

**DALLAS —** All-America Buck Hiles erased three records in winning two events but Southern Methodist's Southwest Conference swimming champions snapped Florida State's 17-meet victory string, 60-35, here last night.

The Seminoles, now 1-1 this season, swim Texas A&M at College Station tonight.

Aubrey Burer, SMU's Olympic freestyler, won two events and his Mustang teammates supplied the depth to deal FSU its first dual loss since 1950. Ironically, it was SMU that halted a 12-meet Seminole unbeaten skien in Dallas two years ago.

Hiles and two-time All-America diver Curt Genders were brilliant for the Seminoles last night. Hiles cracked SMU's dual meet pool record in the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:08.4. It bettered his own school mark of 2:09.8 set against Georgia last month. The old SMU pool record was 2:10.5, established by Paul Witherall of Iowa State in 1960.

Hiles later came back to set a school record in the 100-yard

free-style with a clocking of 51.2 seconds. Ken Abbott held the old record of 51.3, set in 1958.

In winning the one-meter diving, Genders had one of his best performances ever. He stacked up 309.45 points, a total FSU Coach Bim Stults says is one of the best he's ever seen in a dual meet.

Pete Davis, promising sophomore, gave FSU its only other first when he won the 200-yard backstroke.

Burer, an Olympic finalist last year, edged FSU's Paul Thompson in taking the 220 and 440-yard freestyle races. Thompson gave Burer quite a duel in the 220 but the SMU ace won the 440 going away.

SMU's relay strength proved FSU's downfall. The Mustangs won both the 400 medley relay and the closing 400 freestyle relay. SMU had seven firsts, five seconds, and six third-place finishes.

The Seminoles won four events,  
had six seconds, and three thirds.
