Powerful Southwest Conference swimming champion Southern Methodist used depth and strength in the distance events to knock off Florida State, 52-34, here last night.

The well-balanced Mustangs were responsible for seven of 10 new records established during the dual meet at the FSU pool, which was witnessed by a near capacity crowd. Three FSU pool records and seven meet marks were erased in the meet.

The match was the Seminoles second of the season and leaves them with a 1-1 record. The FSU swimmers opened Jan. 16 against Georgia and easily downed the Bulldogs, 68-17.

Another Southwest Conference entry, Rice, invades the PSU-pool tonight. The match is alated for 8 p.m. and the public has been invited to attend

Rice finished last in the Southwest Conference race last year but is reported to have a much stronger team this year.

The FBU swimmers were able to cop only three first places in the ten events. The biggest Seminole victory came in springboard diving with Bob Weber of Charleston, W. Va. cooping first place over the Mustang's No. 1 diver. Ronnie Smith

Smith won the National AAU three-meter diving event in 1957 and is considered one of the finest collegiste divers in the country.

Disk Barry paced the SMU squad with victories in the 220 and 440-yard freestyle events. His time of 4:54.7 in the 440 established a new pool record. Barry's also set a new meet record with a time of 2:15.4 in the 200-yard freestyle:

Ted Scherer brought another pool and meet-record for the Mustangs with a 2:32.0 victory in the 200-yardsbreastströke.

The SMU 400-yard medley relay team set the third pool record with a 4:03.3 victory.

FRU's Ryan Ray set a meet record in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of):23.5.

Ray, Gleen Thatcher, Ken Abbott and Paul Hammond brought home, the only other FBU first place with victory in the final event of the evening, the 400-yard freestyle relay. The time of 3:35.7 crased the old meet record of 3:36.2.

The Seminole tankers will leave Sunday for a northern road trip which will include five matches.
