NEW ORLEANS - Florida State's perennially strong swim team cranked up its 1961-62 season with a victory in the South-20 ern AAU Invitational meet at Tulane here yesterday. The Seminoles, led by Paul

Thompson of Tallahassee, scored 141 points. Tulane scored 134, Capital Swim Association was third in the 15-team field with 114 points.

Thompson won top individual events, winning the 200-yard individual medley in 2:13.7 and the 440 freestyle in 4:54.7. Both were pool records.

He also anchored FSU's freestyle relay team that won in 1:38.6, also a new pool record.

FSU swept the first three places in the 200 individual medley and the top five places in the 440 freestyle.

A double winner for FSU was Tom Brandley with a 55.2 time in the 100 freestyle and a 2:23.0 in the 220 freestyle. The latter was a new pool record,

Pete Davis won the 100 breaststroke with a 1:11.5 and Dick Acosta won the 100 backstroke in 1:02.8.

With Thompson on the freestyle relay unit were Ned Searcy, Brandley, and Dale Smith.
