

Making their 1958 tennis debut a success, Florida State's Seminoles rallied in the final doubles match for a 5-4 victory over Georgia's Bulldogs here yesterday.

Five of the nine matches went three sets in the closely-contested dual competition. The teams divided six singles matches before the Seminoles captured two of three doubles events.

With the match tied at 4-all, State's doubles team comprised of Jim Berry and Jackie Crew rallied to overtake Alfred Thompson and Dudley Baird, 2-6, 6-3, 6-3, in the clincher.

Lex Hester, playing No. 1 for Keith Pitchford's Seminoles aided State to two big points with a singles victory and a doubles nod while playing with Howard Levy.

In one freshman match, State's Rebel Bellamy wore down Georgia's Chuck Bryan, 6-1, 6-4.

The Seminoles entertain Georgia Tech in their next match Saturday.
