FLORIDA STATE FOOTBALL TRAINER

October 24, 1995

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- No. 1 ranked Florida State practiced today in shorts after taking Monday off. The Seminoles remained undefeated with a 42-10 victory over Georgia Tech on Saturday.

"We spent most of the day looking at film," said Coach Bobby Bowden. "Then we held our usual Monday practice today in shorts."

Coach Bowden welcomes the off week as the Seminoles could use the time to get healthy.

"We have a lot of guys beat up," Bowden commented. "Thank goodness we have a week off."

In a move to solidify the safety position, cornerback Dexter Jackson was moved to strong safety where there have been numerous injuries.

"I think most defenses tried to stop the run and force the throw," Coach Bowden noted when asked about the Georgia Tech defense. "It slowed us down, but I'm glad we're not a one-dimensional football team."

The following were held out of today's practice: E.G. Green - right hamstring strain, Pooh Bear Williams - shoulder separation, Harold Battles - foot sprain, Tra Thomas - intestinal flu, Lamarr Glenn - ankle, Wayne Messam - left shoulder, Shevin Smith - right upper arm fracture.

Robert Hammond, Sean Hamlet, Tyrant Marion and Andre Cooper practiced, but were held out of contact. Juan Laureano will have his right knee scoped tomorrow and Marlin Green will have surgery Thursday. Hank Grant will start to work his way back into playing form this week.

FSU'S MEN'S GOLF TEAM FINISHES TIED FOR NINTH

TALLAHASSEE--The men's golf team finished tied for ninth with the University of Texas in the Jerry Pate Invitational in Birmingham, AL. The Seminoles finished the 54-hole event with a total of 904. The Seminoles were led by Richard Fulford who shot a three-day total of 226, tied for 26th.

Arizona State University won the team championship with a three-round total of 882, five shots better than UNLV.

Oklahoma State University finished in three place six strokes off of the lead.

Rob Bradley, University of North Carolina, won the individual championship with a total of 210, three strokes better than Chris Hanell of Arizona State. Chris Riley of UNLV came in third, two strokes behind Hanell.

The Seminoles travel to Baton Rouge next weekend for the Country Club of Louisiana Intercollegiate on October 30-31.
