Grover's Gorillas Engineer Initial 6-5 Winning Season

The Florida State Seminoles are riding high, but another FSU football team barely came out on the winning side in its initial season.

"Grover's Gorillas", FSU's official entry into the Tallahassee City Football League, eked out a 6-5-1 record for its first season. Officially designated "EGS", the team was composed of 15 engineering science grad students and a faculty member, Dr. John Sheldon.

On the FSU 5-mile course Ken Misner put down a first place time of 22:09.6. He was followed by Bob Thomas with a time of 22:21. Georgia Tech placed men third and fourth but were followed by a barrage of Seminole runners.

Coach Long feels that Florida is the team to beat tomorrow but he is also sure that the top runners from South Florida will have an effect on the final standings of both FSU and Florida.

"The South Florida places could either hurt or help us, right now there's no way to tell which," said Long. "The most we can hope for is that everyone will be at his best for just this one time."
