

FSU Cops Swim Title

JACKSONVILLE — Seeley Feldmeyer and Jack Barnacastle of Florida State Set new state records in the 200-yard freestyle and 200-yard breast stroke, respectively, Saturday in the AAU senior men and women's swimming and diving championships here.

Feldmeyer swam the 200-yard freestyle in 1:49.3 while Barnacastle was clocked at 2:24.5 in the 200-yard breast stroke.

The FSU varsity A team came in first place and the varsity B team finished second in the medley relay. Terry Schlickmeiaer took second in the 200-yard backstroke, Terry Maul second in the 200-yard butterfly, Jeff Heatley second in the 200-yard breast stroke and Schlickmeiaer second in the 200-yard individual medley.

JACKSONVILLE — Florida State University won the Florida AAU swimming championships over the weekend, busting state records while rolling up 157 points.

Closest challenger was the Beaches Aquatic Club with 65 points, followed by University of South Florida with 52½, the FSU freshmen with 32.

Seeley Feldmeyer of FSU won the 100 freestyle with a state-record time of 48.7. The Seminoles' Scott Guthrie took the 100 breaststroke with a state-record time of 1:04.8.

And the Florida State "B" team entry in the 400 freestyle relay racked a state-record time of 3:19.6 in preliminaries, won in the finals with 3:22.0. The team was composed of Bob Bell, Terry Schlichenmaier, Ken Palmer and Feldmeyer.

Feldmeyer was chosen the outstanding male swimmer in the meet.
