


Swimmers Post 10-0 In the 1960 Season



This year the tankers open with a fabulous 12 year record of 90 victories, 17 losses and 2 ties in intercollegiate competition. They have had four perfect seasons: 1951-54-55-60. In 1961 the Seminoles will face six SEC teams.












GLEN MITCHELL Backstroke






MIKE BANKS Freestyle

Genders, Hiles On All-America Swimming List

NCAA one meter diving champion Curt Genders and swimming star Buck Hiles, key names in Florida State athletics for the past three years, have been named to the 1961 All-America squad selected by the College Swimming Coaches Assn. of America.

The All-America honors are nothing new for either Genders, Sarasota senior, or Hiles, Atlanta senior. It is the third straight All-America diving award earned by Genders. Hiles was a 1959 All-America in the 440 yard freestyle.

The standout FSU athletes helped Coach Bim Stults' Seminoles roll up a 27-2 record in dual competition during the past three years and an 11th-place finish among 56 team entries in the NCAA championships at Seattle, Wash., in March.

Hiles this year won his All-America award with a sixth-place national finish in the 100-yard butterfly event.
