Stetson Beats Seminoles, 5-4, In Tennis Meet

Larry Dickson evened the match at one-all when he topped the Hatters' Uthlant, 6-1. 7-5, and Jim Costello and George Newman put FSU out in front 3-1 by copping their singles matches. The Hatters came back strong, however, to take four of the remaining five matches to finish on the long end of the final score.

George Newman played excellent tennis in subduing Cooper Kirk, 6-4, 6-3. Bobby Jarrett lost his opening set to Goulding Matthews, fought back and took the second, but dropped the final set in the longest match of the day.
