

UM Netters Whip FSU

Miami's Hurricanes maintained their tennis mastery over Florida State here yesterday, sweeping six singles and three doubles events for a 9-0 victory.

The season opener for Miami was the 36th straight tennis success for the 'Canes, who were unbeaten in 1958. In seven matches with FSU through the years, Miami has recorded six shutouts.

Miami junior Jerry Moss, an All-America choice last year, defeated FSU's Lex Hester, 6-1, 6-2, in the No. 1 singles match. In three other singles tests, Seminoles won first sets only to drop second and deciding third sets.
