of boring, but winning is fun. I'm just proud of what everybody did, and you get a great defense, and you get a great kicking game and a running back like **Musa Smith**, we're going to win a lot of ballgames if you don't mess it up.

Q. Can you talk about playing --

COACH RICHT: First of all, **Coach Bowden** is still the teacher, that's for sure. I like spending time with him. I like being next to him. He's just one of the best men I've ever known, and we had to play against him. So no matter who you play, you want to win the game. You know, of course, I wasn't real comfortable until the very end, because, you know, one long pass, on-side kick and a **Hail Mary**, and we lose the thing.

So, it was a great ballgame to the very end, but it was just good to see **Coach Bowden** again.

Q. Do you feel that touchdown swung everything back in your favor?

COACH RICHT: Oh, that interception was huge for a touchdown. We got an interception earlier and got nothing out of it. We got three and out and missed the field goal. I didn't like the celebration too much, although I don't blame him for wanting to celebrate, but that could have cost us a point here. You never know what can happen in a ballgame like that. When **Bennett** drilled it through, it worked out for us.

Q. Did you attack positions with him --

COACH RICHT: You know, **DJ**, he made a great play but he fumbled. You know, I just want to make sure he knew I believed in him, which I do,

and I believe that with **Tim** in the game, we have a much better chance of them playing some single coverage because he is a running threat. - So I knew I wanted to go deep and I felt like if **David** went in, maybe they would have played some of the zone schemes they had been playing. I felt like if **DJ** came back in, they would be more likely to play man coverage, and that was about the only time I was right throughout the game. But it worked out well.

TERRENCE EDWARDS: It was a great game. We've got to give credit to **Florida State** for stopping us in the red zone. I wished we could have scored more touchdowns, but they did a great job of stopping us. Got to give credit to this man, **Mr. Richt**, for preparing us and his coaching staff, and showing us to learn how to win. That's what the whole season was, learning how to win.

Q. Were you a big fan of the "sports break challenge" (water bucket)?

COACH RICHT: That one hurt. That was extremely cold and shocking. I don't like getting it when the game is not over yet. I don't mind if the game is the not over yet but the game wasn't over yet. I just don't feel good until it's 0:00.

Q. Inaudible?

COACH RICHT: This was just one season, this was just one glorious season for us. If you start from game one until now, there's an awful lot of close games that could have gone either way. But like **Terrence** said, I think players learn how to win. You learn how to win when you're underdogs and you learn how to win when you should win and then you start to get to where you feel like you could win every single time. I hope that we are beginning to have that kind of belief, but the bad news is, there's a lot of other great teams in our conference that feel the same way and have tremendous athletes and coaches, so we are going to have to start all over.

What happened this year; we are going to celebrate and enjoy, but when it comes to next season, it's a brand new team. We will have lost just a tremendous amount of leadership, and we're going to find out who is going to lead us next year.

spend a lot of time -- I spent two and three years with some of those guys. I care about all of the guys I've coached over the years. It's good to see them. I didn't want to do anything that would change the momentum in their favor, and so we played this pretty close to the vest and I guess I'm a lot more conservative than I thought I was, but when you've got guys playing that well, I just didn't see any reason to try to get too fancy with them.

*Q. Can you talk about **Musa's** development?*

COACH RICHT: Musa has really improved a lot. I think **Musa** is a guy who loves to do everything full speed. Even back when we started our mat-drill program, the guy was full speed, you could tell the guy was a worker and he wasn't afraid of that.

And his running style was that way. He wanted to hit it hard and fast every time, and a lot

of things that we do is more of a sprint/draw action and I think he ran up on his blockers a couple times early in his career or since I've been here. But as time went on and he had a better feel for how this thing was being blocked and he used his vision a little better, started to pick the holes better, started to break tackles better, I think he's just improved a tremendous amount. He was always a physical blocker. He always did a great job of wrapping up the football. But I think his vision as time went on was better and better, just to understand the blocking seams and he really powered through people and just made people miss as the year went on. I'm just really proud of how he developed.

*Q. Talk about your conversation with **Coach Bowden** after the game?*

COACH RICHT: Basically, it was just great game and **God** bless you. And that was about it.

He just said, "**Great** game. Congratulations."

I may see him at the coaches convention if he's there, but again, it's very good to be around **Coach Bowden**.

Q. Did you see this as an opportunity for you to have a big game?

MUSA SMITH: Yeah, I read my blocks, and plugged the receivers on the downfield, it was a great all-around game and everyone blocking, had a great game.

An Interview With:

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN

COACH BOWDEN: Well, when you get beat like that, there's not a lot of good things you'd like to say. But I will say this for our players, I thought they fought, they fought the hard way. I thought we went down fighting. Georgia's an excellent football team, an excellent-coached football team.

First half, they make a catch, we don't make the catch, and a pretty even first half. They probably made a couple of plays the second half, that won the ballgame. Our offense was not very structured, wasn't very structured. We had to do what we had to do, and it just wasn't -- it's not -- the split second timing and all that definitely wasn't there, and it's kind of like you're just hoping somebody can make some plays and we made a couple.

COACH BOWDEN: Well, it put them in the lead and probably gave them a lot of momentum. It seemed like we were working hard for our points and they got theirs easy. That's frustrating.

Again, if they were still -- if we make a catch and they don't make a catch, you've got an even ballgame, you know. But anyway, we didn't do it.

COACH BOWDEN: The tailback was very effective, because we had field position a couple of times on them, which could have been detrimental to them. They fought their way out of it with their tailback. He ran them out of there. I think they took from the five -- went to about our ten -- our defense did a great job and held them to two field goals. But that happened several times. We had a hard time stopping him.

COACH BOWDEN: Well, they did exactly what anybody would do, and that's blitz a new quarterback. They blitzed our quarterback and we simply, again, could not get anything going with that. We had to -- his hands were tied so bad there, and they blitzed nearly every down. It ain't like they blitzed every now and then. They blitzed

nearly every down. When you blitz like that, you not only get to the passer, but you stop the running game. You hope you can hit something because if you hit something you might get something big, but we couldn't do it.

COACH BOWDEN: My impression of Anquan? I thought it was pretty darned good for the first time he played quarterback since high school. And there are so many things that can occur in a game that he was faced with that cost us a penalty or something like that, because there's simply no way we could get him ready working part-time like we did, trying to work him as a receiver and quarterback. I thought he did an excellent job under the circumstances.

COACH BOWDEN: Well, we were hoping. I told Bob Griese and them before the game, the best thing that could happen to us would be if Fabian could start and finish the game and that way we could use Anquan as a wide-out and that would mean that Fabian was doing pretty good. Because once we got down to Anquan, then that really was all the quarterback we had left, we could have used Matt Henshaw some, but it would have been more of a handing off stage. I thought Anquan did an excellent job under the circumstances.

COACH BOWDEN: Fabian? Well, Fabian, he would have been real good, I thought we saw that. I think that we saw that if we could protect him, he could produce and guess what we saw -- and I think Georgia saw that, too. So therefore, they decided to come with pressure, pressure, pressure; and they never let up and we couldn't -- we couldn't handle it. We could not handle it.

COACH BOWDEN: No, he played some more after that. He might have gotten hurt, but he played some more after that.

COACH BOWDEN: Now, you're saying, would I try to use Anquan at quarterback next year? I don't want to. I don't want to. You know, we had another quarterback tonight that could
