

Davidson College, 1950 tennis champions of the Southern Conference, trimmed the Florida State University net squad 7 to 2 here yesterday afternoon. The victory was third of the season in four starts for Davidson. The Seminoles have now won 2, lost 4.

Ned Cooper, Jim Berry and Jack Egan saved Florida State from a-whitewashing. Cooper defeated Joe Dudley of Davidson in singles while Berry and Egan won their double match from Bill Child and John Crosland.
