

ATHENS, Ga., April 15—Florida State University's tennis team dropped a bitter 5-4 decision to the University of Georgia Bulldogs here Friday afternoon on their second stop of a three-day road trip.

The Indians, who had opened their invasion with a 9-0 win over Mercer, dropped four singles matches and the number one doubles events in the closely-contested battle.

The Seminoles number one doubles team, Don Seiffert and Ted Quay, failed at match point three times before finally bowing to Hill and Burt in the deciding match.
