SEMINOLES FINISH IN THIRD PLACE AT NCAA DIVISION I CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS TO EARN BEST FINISH IN SCHOOL HISTORY SEMINOLES RANKED NO. 6 IN FINAL GOLFSTAT POLL

SEMINOLES FINISH IN 3RD PLACE AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

The Florida State men's golf team fell to Augusta State, 4-1, in the semifinals of the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championship at The Honors Course thus ending the Seminoles' run at the first national championship in the sport of men's golf in school history. Despite the loss the Seminoles finished in a tie for third place at the national championship finals to earn the best finish in the history of the program. The Seminoles led the stroke play of the tournament and finished in second place to earn the No. 2 seed in the match play portion of the event. Florida State then defeated Texas Tech in the first round of match play before falling to Augusta State in the semifinals. The third place finish at the national Tournament marked the best finish in school history – one place better than the Seminoles fourth place national finish in 1957 and tied for fourth place finish in 1958.

FLORIDA STATE RANKED SIXTH IN FINAL GOLFSTAT POLL

Florida State finished the 2009-10 season ranked No. 6 in the final GolfStat poll of the season and No. 16 in the final poll by GolfWeek. The GolfStat poll was released following the Seminoles' third place finish in the NCAA Championship while the GolfWeek poll came out before the beginning of the NCAA Championship. The Seminoles' national ranking of No. 6 is the highest final ranking since head coach Trey Jones' arrival for the 2004 season.

KOEPKA AND KITTLESAN EARN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

Florida State University golfers **Brooks Koepka** and **Drew Kittleson**, who helped lead the Seminoles golf team to a third place finish in the NCAA Championship finals, were named to the PING All-America team announced by the Golf Coaches Association of America. It marked the first time both golfers had been rewarded with All-American honors during their careers. Koepka earned All-American Third Team honors while Kittleson earned All-American honorable mention honors.

KOEPKA NAMED SOUTHEAST REGIONAL ALL-AMERICA

Sophomore **Brooks Koepka** was named to the Division I Southeast Regional All-American Team by Ping and the Golf Coaches Association of America.

KOEPKA NAMED ACC GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Seminole sophomore **Brooks Koepka** was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year – an award which he shared with Virginia's Ben Kohles in a vote by the ACC 11 head men's golf coaches. Koepka was the first Seminole since Bobby Cochran in 1994 to be named the ACC Player of the Year. He was ranked as the nation's No. 1 golfer for two weeks during the months of February and March. Koepka has a career-low 71.97 stroke average entering the 2010 NCAA Championship finals. Koepka was named the ACC Freshman of the Year in 2009. He is only the seventh player in ACC history to earn ACC Freshman and Player of the Year honors.

KOEPKA AND LAUER NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

Florida State's **Brooks Koepka** and **Seath Lauer** were named to the 2010 All-ACC Men's Golf Team. It marked the fourth consecutive season that two Florida State players have been named to the All-ACC Team. It also marked the first time Koepka and Lauer have earned All-ACC honors during their careers. In earning All-ACC honors, Koepka and Lauer are the seventh and eighth players to be named to the All-ACC team in the last four years. Prior to head coach Trey Jones's arrival in 2004, the Seminoles had a total of five players earn All-ACC honors since joining the ACC for the 1992 season. Since his arrival as head coach, the Seminoles have earned eight All-ACC selections, had one player earn ACC Rookie (Koepka in 2009) and ACC Player (Koepka in 2010) of the year honors and won the ACC Championship in 2008.

SEMINOLES FINISH SECOND AT CENTRAL REG.

The Florida State men's golf team – led by individual medalist **Drew Kittleson** -- advanced to the NCAA Championship finals with a second place finish at the NCAA Central Region Championship on the Warren Course at the University of Notre Dame. Kittleson was outstanding throughout the three round tournament with scores of 69-67-68 for a six under par total of 204. He was followed in the individual standings by sophomore **Wesley Graham**, who finished in a tie for second in the individual standings with scores of 67-69-70 for a five under par score of 205. Freshman Michael Hebert came within one stroke of tying the school record for lowest single round score with a six under par score of 64 in the final round and finished in a tie for 11th place with a one under par total of 209.

KITTLESON BLISTERS THE WARREN COURSE

Junior **Drew Kittleson** was stellar throughout the NCAA Central Regional Championship as he earned his second career victory with three scores in the 60's. The win was Kittleson's first outright victory as he finished in a tie for first place in the Inaugural GolfWeek Collegiate Challenge during the fall of 2009. Kittleson established personal best records for 36 hole score (136), tournament score (204) and tournament score vs. par (minus 6) in becoming the first Seminole in school history to win a regional championship.

SEMINOLES WITH THREE VICTORIES IN 2009-10

Florida State finished the fall 2009 and spring 2010 seasons with three team championships. Under Seminole head coach Trey Jones, the Seminoles have won more events in the last three seasons (seven) than had been won by the program in the previous nine seasons (six) before his arrival for the 2003-04 season. Florida State led the ACC with three tournament titles in 2009-10 (GolfWeek Conference Challenge, Gary Koch Intercollegiate during the fall season and the Seminole Intercollegiate during the spring season).

SEMINOLES WITH THREE INDIVIDUAL WINS

Junior **Drew Kittleson** (tied for first at the Inaugural GolfWeek Collegiate Challenge and first place at the 2010 NCAA Central Regional) and senior **Seath Lauer** (tied for first at the Seminole Intercollegiate) combined to win three individual titles for the Seminoles in 2009-10. With the three wins by Kittleson and Lauer, the Seminole players have combined to earn 11 top five and 16 top 10 individual finishes this year.

SEMINOLES ENJOYED SUCCESSFUL YEAR

Florida State, which was ranked as high as No. 3 in the national polls during the 2009-10 fall and spring seasons, finished in 10th place or higher in each of their 13 tournaments of the year. The Seminoles earned three titles, top two finishes and 10 top five finishes. The Seminoles finished outside of the top five in the team standings of an event only three times during the year. Florida State finished the year with the lowest team scoring average in the ACC with a 287.05 scoring average as it finished in the top 10 of each of their 13 tournaments.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO CUT STROKE AVERAGE

Led by ACC Player of the Year **Brooks Koepka**, who ranked first on the team and fourth in the ACC with a career-low 71.91 stroke average, the Seminoles cut their stroke average in 2009-10 by nearly two strokes as compared to the 2008-09 season.

SEMINOLES' VICTORIES UNDER TREY JONES

Florida State head coach **Trey Jones** has led the Seminoles to seven victories in his first seven seasons as the head coach in Tallahassee. Each of those seven tournament victories has come in the last three tournaments and includes the first ACC Championship in school history (Spring 2008).

LAUER FINISHES STELLAR CAREER

Senior **Seath Lauer**, who earned All-ACC honors for the first time in his career in 2010, finished out his stellar career as he helped lead the Seminoles to a Final Fore finish at the NCAA Championship. He was the early round star of the 2010 NCAA Championship finals as he helped the Seminoles into first place after the first two rounds and to a second place finish in stroke play to give the Seminoles the No. 2 seed in match play. Lauer was in a tie for third place in the individual standings after a first round score of 69 and in a tie for fifth place after his second round score of 70 and 36 hole total of 139. When he got into match play he was the only Seminole to win both of his matches – with his first win coming against Matt Smith of Texas Tech (2 up) and his second coming against Krywulcz of Augusta State (4 and 3). He also helped lead the Seminoles to a second place finish at the NCAA Central Regional – the highest regional finish in school history. His best score of the regional came in the second round and was a 73 that allowed the Seminoles move from fourth place in the team standings to second place heading into the team standings. Lauer averaged 73.90 strokes in 126 rounds during 43 tournaments in his four varsity letter winning seasons as a Seminole...

GRAHAM HELPS FLORIDA STATE'S FINISH

Sophomore **Wesley Graham** enjoyed his most successful season as a Seminole as he helped Florida State to a third place finish at the NCAA Championship finals. The best event of Graham's career came at the NCAA Central Regional championship as he helped lead Florida State to a second place finish in the team standings thus qualifying the Seminoles for their first appearance in the national finals during his two year career. He was stellar in establishing career bests for single round score (67), 36-hole score (135), three round tournament score (205) and individual finish (tied for second). Graham finished tied for third place finish at the Florida State hosted Seminole Intercollegiate with scores of 70-75-68 for an even par total of 213 he led the Seminoles to the team championship

KITTLESON BACK ON TOP OF HIS GAME

Junior All-American **Drew Kittleson** put together one of the greatest post season runs in school history with a first place finish in earning medalist honors at the NCAA Central Regional championship and a tie for sixth place finish at the NCAA Championship finals. He was a total of nine strokes under par in those two events.

CALL KITTLESON MR. POSTSEASON

Junior **Drew Kittleson** enjoyed the best postseason of his career in the months of May and June as he finished in a tied for fifth at the Golden Ocala Invitational (minus three strokes under par), won the individual honors at the NCAA Central Regional (minus four) and finished in a tie for sixth at the NCAA Championship finals (minus five). He was a total of 12 strokes under par, carded seven of eight single round scores under par, totaled all eight of his rounds at even or under par and was over par for a total of eight holes in his two NCAA events to close out the season and was the Seminoles' leading golfer in each of the final three events of the season. While playing great golf, he helped lead Florida State to a first place team finish at the Seminole Intercollegiate with a tied for 20th place finish in the individual standings. Kittleson was the team leader with seven rounds score in the 60's, 12 of his 23 rounds scored at par or better while 19 of his 23 rounds were scored at 75 or better.

HEBERT PROVES HIS WORTH IN POSTSEASON

Freshman **Michael Hebert** came within one stroke of tying the school record for a low round score with a six under par 64 in the third round of the 2010 NCAA Central Regional Championship. He was only one stroke off of the school record of 63 set by All-American Matt Savage during the spring 2008 Florida State Spring Break Invitational.

HEBERT'S BEST AT NCAA CENTRAL REGIONAL...

...Freshman **Michael Hebert** earned his best career single round score of 64 in the third round of the 2010 NCAA Central Regional Championship;

...Freshman **Michael Hebert** finished with his best tournament score of minus one under par 209 at the NCAA Central Regional. It marked the second time that he has finished under par (he was minus five at the Gary Koch Intercollegiate) during his freshman season;

...Freshman **Michael Hebert** earned his fourth top 15 finish at the NCAA Central Regional Championship. He finished in a career best tied for seventh place at the Gator Invitational earlier this spring.

LETSON CONTRIBUTES TO SEMINOLES' SUCCESS

Freshman **Doug Letson** played in six events including his first career ACC Championship tournament during the spring of 2010. He earned his first career top five finish with a tied for fifth placing in the Florida State hosted Seminole Intercollegiate. Letson was the third highest finishing Seminole in the field as he played as an individual in the event. His scores of 70 and 71 in the first and second rounds of the Seminole Intercollegiate rank as his best career 36 hole score and he was in second place in the individual standings after two rounds of play. His play helped the Seminoles earn their high seed in the NCAA Central Regional which allowed them to advance and play well at the NCAA Championship finals.

KNIGHT CLOSES OUT STRONG CAREER

Senior **Cameron Knight** closed out his career as he earned the fourth varsity letter in 2010. During his career he helped the Seminoles win the 2008 ACC Championship – the first ACC championship in school history in the sport of golf while playing in one NCAA Championship final, three NCAA regional

championships and three ACC Championship. Knight helped the Seminoles to three tournament titles during his career and helped the Seminoles into the national rankings in each of his four seasons. He averaged 74.66 strokes in 83 rounds during 28 tournaments during his career

FLORIDA STATE'S BEST....

...Single round score of 64 (minus 6) was recorded by freshman **Michael Hebert** in the third round of the NCAA Central Regional Championship on May 22;

...Single round score vs. par -7 (65) was recorded by sophomore **Brooks Koepka** in the third round of the Mauna Lani Invitational on Feb. 5;

...Individual tournament score of 203 (minus 13) was recorded by **Seath Lauer** in the Gary Koch Intercollegiate during the fall season. The Seminoles won the team championship in the event;

JONES NAMED MID-SEASON COACH OF THE YEAR

After a fall season that included two victories and three top-five finishes, Florida State men's golf coach **Trey Jones** was named Golf Digest's Mid-Season National Coach of the Year. In Florida State's four fall starts, each Seminole player made a significant impact on the course. Junior Drew Kittleson took home a first place finish at the GolfWeek Conference Challenge, senior Seth Lauer finished third at the Olympia Fields Invitational (one of his two top 10 individual finishes of the fall season) and sophomore Brooks Koepka tied for fifth at Brickyard Intercollegiate (he also earned a pair of top five individual finishes during the fall season.)

MALLOY NAMED A TOP 5 NATIONAL ASSISTANT

Chris Malloy, who has helped coach the Florida State men's and women's golf teams into both the national rankings and their respective NCAA championship tournaments, has been selected as one of five finalists for the Jan Strickland Award presented by TaylorMade-adidas golf as the National Men's Assistant Golf Coach of the Year. Malloy is a finalist for the national award along with Josh Brewer of Southern California, Michael Burcin of South Carolina, Garrett Glegg of the University of Washington, and Chris Whitten of the University of Michigan. The Strickland Award is presented to the NCAA Division I, II, III, NAIA or NJCAA assistant coach that, among other things, has excelled in working with their student-athletes both on the course and in the classroom and will be announced June 1.

SEMINOLE GOLF RECOGNIZED BY NCAA

The Florida State men's and women's golf teams, both ranked in the nation's top 25 and both competing in their respective NCAA championship tournaments, were recognized by the NCAA with a perfect APR (Academic Progress Rate) for the period 2006-2009. The Department of Athletics at Florida State is one of nine ACC schools and the only Division I school in the state of Florida to have multiple varsity teams recognized publicly by the NCAA for having a perfect four-year average on the APR.
