

JIM COSTELLO, JARRETT WIN

Capture Class B Singles, Doubles

MACON, May 21. —Captain Jim Costello of Miami won the Class B singles and teamed with Bobby Jarrett to take the Class B doubles for the only individual titles as the Florida State University tennis team won the Dixie Conference team championship here today.

The Florida Seminoles scored 22 points, Stetson university was second with 18 points and Florida Southern college third with 16. Other competitors' scores were Mercer university 4, Oglethorpe university 3 and Howard university 3.

Each of the three Florida schools copped one singles title and one doubles championship to divide honors in that respect, but Florida State piled up the points in the earlier matches to take the title.

Costello, who was top seeded in the Class B event, had his toughest scrap of the tournament in the semi-finals which he won over Sam Gregg of Florida Southern 6-4, 4-6, 6-1. He breezed through teammate George Newman in the finals 6-0, 6-1.

Costello and Jarrett won the doubles by trouncing Cooper Kirk and Bill Uthlaut of Stetson, 6-2, 6-2.

Key match of the tournament, as far as Florida States hopes were concerned, came in the quarter-finals of the Class C singles when Bobby Jarrett upset third seeded Randy Owsley of Florida Southern 3-6, 6-2, 6-2. Jarrett kept up his fine playing to trim second seeded Goulding Matteus of Stetson, 6-2, 6-3, before being defeated in the finals by Bruce Perkins of Stetson 6-3, 6-3. Both Owsley and Matteus had defeated Jarrett during the regular season play.

Other point-getters for Florida State were George Newman, who went to the finals of the Class B singles; Oscar Jackson who went to the Class C semi-finals, and teamed with Newman to reach the Class C doubles finals; Herb Quay who went to the Class A semi-finals and teamed with Larry Dickson to go to the Class A doubles finals; and Dickson, who in addition to the doubles, won a first round singles match.

Dixie conference individual tennis championships, in addition to the Class B singles and doubles were won by the following:

Class A singles, George Winchell, Southern; Class A doubles, Winchell and Feld, Southern; Class C singles, Bruce Perkins, Stetson; Class C doubles, Perkins and Matteus, Stetson.
