

Cannon Leads LSU Past FSU Track Team, 85-60

Seminole Golfers Tie; Net Team Falls In Rain-Soaked Baton Rouge

BATON ROUGE — All-America football halfback Billy Cannon and Ralph Fabian each accounted for 13 points as Louisiana State's defending Southeastern Conference champions scored an 85-60 track victory over Florida State here yesterday.

In other spring sports clashes, FSU's golfers tied the Tigers, 13½-13½, in a rain-splattered dual match and LSU's tennis team grabbed a rain-delayed 5½-3½ verdict over Seminole netters.

Some 2,500 fans turned out for the track showdown despite a heavy rain that began early Saturday morning and didn't let up until 2 p.m.

The early-season favorite to take its third straight SEC land, vice chairman of the 7th its own faithful with the 25-point victory over Coach Mike Long's Seminoles. It was the first dual setback for FSU's thinclads in nearly two years.

Cannon tied the LSU school record by winning the 100-yard dash in 9.5 seconds. Not a bit flustered by the wet track, the speedy All-American also won the shot put and anchored LSU's winning mile relay team.

Fabian won the low hurdles, the 220 dash, and finished a close second behind Cannon in the 100. The Bayou Bengals won 12 of 16 first places.

FSU's Jim Casteel won the 440-yard dash and finished third in both the 220 dash and broad jump. The Seminoles got hot performances from Kent Mills and Tom Keeney in the distance events.

All-America senior Bob Shave

paced FSU's golf team with a 69 at City Park. But a fine team effort by Rem Noble and Dick Dunlap enabled Bill Odeneal's squad to deadlock the match. Noble and Dunlap turned back LSU's John Sample and Jamie Williams, 7-2.

Rain forced a long delay in the tennis match, which finally started at 4 p.m. LSU won three clear-cut singles tests and two of three doubles to spoil FSU's debut under new Coach John Powless. The teams had to settle for professional-type doubles events because of a time shortage.
