

## Miami Defeats FSU Swimmers In 40-35 Meet

The powerful Miami University swimming team rolled up its 16th consecutive victory last night with a 40-35 triumph over Florida State University in a surprisingly close meet in the East campus pool last night.

The Hurricane tankmen, one of the south's outstanding squads this year, smashed three pool records as they splashed to their triumph.

Capt Bob Caffery of the 'Canes established two new marks. He won the 200-yard free style in 2:08 8/10 and repeated his triumph in the 400 yard free style in 4:40 6/10 seconds.

Dick Fetterman set the third mark in the 150-yard backstroke in 1:41 2/10.

The Seminoles, who gave the 'Canes a battle all the way, racked up only two first places, but built up their score with seconds and thirds.

Roger Slater and Don Wensinger placed one-two in the diving event for the Indians, and the 400 free style relay team of Warren Frost, Jack White, Mark Brown and Frank Cochran took top honors in their event.

The Seminoles are slated to enter a 10-man team in the Southeastern AAU meet in Atlanta this weekend.
