The men's and women's swim teams of the University of Florida displayed on Friday the strength they were touted as having, upending the Florida State swim teams 84-56 on the women's side and 70-34 on the men's in the season opener for both schools.

The Gator women won 14 of the 16 events, with ~~USA~~ Olympian Tracy Caulkins winning each of the three individual events and the one relay she was entered in.

The Gator men, defending NCAA champions, took 10 of 13 events from the Seminole men.

But despite the large point differential, FSU coaches were happy with things.

"I thought we swam aggressively," says Terry Maul, the women's coach. "We were able to race to some very close finishes with Florida's best. Had we been ~~just~~ a little stronger in just one or two events, we might have been able to pull it out," says Maul, pointing out that FSU took quite a few second and thirds.

"Overall I thought we swam well," said Bill Shults, the men's coach. "They're the best and we raced with them. I'm real happy with that. This will give us confidence going into the rest of the season."

Though early in the year, a couple of FSU men came up with impressive times. Steve Robert's second place time of 9:31.24 in the 1,000 free was just one second off of the school record, and Dave DeGruchy won the 200 IM while just missing the NCAA cutoff standards.

FSU Diver Chris McGregor finished second on both boards to a very tough Scott Fosdick and just missed NCAA qualifications himself.

"McGregor did a great job," said diving coach Gary Cole. "I look forward to a lot of good things from him this year."

The Seminoles will swim The University of South Florida tomorrow (Sat.) with the women beginning at 11:00 a.m. and the men at 2:00 p.m.
