

## Ten FSU swimmers travel to NCAA meet

Ten members of Florida State's swimming team are headed for the NCAA Championships in Cleveland, Ohio Thursday after a virus-plagued performance at the National Independent Championships.

The Seminoles have qualified eight swimmers and two divers, but at least one of the swimmers is not expected to make the trip due to illness. Cliff Schlak, member of last year's All-America 400 relay team for FSU, became sick at the NIC and will not be competing at the NCAA.

Despite the bug, six swimmers qualified at the NIC, where Florida State finished fifth in team competition. "We had a super effort," said Coach Terry Carlisle.

"This will be a great opportunity to gain valuable experience for our younger swimmers," said Carlisle. "When you have as many freshmen as we have going to the NCAA Championships, you don't really worry as much about how many points are going to be scored this year as the points that will be

scored in later years because of the experience gained here."

Of the qualified individuals, five are freshmen. Brent Fichter will be in the one-meter diving competition in his first year. Pete Eunson will be swimming the 400 individual medley while Doug Schlak takes a leg of the 400 and 800 relays.

Mike Grattan and Kevin Marshburn have each qualified for two individual events. Grattan will be in the 50 and 100 freestyle events while Marshburn is in the 100 and 200 yard breaststroke.

Sophomore Steve Rosenbaum tackles the 100 and 200 butterfly and fellow classman Bob Gordon will be swimming in the 200 butterfly also. Junior Jeff Bauer will be diving in the one-meter category.

Florida State will be entering three relay teams. The medley relay will team Marshburn, Rosenbaum, Grattan and Tom Truscott. The 400 and 800 free relay personnel will not be confirmed until late this week.
