OCALA, March 18 — Florida State came from five strokes behind here today to win the state intercollegiate golf title by 11, but the Seminoles' Edwin Jenkins lost a sudden-death playoff to Rollins' Frank Boynton in individual competition.

Ending a three-year domination of the tournament by Florida, FSU scored 1,158 in the 72-hole tourney. Miami, which held a five-stroke margin going into today's final 18 holes, fell to third with 1,173. Florida was second at 1,171.

Boydton and Jenkins batted par-

kins a 60 in the windup round. He
at 281 over the 18-hole
Ocala Municipal course.

Going into the match play on the holes, they each made good recovery shots as they went through the first five. Penick missed a wedge shot out of the water at the edge of the hole at six. On the sixth green, both players missed a back-swing shot at the hole and walked away.
