

Seminoles Lead Pensacola Golf Meet With 290

PENSACOLA, Apr. 28 — The Florida State University Seminoles jumped off to an early lead in the 54-hole medal play tournament here with an aggregate score of 290—four strokes ahead of the runnerup Naval air station team.

The Seminoles, who will play 18 holes tomorrow morning and another 18 tomorrow afternoon in the windup of the event, were paced today by Eddie Johnson, former Florida State high school golf champion.

Johnson carded a 69, followed by Bud Marsee and Dick Montney with 73's. Ted Hewitt fired a 75 to round out the FSU scoring.

The Pensacola Country club was third with a 223 and Osceola Country club was fourth with a 228.

Johnson was the low medalist with his 69. Ed Peck of the Navy was second with a 70, and Marsee and Montney were tied for third place as the meet moved into its second and final day.

FSU Golfers Cop 54-Hole Tourney Title

PENSACOLA — Florida State University's strong Seminole golf team won the 54-hole invitational team and individual titles here yesterday.

Coach Bob Harbison's college crew turned in an 883 total to beat the Pensacola Country club team by 30 strokes. The Country club squad had a 913, Pensacola Naval Air Station was third with 923 and Osceola Country club fourth with 974.

Eddie Johnson paced the Seminoles to their triumph in grabbing the individual crown. The former Florida state high school champion fired a 75-74 yesterday for a 54-hole total of 218. He had turned in a sizzling 69 when play opened Saturday.

Johnson's teammate, Ted Hewitt was second with 220. Hewitt had a 70-75 yesterday after firing a 75 in the opening round.

A third Indian shotmaker, Dick Montney, tied for third place with Ed Peck of the Navy at 221. Montney had a 77-71 that he put with his opening 73.

Bud Marsee rounded out the Seminole scoring with an 80-71 for a 224 total. Marsee also fired a 73 opening day when FSU jumped out in front.
