WIN SKEIN SNAPPED

DELAND. April 23. — Florida Southern's tennis team put the brakes on FSU's eight-match winning streak and evened up the series with the Seminoles by trimming them $5\frac{1}{2}$ to $3\frac{1}{2}$ at Lakeland Friday. The Seminoles won the match played here by a 5-4 margin.

Oscar Jackson's (FSU) match with Jerry Holland was the outstanding duel of the day, the two netters volleyed back and forth for three and a half hours before Holland finally won, 4-6, 9-7, 7-5, to clinch the victory for the Southern team.

FSU singles winners were Jim Costello and Jim Newman. Costello topped Sam Gregg, 6-2, 2-6, 6-4, and Newman subdued Dick White, 6-1, 7-5. The Herb-Quay-Bobby Jarrett duo came from behind to defeat Southern's Winchell-Owsley, 4-6, 8-6, 6-0.

The last match was cancelled because of darkness.
