Two Crimson Tide swimmers set meet and pool records. Leo French covered the 1000-yd, freestyle in 10:26.2 for one new mark, and Ralph Wright's 2:00.8 in the Individual Medley was good for the other.

Feldmeyer and Gibson, both seniors, made their last dual meet performances winning ones as the Seminoles closed the year out with a 4-4 record. It was the poorest mark for one of Coach Bim Stults team, since his first club went 3-5 in 1949.
