

HOUSTON — In the Houston All-American Collegiate Invitational golf tournament now in progress here, Florida State is ranked second in four-ball play with a 65, and seventh in medal score with 323.

Manny Nordone's 77 was the low score on the Seminoles' 4-man team. Bryan Bergeron fired an 80. Chuck Keating had an 82 and Dave Philo scored an 84.

HOUSTON (AP) — Homero Blancas led the All - America Inter-collegiate golf tournament by a stroke going into the third round today and it shaped up as a two-man University of Houston fight for the title.

Blancas shot a 1-under-par 71 yesterday to retain his lead at 36 holes with 141. Teammate Fred Marti had a 70 and moved within one stroke of the defending champion.

Third was James Wright of Lamar Tech with 47.

Houston boosted its team medal lead 37 strokes. The Cougars had 581 to 618 for Oklahoma State and Lamar Tech. Texas A&M and Florida State were next at 629.

Houston topped in four-ball, leading Oklahoma State 124-130 with Southern Methodist and Florida State next with 132 and Lamar Tech with 134.

The Blancas-Marti combination had 67-65—132 two - ball

against 69-67—136 for Babe Hiskey and Kermit Zarleu of Houston.

Houston met Louisiana State in today's semi - finals. Texas A&M clashed with Oklahoma State.

Dave Philo fired a low score of 73 for FSU's team yesterday. Manny Nordone had a 77. Chuck Keating and Bryan Bergeron fired 78s in yesterday's play.

HOUSTON — Florida State's golf team is ranked fourth in medal play with a score of 933 in the Houston All - America Intercollegiate Golf tournament here.

The Seminoles are third in 4-ball with a 197. Chuck Keating paced yesterday's FSU scores with a 73. Dave Philo and Bryan Bergeron had 76s and Manny Nordone had a 79.
