Tribe golfers triumph

Florida State's golf team came charging out of the pack in the second round and held on to its lead in the final round to capture the Southeastern Invitational golf tournament at Dothan, Alabama, last weekend.

The triumph was the third consecutive major win for the

Seminole swingers and prompted an elated coach Scott Fletcher to pronounce, "We have got to be one of the best teams in the entire South — if not the very best. We have beaten every Southeast Conference team except Vanderbilt."

FSU's 1138 score was two

strokes better than runner up Alabama. Georgia finished third (1144), LSU (1144) fourth and Auburn (1151) fifth in the sixteen team field.

"This win should really move us up in the rankings," said Fletcher. "We were thirteenth, but I expect to be about fifth after this."

Florida State's team captain Todd Crandall paced the Tribesmen with a 54-hole total of 223. Crandall finished third, four strokes off the pace set by Georgia's Billy Kratzert. Auburn's Billy Gardner was second at 222.

Seminole sophomore Denny Allen fired the lowest round of the tournament, a blistering three under par second round 69. Allen soared to a final round 79 on the tough Spa Olympic Course and finished with a 228 total.

Other Seminole finishers included John Godwin - 225, a sixth place finish, Doug Fischesser — 233, Steve Mullins - 233, and Bob Impaglia - 238.

The Seminoles will next compete in the Houston All-American tournament April 17-20 and the Chris Schenkel Independent tournament shortly thereafter.
