

FSU's Jardine, Slater Enter National Meet

Florida State University will send two representatives to the National Intercollegiate swimming meet which will be held at Columbus, O., March 23, 24 and 25.

Walter Jardine of Fort Worth, captain of the successful Seminole natators this winter, will swim in the 1500 meter race on Friday. And Roger Slater of Akron, O., outstanding FSU diver who won the Southeastern AAU title recently, is entered in the 1 meter diving event at Columbus.

Swimming Coach Bim Stults will accompany Jardine and Slater on the trip. This will mark the first time that Florida State University has been represented at the National Intercollegiate Swimming Meet.

COLUMBUS, O., Mar 25, (AP)—Ohio State retained its NCAA swimming championship tonight against the bids of strong teams from Yale, Michigan and Iowa.

Ohio State counted a winning total of 64 points.

Yale was second with 43 points, Iowa third with 25 and Michigan fourth with 24.
