OCALA—Bidding for a third straight team championship, Florida State moved three strokes ahead of the field in the opening round of the 11th Florida Intercollegiate golf tournament here yesterday.

Thanks to sub-par rounds by sophomore Dick Hanscom and junior Wayne Timberman, the Seminoles carded an opening-day team total of 290. Hanscom and Timberman shared medal honors with Florida's William Parslow. The three led a field of 49 with one-under-par 70s for the 6,430-yard Ocala Country Club course.

After FSU's team total came Florida's No. 1 team (293), Rollins (297), Miami No. 1 (301), Miami No. 2 (308), Stetson and Florida Southern (310), and Florida No. 2 last at 323.

Six golfers trailed the three leaders with one-over-par 72s. They were FSU's Don Torppa; Tom Aaron, Skip Stigger, and

Pete Trenham of Florida; Lee Raymond of Miami, and Bob Ross of Rollins. Bob Shave of FSU and Dick Guardiola of Miami had 73 each.

The second and third rounds—36 holes—are set for today with the final round tomorrow. The 72-hole medal scores determine both individual and team titles.

FSU freshman Dickie Dunlap of Pensacola matched the leaders' score of 70, but is not eligible for the varsity title. A four-man Baby Seminole team is competing for frosh laurels.

Ocala—Veteran Bob Shave of St. Petersburg was Florida State's primary hope for individual honors as the Florida Intercollegiate golf tournament moved into the final round here today.

After yesterday's 36 holes, Shave trailed Florida's Tom Aaron by two strokes and Lee Raymond of Miami by one. Shave put together rounds of 68 and 76 yesterday to go with an opening-round 73 for a 217 total. Aaron had 215 and Raymond 216.

Florida State's team, first-round leaders by three strokes, fell 11 strokes behind Florida's No. 1 team yesterday. Florida had a total of 880, FSU 891.

In addition to Aaron's 215, Florida's Skip Stigger had 219, Pete Trenham and Willie Turner 222 each. Florida State's team included Shave (217), Dick Hanscomb (222), Mel Fleischer (226) and Dave Morris (226).

Hanscomb, first-day leader at 70 along with FSU's Wayne Timberman, fell to 222. Hanscomb, competing only for the individual title, also had 222.

Ocala, March 8 (AP)—The University of Florida's No. 1 team won the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Championship today with a score of 1,166 in the 4-day 72-hole tournament.

Florida also copped top individual honors when Tommy Aaron, junior from Gainesville, Ga., and Southeastern Conference champion finished with a 282, two strokes under par for the four rounds over the 6,430-yard par 71 Ocala Country Club course.

In taking the team title, Florida dethroned Florida State University which won in 1956 and 1957.

Lee Raymond of the University of Miami, took second place with 283. In third place was Bob Shave of FSU with 285. Joe Hamby of Florida Southern was fourth with 290.

Florida State finished second in team play with 1,173. Miami's No. 1 team was third with 1,180. Other team scores:

Rollins 1,185; Florida Southern 1,225; Florida No. 2, 1,259; Miami No. 2, 1,261; Stetson 1,274.

Fresh from their runner-up role in the state intercollegiate tournament at Ocala last week, Florida State's golfers open a three match run at Tallahassee Country Club tomorrow.

Coach Bill Odeneal's Seminoles face Jacksonville Navy here Tuesday, Pensacola Navy Friday, and Rollins Saturday.

State's Bob Shave of St. Petersburg carded a final-round 68 at Ocala Saturday to finish third in a close duel for individual honors in the 72-hole state tournament. Florida's Tom Aaron had a 282 for 72 holes, Miami's Lee Raymond 283, and Shave 285.

Other FSU scores: Mel Fleischer and Wayne Timberman (295), Dick Hanscom (296), Dave Morris (297), Don Torppa (301), Rem Noble (303).

Florida State freshman Dickie Dunlap of Pensacola was medalist in the freshman division with a 289 total. Dunlap also outdistanced the varsity competitors in a long-drive contest, blasting a tee shot 306 yards uphill.
