Florida State's swimming team splashed through the chilly waters at University Union Pool to a 79-34 win over Georgia yesterday. It was the first meet of the season for the Seminoles, who meet Georgia Tech this afternoon at 2:30.

Bim Stuk's tankers captured 10 of the meet's 13 events enroute to the lopsided win.

Yesterday's chilly temperatures did not impede the swimmers' times, however, as meet records fell in every event.

The temperature at the start of the meet was 37 degrees, but the water temperature was 70.

Georgia captured the opening medley relay even, covering the 400-yard distance in 3:47.7. But the Bulldogs lead was short lived as the Seminoles swept first and second place in the next two events to open a commanding 16-9 lead.

McNerney led most of the race, but Jenkins used a strong finishing kick to overtake his teammate in the closing strokes. Jenkins time was 10:52.3.

Seeley Feldmeyer, Florida State's top freestyler, copped his specialty, the 200, in the fine time of 1:49.1.

In the one meter diving competition, the Seminoles finished one-two with Howard Acosta winning and Carl Springfels gaining second spot. Florida State also swept the other diving event (three meter) with Randy Stewart No. 1 and Kenneth Von Roenn No. 2.

Freshman Mark Jenkins pulled one of the biggest surprises of the day by upsetting junior distance ace Steve McNerney in the 1,000-yard freestyle.
