FSU NETTERS WIN MATCHES

Rout Oglethorpe, Blank Mercer

The Florida State University tennis team racked up its second successive triumph of the season yesterday afternoon with a 6-1 victory over Oglethorpe in a dual match curtailed by rain.

Coach Don Loucks' Seminole netters swept the six singles matches in straight sets as Herb Quay, Larry Dickson, Jim Costello, George Newman, George "Speed" Diamond and Dick Bradley all brushed past their Petrel foes.

Oglethorpe scored its only victory in the number one doubles where Scott and J E Smith defeated Bob Jarrett and Oscar Jackson 6-1, 6-4.

FSU was leading in both the second and third doubles when rain halted the play.

Dickson Rallies

Larry Dickson provided the biggest thrill of the day's play when he rallied from a 0-4 deficit to run out six straight games and his match against John Smith 6-0, 6-4.

Other single scores with FSU players listed first are: Quay over Scott 6-0, 6-4; Costello over J E Smith 6-0, 6-0; Newman over Backs 6-0, 6-1; Diamond over W Smith 6-2, 6-0 and Bradley over Stoller 6-4, 6-1.

Scott and Voth, FSU doubles team were leading Dunlap-Stoller 6-1, 3-0 and Bradley and Bevis. FSU were leading J E Smith-W Smith 6-2, 1-0 when the rains washed the matches away.

The Seminole netters opened their season with a flourish Friday afternoon by blanking Mercer 7-0 in a dual match limited to seven events by Mercer's curtailed five-man squad.

Coach Loucks' squad breezed through the five singles and two doubles events without the loss of a set.

Only Real Scare

The Seminoles' only real scare occurred in the second doubles match when Trevitt and Sharpe of Mercer gained a 5-2 edge over Lawson Bevis and Dick Bradley. The FSU duo rallied to win the next five games, however, and swept the event 6-4, 7-5.

Complete match results with FSU's players listed first are: Herb Quay over O'Neal 6-3, 6-1; Larry Dickson over Smith 6-1, 6-0; Jim Costello over Charlie Thomas 6-1, 6-1; Oscar Jackson over Trevitt 6-4, 6-2; Bobby Jarrett over Andrews 6-4, 6-2.

In the doubles FSU's George Newman and Speed Diamond defeated Smith and O'Neal 6-2, 6-0. The Bevis-Bradley win completed the rout.
