

Florida State's golf team takes on its second Southeastern Conference club of the season today when it hosts Georgia at the Capital City Country Club.

Yesterday, despite the outstanding play of a few individuals, the Seminoles were beaten, 14½-12½, by Rollins.

Seminoles Coach Bill Odeneal said it was a team effort on the part of the Tars which proved to be the FSU downfall.

The Tribe now 1-1-1 won three of the six individual matches and one of the three team matches. Medalist for the day was FSU's all-America, Bob Shave.

Shave shot a seven-under-par 65, a round in which he got seven birdies. Odeneal said it was the best round of golf he had ever seen Shave shoot.

Shave and sophomore Downing Gray beat Rollins' best, Bob Ross and Dick Deversey in the team matches.
