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FLORIDA WINS TAYLOR MADE/DORAL PARK NATIONAL COLLEGIATE INVITATIONAL

Gator Chris DiMarco Ties Tourney Record in Winning Individual

Miami--Florida's Chris DiMarco shot a first round, four-under par 68 to finish with a tournament record-tying 54 hole total of 210 in leading the Gators to a convincing win in the 3rd Annual Taylor Made/Doral Park National Collegiate Invitational at the Doral Park Silver Course. The Gators, second ranked nationally entering the tournament finished the three-day tournament with a two-over par total of 866 to win by 30 strokes over second place LSU. Georgia Tech was another two shots back.

"We got off to a good start, and you pretty much knew it was over after the first day," said Florida Coach Buddy Alexander. "Last year Wake Forest shot 14 under on the last day--one of the great college rounds I've ever seen--and we finished second after having had the lead. It's a great feeling to see us come out and play aggressively today and put another good score on the board."

Florida had the lowest team score on each of the three days of the tournament, including a two-under par 186 Sunday.

The real drama came in the individual competition, where DiMarco entered the day two shots back of teammate Dudley Hart. DiMarco and Hart battled all day, along with LSU's Ratt Crowder. Crowder shot a final round seven under par 65, missing the tournament record by one stroke, and finishing second to DiMarco by a stroke at five under 211. Hart shot even par 72 on the final round to finish at 212.

Included in a three way tie for fourth place in the individual competition was host Miami's Scott Medlin, who fired a one-under par 71 Sunday to finish with a three day total of three-over par 219. Also at 219 were Georgia Tech's David Duval, and Fresno State's Randy Bridge, who shot a six-under par 66 Sunday.

As a team, the host Hurricanes finished in 10th place at 917. 24 strokes better than last year's 17th place finish of 941. Miami's total was four shots better than Tulsa, which entered the tournament ranked 6th in the country, and Florida State, which was tied for 11th.

The 'Canes total was two shots worse than Stanford (tied for 11th nationally) and Fresno State (14th).
