Florida State University's unbeaten tennis squad will seek its seventh and eighth consecutive victories of the season Monday and Tuesday when they meet the Mississippi College Choctaws in a pair of Dixie conference matches at the West Campus courts.

FSU ran its string of victories to six here Friday when they edged out the Southern college Mocs 5-4 in an intra-state duel that was in doubt until the final two doubles matches were completed.

After the two squads had divided the six singles match evenly, the Seminoles gained their narrow win by taking two of the three doubles events.

Dickson and Costello gave the Indians a 4-3 edge by defeating Gregg and Holland 6-2, 6-0,

clinched the triumph with a 6-3, 6-3 victory over White and Ows-

ley.
The third doubles match, which ended simultaneously with the Seminoles victory-clinging match, went to Southern as their top duo of Winchell and Feld scored over Quay and Jarrett 6-2, 6-3.

First Over Mocs
The Seminoles triumph was their first over Southern. The Mocs scored two decisive triumphs over Coach Don Loucks squad last year.

The singles match between FSU's Jarrett and Southern's Owsley was the most interesting of the day's play, with the decision going to Owsley.
