# Seminoles come from behind to win Prudential Golf Classic

JACKSONVILLE — Florida State trailed nationally ranked Florida by 11 strokes at the start of the third round here Sunday, but when it was over, the Seminoles had made up their deficit to win the Prudential Collegiate Golf Classic.

Florida State shot a team total of 287 Sunday to rise from fifth place and win the title with an 871 total. Florida and LSU were tied for second at 874, and Georgia Southern was fourth at 876. Twenty-four teams from around the southeast participat-

ed in the tournament.

Florida State was fourth after the first round Friday with a 295 total, trailing LSU (284), Florida (291), and Georgia Southern (291).

The Seminoles fell to fifth Saturday as they shot a 289 for a 584 second round total. Florida led with 576, Georgia Southern was second at 579, LSU was third at 581, and South Florida was fourth at 583.

FSU easily turned in the best round of the day Sunday, however, and went on to win the tournament. FSU had a

287 Sunday, while Florida turned in the next best score of the day at 298.

The Seminoles' Paul Downes finished tied for second in the tournament with an even-par 216 total. FSU's Jeff Sluman and Allana Menne were tied for eighth with three-over par 219s.

Downes — 72-73-71 — 216; Sluman — 74-73-72 — 219; Menne — 76-72-71 — 219; Scott Perry — 73-72-75 — 220; and Grant Turner — 77-72-73 — 222.
