FLORIDA STATE'S MEN'S GOLF TEAM FINISHES IN THIRD PLACE

Kiamesha Lake, NY--Florida State's men's golf team finished in third place at the NCAA East Regional at the Monster Course in Kiamesha Lake, NY. The Seminoles finished with a team score of 899, three strokes behind in-state rival Florida. With the third place finish, they qualified for the NCAA Championships at the Honors Course in Chattanooga, TN on May 29-June 1.

George McNeill led the Seminoles, finishing fifth after a final round of 71. Jason Pool ended up with a three-day total of 224 to finish tied for 18th place. Steve Carrington posted a 75 in the third round to finish tied for 26th. Richard Fulford and Barry Dyche rounded out the line-up, finishing tied for 66th and tied for 83, respectively.

North Carolina State won the team championship with a team score of 893. The University of Florida finished three strokes behind after posting the low team total of the day.

Tim Clark of North Carolina State captured individual medalist honors, beating LSU's Brian Bateman, Penn State's Adam Decker and UNC's Ross Bain by four strokes.

The team will have a week of preparation before travelling to the NCAA Championships next week.

KIAMESHA LAKE, N.Y. -- North Carolina State withheld a furious final-round charge from Florida to capture the team title while Wolfpack freshman Tim Clark won medalist honors in this weekend's East Regional of the NCAA Golf Championships at the Concord "Monster" Course.

Florida posted a four-man composite of 290--two over par--yesterday for the tournament's lowest round, helping the Gators finish the tourney at 896, three strokes behind North Carolina State's winning 893. Florida State (899), North Carolina (900) and Wake Forest (901) rounded out the top five teams. The final round was played in soggy, muddy, foggy and misty conditions with temperatures in the low 50s.

Saturday's final round was interrupted for 2 1/2 hours because of thunder and lightning that accompanied an early morning shower. Because of the delay, tournament officials were forced to cut Saturday's competitive field to the top 17 teams based upon their 36-hole scores. Also, the five individuals who qualified for the regional, along with James Madison's Steve Ligi, advanced beyond the cut to participate in Saturday's round. Officials pulled the players off the "Monster" Course at 8:03 a.m. due to the hazardous playing conditions. At the time of the delay, only four threesomes had teed off from both the front and back.

Eleven teams, along with the top two unattached individuals, advanced to the NCAA Championships in Chattanooga, Tenn., on May 29 through June 1.

Despite the wet conditions, nine of the 17 competing teams posted scores less than 300 yesterday, paced by Florida's blistering round. Clemson shot a 294 with North Carolina State, East Tennessee State and North Carolina carding 295s.

"It's a shame we didn't get to play a course this great under great conditions," Wolfpack coach Richard Sykes. "It was brutal. I know why it's called a 'monster' now. Most kids do not want to settle for a bogey, but there are a lot of places out here where bogey is a good score. We just tried to keep scores from not being too high but, we also wanted to be aggressive."

Clark finished with a three-day total of 215, four strokes ahead of Louisiana State's Brian Bateman, Penn State's Adam Decker and North Carolina's Ross Bain. Florida State's George McNeill was fifth individually with a 220. Bain showed the pace Saturday with a three-under 69, one of only seven players to finish under par.

The day's drama occurred on the 18th green as the final three teams concluded their rounds. With most of the leaders in the clubhouse and other "bubble" teams awaiting the results, Virginia, Clemson and Alabama were all fighting to make the cut for the NCAA Championships. Virginia's Lewis Chitengwa missed a 20-foot put for par that would have created a four-team playoff for the final three spots. Clemson and Alabama each advanced while the Cavaliers fell one shot short.

Penn State, which tied with Alabama and Tennessee for the final spot, became the first District II team ever to advance to the NCAA championship. Bateman and Chitengwa, who carded a 54-hole total of 221, were the top two individuals to advance to the NCAAAs.
