

FSU Swimmers Bow to NAS

The Florida State University swimming team closed its season here yesterday when they dropped a 47-28 decision to the powerful Pensacola naval air station tankmen in the East campus pool.

The naval team, led by Coach John Higgins, former U S Olympic competitor, took an early lead and was never headed, though the Seminoles did deadlock the meet at 16-all when Roger Slater took first place in the diving events.

The Seminoles only other victory came in the 50-yard free style where Frank Cochran, Tallahassee boy who has been a consistent winner all year, established a new pool record to win the event.

Cochran's time was 24.6. The old mark was 25 seconds flat.

Jack White placed second to Cochran in the 50.
