

Florida State's spotless swimming record went under Saturday afternoon at Montgomery Gym.

After three straight victories (over Tulane, Georgia and Alabama), Coach Ben Stults' Seminoles were finally dented by powerful North Carolina, 51-44.

As it turned out, the Tarheels' strength in the two relay events told the story. Each team won five individual events, but North Carolina won—and set pool records in—both the 400-yard medley relay and the 400-yard relay. That was worth a total of 14 points for N.C., nothing for FSU.

Florida State's Doug Kruger, a sophomore from Fort Myers, broke a pool record he set a few weeks ago by turning the 200-yard breaststroke in 2:30.5.

The victory pushed North Carolina's record to 9-1. The Tarheels were soundly beaten by
