## FLORIDA STATE'S BLIXT CAPTURES INDIVIDUAL MEDALIST HONORS; SEMINOLES FINISH IN THIRD AT SHOAL CREEK INTERCOLLEGIATE

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Florida State University junior Jonas Blixt claimed individual medalist honors and the Seminole men's golf team finished third in the team standings as play at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate at the Shoal Creek Golf Club finished on Tuesday. Blixt carded a career-best 67 in the final round to win the in the individual championship. The individual championship marked the second of Blixt's career; he also won medalist honors at the Gator Invitational during the spring of 2005.

Alabama led the event wire-to-wire and won the team championship with a three-round score of 869. The Crimson Tide defeated Tennessee by six strokes and Florida State by 13 strokes. Blixt outdistanced Brian Noonan of LSU by three strokes to win the individual championship. He entered the final day tied for seventh and four strokes behind Noonan who began the day in third place. Blixt gained seven strokes on Noonan over the final 18 holes to claim the win.

Blixt (Hammaro, Sweden) played his best round of golf as a collegian with his final round 67 and finished with the second best tournament score of his career to win the event. He shot a career-best 67 in the final round and finished with a 211 tournament score. He missed tying his personal tournament score best of 209 which he carded in winning the Gator Invitational during the spring of 2005.

Sophomore Matt Savage (Louisville, Ky.) finished in third place in the individual standings to earn the best finish of his Seminole career. He carded a two-over par 74 in the final round and finished with a three-round total of 215. Savage carded a three-under par 69 in the first round and an even-par 72 in the second round. His pervious best finish of tied for 10<sup>th</sup> place came at the Linger Longer Invitational during the spring of 2006.

Freshman Cameron Knight (Wesley Chapel, Fla.) finished well after carding a two-under par 70 in the second round. He finished tied for 37<sup>th</sup> in the first event of his collegiate career. Knight shot a final round 76 to finish with a 226 total for the event. Senior Torstein Nevestad (Oslo, Norway) and junior Tommy Rymer (Hastings, Minn.) finished in tied for 62<sup>nd</sup> and in 65<sup>th</sup> place respectively.

# Stroke of excellence Blixt wins medalist honors at Shoal Creek Collegiate

The Florida State meni¿½s golf team had their best performance of the young season last week by recording a third place finish at the Shoal Creek Collegiate in Birmingham, Alabama. Junior Jonas Blixti;½s led the way for the teami;½s third place finish as he shot a five-under par 67 in the final round en route to winning the tournamenti;½s individual championship.

Entering the last day of the tournament, Blixt found himself in seventh place and four strokes behind LSU�s Brian Noonan. Over the course of the final 18 holes, however, the Sweden native stormed past Noonan and the rest of the competition to claim a three-stroke victory. Blixt finished the tournament with a score of 211, nearly tying his career best of 209 set in the spring of 2005 at the Gator Invitational.

Not far behind Blixt in the individual standings and helping the Noles place third was sophomore Matt Savage. Savage shot a 215 for the tournament to finish in third place. The finish was the best of Savage�s young career and was his second career top ten finish. His other top ten performance came at the Linger Longer Invitational last spring.

Savage�s play in the first two rounds was a big part in his individual and the team�s success throughout the tournament. He came out of the gates quickly and set the pace for the team by shooting a three-under par 69 in round one and followed that performance with an even par 72 in round two.

Not to be left out of the equation is freshman Cameron Knight, who contributed nicely in round two of the tournament with his two-under par 70.

Despite the effort, it wasni¿½ tenough to lift the team past SEC participants Alabama and Tennessee. The Crimson Tide put a stranglehold on the lead from the start and never fell from first place en route to shooting an 869 to pick up the team championship. The Vols tried keeping pace with the Tide, but Alabama was just too much for them in the end as they finished in second place with an 875. The Noles finished seven strokes behind Tennessee with an 882.
