

Florida State University's track swimming team was pressed Friday more than it had been at any other time this season but managed to hang on for a 51-33 victory over Southern Methodist. It was the 24th straight

dual meet triumph for the Seminoles.

With only two events left SMU crept to within two points of the Tribe but the Seminoles came off the ropes by scoring heavily in the 200 yd. breaststroke and by winning the 400 yd. free style relay.

Sparkling the losers was freshman sensation Pedro Galvao, who kept SMU hopes alive most of the afternoon by winning three events. No other man was able to manage more than one.

The slender native of Buenos Aires, Argentina, captured the 100-and 440-yard free styles and the 200 yard individual medley. Galvao set pool records in the last-named events.

Graham Teschke, Jim Julian, Henry Glancy and Joel Jacobs took first places for the Tribe Friday.

Florida State's talented freshman team, which includes four high school All-Americans, will meet Georgia Military Academy in the Women's gym tonight at 8 o'clock.
