FSU Swimmers In Nationals

Eleven swimmers from Florida State's swimming team will compete in the NCAA Championships in Colo-

rado Springs, Col., this week.

"We are entering three relays, all diving events, and two individual events," said Coach Bim Stults. "In order to score points you have to finish in the top twelve in an event. I think we have a good chance to score some points up there."

Leading the Florida State entry are senior Dick Abbott and sophomore star Seeley Feldmeyer. The pair holds

six records between them.

FSU's outstanding diving trio of Duane McAllister, Bob Cruickshank, and Randy Stewart will compete in both the one- and three-meter diving events.

Abbott and Feldmeyer are the only Seminoles competing in individual events. Feldmeyer will swim the 100-yard freestyle, while Abbott will compete in his specialty—the 200-yard individual medley.

Feldmeyer will be the most active Seminole at the meet. The rugger 6-4 soph from Annapolis, Md., will anchor all three relays which FSU will enter — the 400 medley relay, the 400 freestyle, and 800 freestyle.

The 400 medley relay will consist of Terry Schlichenmaier, Mike Blouin, Scott Guthrie, and Feldmeyer. The 400 freestyle will include: Bob Bell, Charley Robertson, Abbott, and Feldmeyer, while the 800 free style features Tom Lloyd, Blouin, Abbott, and Feldmeyer.
