FSU GYMNASTS SET RECORD

School's First National Champs

The Florida State University gymnastic team, paced by Captain Bill Roctzheim, became the first squad in the school's history to win a national championship by taking the NCAA title at Ann Arbor, Mich, Saturday.

There is a possibility that this victory is the first national intercollegiate title ever to be won by any Florida college team and records are being checked to confirm this.

3-POINT MARGAIN

With Roetzheim winning the individual all-around and high bar titles, the Seminole gymnasts compiled a team total of 26% points. This was a little more than three points better than the score of Southern California and Illinois who tied for second place with 23½ markers. Navy was fourth with 18½ points, Kent State had 17. Syracuse 16. Michigan State 13½, Army 9. Michigan 8½, Temple 7 and Penn State 5.

In addition to winning the allaround and high bar titles, Roetzheim gathered points in several other events to account for most of the Seminoles total. Carmine Regna also tallied for Florida State, getting a fourth in the high bar event.
